The Most Holy Trinity YEAR C

TRINITY: THE UNITY OF THE THREE DIVINE PERSONS

The celebration of the Most Holy Trinity reminds us of the Three Divine Persons in One God. (The Father, The Son and The Holy Spirit). The Nature of God is His Essence and every action of God belongs to the Three Divine Persons since none of the Three Persons could use the Divine Nature to act alone. "Not in the unity of a single person, but in a Trinity of one substance."

The term Trinity is not found in the bible but the notion is contained in many passages of the bible. In Genesis 1:26 God says "Let **'US'** make man in **'OUR'** image, according to **'OUR'** likeness." In Genesis 3:22, when Adam and Eve ate from the tree of life. The Lord says: "Adam has now become like one of **US**." The plurality used here points to the fact of the Trinity. At the baptism of Jesus, the Holy Spirit descended upon him and the voice of the Father was heard from heaven (Matthew 3:16-17). And in Matthew 28:19, Jesus himself commanded the eleven to make disciples of all nations, and baptise them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit (The Trinity).

In the teaching of the Trinity, we see the manifestation of each person possessing a unique role in the creation, redemption and sanctification of humanity. The Father created but did not create alone, the Son and the Holy Spirit were involved in the work of creation. The Son redeemed what was created, the Father and the Holy Spirit were involved in the redemptive work. The Holy Spirit sanctifies what has been redeemed, The Father and the Son are involved in the sanctifying work. The unity shows the participation of all in the performative act. This is known as the interpenetration of the Three Persons. This means the Three Persons are all involved in every single act of each other.

The Three Persons indwell each other fully. The Father (is not begotten nor proceeding) abides in the Son and in the Spirit. The Son (is begotten, not made, not proceeding) abides in the Father and in the Spirit. The Spirit (is not begotten but proceeding) abides in the Father and in the Son. "The Three Divine Persons are co-eternal."

The teaching of the Trinity informs our Christian way of living to focus on the Church as a community enshrined in love, and the Trinity as a reminder of sublime relationships among Christians.

Our way of life is a life of faith built on the Triune God. This way of life follows the commandment of Christ; "Love of God and love of neighbour as yourself." As we experience in the world the transformation of our individual love, we recognise what is best and true in ourselves and value in others.

The knowledge of *perichoresis* which means; the mutual indwelling of Persons, or one in the other, shows us something about unity. There will be an appreciation of others without racial or colour barriers when we understand that we (The Church) are a community of communities in the oneness of the Trinity. Also, as pilgrim people, we are missionaries by our very nature and our mission is the double missions of Christ and the Spirit; echoing from the Triune God.

The beautiful unity of the Trinity shows the unblemished love of God as a gift of oneself to others, and the perfection of oneself is attained by loving graciously. Understanding the Trinity helps us to appreciate one another. It provides a model for human relationships both as individuals and as a Church, in a serene mutual communion in our society.

(8:22-31)

A reading from the book of Proverbs

The Wisdom of God cries aloud:

The Lord created me when his purpose first unfolded, before the oldest of his works. From everlasting I was firmly set, from the beginning, before earth came into being. The deep was not, when I was born, there were no springs to gush with water. Before the mountains were settled, before the hills. I came to birth; before he made the earth, the countryside, or the first grains of the world's dust. When he fixed the heavens firm, I was there, when he drew a ring on the surface of the deep, when he thickened the clouds above, when he fixed fast the springs of the deep, when he assigned the sea its boundaries – and the waters will not invade the shore – when he laid down the foundations of the earth, I was by his side, a master craftsman, delighting him day after day, ever at play in his presence, at play everywhere in his world, delighting to be with the sons of men.

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LATEST NEWS FROM OUR SAFEGUARDING PROMOTERS

There are 24 hours in a day supposedly 8 hours each for work, rest and play yet in today's world life is not that balanced, there are competing influences on our time. These influences can cause stress and distress at the same time. The kids have to be at school on time. we need to be at work on time, we get home and there is homework to be supervised and dinner to prepare etc etc. These time pressures can effect the way we interact with others, and sometimes we can say or do things that may have a negative impact on those around us. We are not perfect. Are there times in the day that are more critical than others, especially or our children.

According to Dr. Panksepp (2020), the nine most important minutes of our children's days are:

- The three minutes after they wake up
- The three minutes after they get home from • school or day-care
- The three minutes before they go to bed •

Each day children need meaningful eye-to-eye conversations with their parent (caregiver). It is especially important to slow down and look your child in the eye. Listen and respond with love. Hug your child, fix their hair, tell them you are proud of them every single day. Remember that touch is a powerful, it creates a connection between you and your child that words cannot. Actions speak louder than words.

It is wise to remember that our adult children need parental affirmation, do not assume that *"they know"* you love them". If we take the above concept and apply to our adult children, then we will have 9 important minute with them.

• The first three minutes of contact (by phone or in person)

a. Greet them in a positive manner.

- Give them three minutes to tell you about their life at that moment in time.
- a. Listen without comment to both the good and the bad.
- b. Don't try and solve their problems unless you are invited to.
- The last three minutes of your contact.
- a. End on a positive note, tell them you love them and/or you are proud of the person they have grown to be, and/or proud of their successes

Children regardless of age need to feel loved and supported.

▼ t Anthony of Padua was born at Lisbon, Portugal in c. 1193. He joined the Fransciscan friars around the age of 25 and worked as a missionary among the Muslims in Morocco. Returning to Europe due to ill health, Anthony spent time at an Italian hermitage, where his gift for preaching was soon discovered. Due to his reputation as a biblical scholar, he spent the remaining nine years of his life teaching in France and Italy before dying at Padua, around 1232. Many miracles were attributed to his intercession and to this day St Anthony is regularly invoked by many as a finder of lost items. He is named as one of the doctors of the Roman Catholic Church.
