Yes, it's finally back! The spring rummage sale!





REOPENING TASK FORCE CHANGES:

The Reopening Task Force met again recently and has loosened more restrictions at the church. Here are the changes to be made now:

- · For church events, food may be served in the Fellowship Hall **buffet style** if desired. All foods should be served with **serving utensils** no big bowls of chips, etc. that people would use hands to self-serve. Hand sanitizer should be available on tables for people to use before eating.
- The Fellowship Hall may be rented for meals following church functions such as *funerals* and *baptisms*, but not yet for other purposes. Occupancy of the Fellowship Hall should **not exceed 100 people** for these events.
- · Beginning May 1, masks are recommended but not required while singing in worship.
- The **coat rack** in the narthex is available for use again.
- The **large drawers** in the narthex will be utilized for food for PUMP again.

What's it like to be a Pastoral Intern in NEPA?

It is hard to believe I have been on internship with Common Ground Recovery Community for nine months already! My time with Common Ground has been a deep blessing to me and to my education. I have witnessed the presence of God in the open vulnerable sharing during our Wednesday worship, in the heartfelt reverent "thank you's" when serving communion and meals in downtown Reading and in our study of the scriptures and 12-steps. Common Ground truly is a place of radical love and where God's grace embraces our brokenness.

As part of my internship project, I invited our worshiping communities and ministry partners to reflect on these three questions: What does Common Ground mean to you? What does community mean to you? And where do you see God here and in the world? They then drew on white cotton squares that will be sewn together to make an altar cloth to fit all of our communion tables. The responses were profound and beautiful!

There are drawings of stick figures holding hands around the globe, animals peacefully living together, a place of refuge in the storm and in the desert, flowers, hearts, and crosses. There are phrases like, "Freedom, break the chains", "God is love", "We are better together", "Never give up hope because there is hope in everything", and so much more on these 33 squares!


