# Prints of Peace

FROM THE PASTOR

You're receiving this newsletter sometime around the end of February, which means that Lent has just begun for this year. Lent 2020 began on Ash Wednesday, February 26, and will end as we enter the Great Three Days on Maundy Thursday, April 9.

Perhaps 2020 is a special year to focus on Lent. Whenever I say the number "2020," I think of eyesight, because perfect eyesight is sometimes referred to as "20/20 vision." For many of us, this type of vision is only possible with glasses or contact lenses. (I know without my glasses, I have something like 20/300 vi-

sion. Thanks be to God for optometry!) Lent is a time for reflection, for self-examination, for attempting to see *ourselves* with 20/20 vision. It is not always easy, or pleasant, to view ourselves so honestly. There are times when I'd prefer to see myself through blurred lenses, obscuring the crisp edges of my mistakes and my brokenness. But in Lent, we are "called to a discipline that contends against evil and resists whatever leads us away from love of God and neighbor" (from the Ash Wednesday liturgy in *Evangelical Lutheran Worship*). This is a time to *focus*, a time to *see clearly*, a time to *look for renewal*.

The waters of baptism act as a mirror, allowing us to see ourselves for who we truly are: sinful, broken creations who have turned away from God over and over again. But these same waters also allow us to see ourselves as God's beloved children, filled with newness and life. Because through these waters, God cleanses us, renews us, and fills us, that we might overflow with God's mercy and grace. Baptism is like our 20/20 corrective lenses.

I invite you to seek 20/20 vision this Lent. And I invite you to make use of several resources at Prince of Peace that may help.

- MIDWEEK STUDY: "SEEKING FOR MEANING." Each Wednesday evening from March 4 through April 1, we will gather to discuss honestly where meaning can be found in life. We will explore the biblical book of Ecclesiastes, as well as the practice of mindfulness, in our search. Each week's program will run from 7:00 8:00 pm, with coffee and fellowship available from 6:30 8:30.
- DAILY EMAIL DEVOTIONS: Joe Scholtes will again offer daily Lenten devotions over email. If you're not already on his mailing list, let me know and I'll pass your name and address on.
- STATIONS OF THE CROSS. The artistry and depth of our handmade Stations will be available for individual or group walking throughout the season of Lent. If you would like to walk the Stations at a particular time, please contact me and I'll try to accommodate you.
- LENTEN WORSHIP: Come and praise the God who creates you, who redeems you, who enlivens you. Come and receive the gift of God's Word proclaimed, and the gifts of Christ's body and blood. Come and worship each Sunday, as well as on Ash Wednesday and the Great Three Days of Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, (Holy Saturday Healing Service,) and Easter Vigil.




## **Social Ministry News:**



# **Trees of Life**



(This column, written by Joe Scholtes, draws connections between faith and creation.)

I sometimes think that my "second Bible" is J. R. R. Tolkien's "Lord of the Rings." I have read it many times; first, because I enjoy the story, and, second, because I encounter moving and thoughtful passages. One of my favorite includes Treebeard's words about Saruman's destruction of the forest. Treebeard says, "Many of these trees were my friends, creatures I had known from nut and acorn; many of them had voices of their own that are lost forever now. And there are wastes of stump and bramble where once there were singing groves."

In those words, Tolkien warns us of the harm humans can do to creation. In the Ash Wednesday liturgy, God's people also acknowledge this danger in the words, "Our waste and pollution of your creation, and our lack of concern for those who come after us, we confess to you. Have mercy on us, O God."

Pray daily for the wellbeing of all that God has made. Reflect on how you can conserve natural resources and support efforts to reduce our world's use of fossil fuels. Take actions that will serve the health of trees and all living things.
