THE SLATE BELT MINISTERIUM

You may have noticed that the Slate Belt Ministerium will be one of the recipients of this year's Joyful Noise offering. I thought you might be interested in knowing a little more about what the Slate Belt Ministerium is, and what it does.

The Slate Belt Ministerium is a loose community made up of leaders from many of the churches across the Slate Belt, from Wind Gap to Portland (mostly, but not all, clergy). We range from Lutheran and UCC to Methodist and Presbyterian, and more. We meet once a month for breakfast. At these breakfast meetings, we have the opportunity to get to know one another better and learn about what's going on in each other's congregations. We share support and ideas. We also often have guest speakers, usually from a charitable organization in the area. Some very fruitful partnerships have grown from these visits.

The Slate Belt Ministerium sponsors a Community Thanksgiving Service every year and is also involved in preparing some joint Lenten services among member churches. We also offer financial support to individuals and families in the area. All recipients are screened through Slater Family Network or Families First. When we receive a request for help from one of those agencies, we usually respond with \$250 from our Relief Fund to help a local individual or family with a utility or rent bill. The Ministerium Relief Fund is funded by yearly dues for clergy and congregations, by offerings at Thanksgiving and Lent services, and by donations like the one made by the Joyful Noise offering this year. Thank you for your continued support of this important ministry.

This project will run from Sunday, January 7th thru Sunday, March 17th. There will be a basket in the Narthex to place your donations in. I would like to take this opportunity to thank you all for your generous support for our projects in 2023, I know 2024 will be just as successful!

On Sunday, January 28, 20234, from 8:30-9:30 a.m., join us in the fellowship hall to assemble Baby Care Kits. Lutheran World Relief will distribute our gifts around the world to newborns and families in need. You can help by donating items for the layettes, giving a monetary gift to help purchase items, and/or share your time to prepare the layettes at the baby shower. Sizes 6 to 24 months may be used. If you want to make sweaters or diapers, go to www.lwr.org/beinvolved and click on Baby Care Kits for patterns. They specify that we are not permitted to add other items to the kits.

Kits will include:

lightweight cotton t-shirts, long or short sleeved gowns or sleepers without feet (top/pants sets can be substituted for sleepers top/pants sets can be substituted for sleepers pajama top/pant sets may be substituted), receiving blankets up to 52" square, cloth diapers, flat fold preferred, jacket, sweaters or sweatshirt with a hood or baby cap, socks, hand towel, dark color recommended, bath-size bars of gentle soap in the wrapping (like Ivory or Dove), diaper pins or large safety pins.



Worship in Collaboration with Oglala Sioux Nation

On November 12, 2023, St. Mark's Evangelical Lutheran Church, Birdsboro, PA, held their annual Native American worship service in honor of November being Native American Heritage Month. I attended the worship service and wanted to share my experience with you.

St. Mark's Lutheran Church has a partnership with the Oglala Sioux Nation of Native Americans in Pine Ridge Reservation, South Dakota, one of the poorest communities in the United States, and has been supporting them in many ways with their giving and their prayers.

In the worship service, the English translations used for the liturgy were:

Creator as the name used for God

Creator-Sets-Free as the name used for Jesus

The Chosen One as the name used for Christ

The Great Spirit as the name used for the Holy Spirit

The music for the worship service had a Native American vibe, words, and theme involving the sacredness of nature and life.

Copal incense from Central and Southwestern North America was used during the service as Native Americans used for sacred services.



Pr. Jim Farnsworth's message was dedicated to Native Americans and how the new immigrants treated them to America. He asked that we remember and honor those who have gone before us -- the original inhabitants of this land. He also asked that we have a right relationship with God and each other and that we have a responsibility to repair relations. We reconcile by learning the truth, loving each other, and breaking down barriers with others. He suggested that we learn the history of our area by looking through the eyes of our neighbors and that we are called to be good neighbors.
