The calendar has some interesting coincidences this year with Lent. Lent began on Ash Wednesday, which was also Valentine's Day this year. The date of Easter falls at the very end of the month of March, March 31. I invite you this March to participate in Lent as much as you are able. I want to especially invite you this year to some new services we're offering in Holy Week.

Ancient Prayers for Modern Cares

Join us as we continue and conclude our series on the Psalms this month. The Psalms are the hymnbook of the Israelites, and these poems/songs are a great source of depth and faith for us even today. Each Sunday morning, I will be preaching on the assigned Psalm for the day. Each Tuesday evening at 6:30, I will lead a Bible study on the previous Sunday's Psalm. (These Bible studies will also be offered on Zoom and shared on our YouTube page afterward. See PastorMail for the Zoom link.) Each Thursday morning at 10:30, I will lead the weekly "POP's Seekers" coffee hour in a devotional reading of the upcoming Sunday's Psalm. I believe that through this, we will all have a chance to dive more deeply into our shared faith.

Holy Week Services

This year, we will offer a different type of worship service each day in Holy Week, from Sunday, March 24 through Friday, March 29. All are welcome at all of these services. Please join us!

Sunday, 3/24, 9:45 am: Palm Sunday/Sunday of the Passion. This special Sunday service begins with Palm Sunday, the day we celebrate Christ's arrival at Jerusalem in glory the Sunday before his crucifixion. The service then pivots to Sunday of the Passion, remembering the story of his arrest and death. This service features palm branches to wave, and the dramatic telling of the Passion story from memory.

Monday, 3/25, 7 pm: Healing Service. This 30-minute service will include laying on of hands and oil of anointing for healing. We do not promise a cure, but we offer the hope and comfort of the Holy Spirit.

Tuesday, 3/26, 7 pm: Taize Service. The music of the Taize community in France is beloved by Christians around the world. These simple, repetitive, meditative songs can be a deeply moving spiritual experience. We will have a guest guitarist to lead us.

Wednesday, 3/27, 7pm: Stations of the Cross walk. We are blessed with beautifully painted Stations of the Cross on the walls of our sanctuary during Lent. I will lead us in a guided walk through these stations, with prayers and readings for each station.

Thursday, 3/28, 7 pm: Maundy Thursday, the first of the Great Three Days. We will remember Christ's institution of Holy Communion, as well as his betrayal and arrest. The service ends with the stripping of the altar.

Friday, 3/29, 7 pm: Good Friday, the second of the Great Three Days. We will remember Christ's suffering and death for our sins. The service features the Adoration of the Cross and the Bidding Prayer.

Sunday, 3/31, 6 am: Vigil of Easter, the third of the Great Three Days. This unique service begins outside with the lighting of the new fire. It continues in darkness with several readings and an affirmation of baptism, culminating in the bright celebration of Christ's resurrection. Bring bells to ring!

Sunday, 3/31, 9:45 am: Resurrection of Our Lord. Our regular worship service on Easter Day is filled with decorations, songs, and alleluias. Bring bells to ring!

I hope you can join us for worship during Lent and the Great Three Days.

Office Technology = \$3125, new approximate balance = \$7,050


Outdoor Enhancements = \$625, new approximate balance = \$2,150



POP's Treasures Update: New Endeavor Blesses Us in Ways We Did Not Imagine

It has been a transformative year in the boutique! We started our year off in May and found ourselves being surprised monthly by the outpouring of generosity from the community through their donations and support with our sales. Everyone has been truly kind, and we enjoy seeing our "regulars" monthly, along with some new faces! We spread the word on Facebook, signage, and an occasional ad. This boutique was set up for outreach, by finding the needs and supporting it financially. The initial idea was to have a free food/clothing location for those in need. Instead, we offer a thrift boutique where the prices are fair, and presented in a way that resembles a retail gift shop. While thrift shops are not a new concept, we try and enhance everyone's shopping experience by visual refinement, while doing it on a dime. We have been truly humbled by the interest in our mission, along with interest of our church. We have welcomed a few families interested in our worship and interested in our purpose. We have had wonderful compliments on our boutique and continue to be surprised on Facebook where people now mention us when others want to donate items. It has truly been a blessing to POP church! We would like to take the time and let you know the organizations that will benefit from 2023 collections. They are: P.U.M.P., Valley Youth House, Safe Harbor, Slate Belt Animal Advocacy Group, and we also purchased 10 bee hives, 5 mosquito nets, a rooster, 20 chicks, and a family farm of animals (1 cow, 2 pig, 2 goats, 12 chickens, farming tools, and seeds) from Good Gifts. We offered a free clothing giveaway on February 24 with clothing donations from the rummage sale.

We hope you will consider playing a role in these outreach activities, whether it be through donations, time and talent, or just spreading the word about this program. While we can do good for others, I am amazed at how this program has afforded us outreach from our guests back to us. For that alone, we are truly blessed.

Prince of Peace Seekers (POPS) News:




A Note from Council:

Cultivating Generosity

Throughout the fall our congregations are often focused on stewardship and gratitude for the generosity of members. Folks provide stewardship talks, members complete commitment cards, and sermons are proclaimed to encourage generosity of time, talent and finances. But did you know that our ELCA Congregation and Synod Support Team offers training and recommendations on cultivating generosity?

This past fall, in partnership with the Lake Institute on Faith and Giving, stewardship leaders from eight congregations, representing four ELCA synods, came together for a training series called "Cultivating Generous Congregations" (CGC). Over seven weeks leaders from these eight congregations gathered online as a cohort with the Lake Institute's trained faculty and each other. Cultivating Generous Congregations maps the new landscape of religious giving and provides congregational teams with tools to build a culture of generosity unique to each congregation's needs, challenges, and opportunities. CGC explores theology, the role of adaptive leadership, fiscal transparency, and the importance of giver care, with action steps to impact the exploration of generosity and energize congregational generosity to take the significant and necessary steps to creating lasting cultural change.

Following the final session, the eight congregations received a year of access to the Lake Institute's numerous stewardship resources, as well as optional coaching to assist in the implementation of these practices. Mission Support funds the opportunity for congregations and leaders to learn from stewardship experts and one another and to grow together so that their local mission, and how God is growing generosity, can be told in more effective ways in today's culture.


