Dear Parish Family,

Welcome to another weeks end and weekend here in this most beautiful part of the world. I feel blessed not to be living in one of our capitals at the moment. Some of my family are in lockdown at present as well with some of my friends who live in hotspots. None of which is pleasant. My nephew and one niece back in online learning.

You might notice some small wheelie bins at the doors of the Churches in Boolaroo and Warners Bay. They will have dry goods/cans labels on them. Many of our charities are doing it tough now, with an over whelming demand and a limited supply to meet that demand. I thought one way to help would by assisting with some food staples. I am hopeful to donate that food to those charities that run food banks or community kitchens.

This is how it can work: when you do your weekly or fortnightly shop you might consider buying <u>one</u> item that could go in the wheelie bins to be donated. That item could be a can of soup, can of vegetables or a premade meal: back beans or spaghetti. It could be a packet of rice, pasta, or again a premade heat able packet item. *I am personally addicted to Uncle Ben's Mexican Style Rice for example!* It could also be a small jar of coffee, packet of tea or tin of milo. Might cost a couple of dollars.

One item doesn't get missed in the budget, is in expensive and makes a difference. It is an invitation not an obligation. Is it something you think you could do?

I've been listening to a beautiful song written and sung by Pink called 'Bridge of Light' which features in the epic movie 'Happy Feet 2'. I like both 1 and 2 and amongst a couple of others would endeavour to watch them at least once a year. I am if nothing else soft!

The base story of 'Happy Feet 1' centres around a little penguin who not only cannot 'feather' quite right, like the other penguins but he also can't sing in time with them either. His gift is in dance not song and so he is initially caste out. When we get to 'Happy Feet 2' it is that gift shared with the oth-

ers that will save the colony from disaster. His difference is their strength and more importantly their salvation! What captures my imagination, I think, is that when we recognise that we are not all the same and when we can celebrate our diversity we are the stronger and the better for it.

But back to the song. If you get a chance listen to the words; it is a beautiful song, in its own right, but the words have so much meaning to me in our current situation as we try and stay afloat in the face our current pandemic. I have the song on my phone in a loop.

"Just when you think, Hope is lost, and giving up is all you got, Blue turns black, your confidence is cracked, there seems no turning back from here,

Sometimes there isn't an obvious explanation Why the holiest hearts can feel the strongest palpitations . . . "

It goes onto to talk about the need for us to continue to reflect what is important to those around us so that the world and our lives are made better. It moves me, maybe it'll brighten your week this week.

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#### THE WORD

#### First Reading (Jer 23:1-6)

A reading from the prophet Jeremiah

'Doom for the shepherds who allow the flock of my pasture to be destroyed and scattered – it is the Lord who speaks! This, therefore, is what the Lord, the God of Israel, says about the shepherds in charge of my people: You have let my flock be scattered and go wandering and have not taken care of them. Right, I will take care of you for vour misdeeds - it is the Lord who speaks! But the remnant of my flock I myself will gather from all the countries where I have dispersed them, and will bring them back to their pastures: they shall be fruitful and increase in numbers. I will raise up shepherds to look after them and pasture them; no fear, no terror for them any more; not one shall be lost – it is the Lord who speaks!

'See, the days are coming – it is the Lord who speaks – when I will raise a virtuous Branch for David, who will reign as true king and be wise, practising honesty and integrity in the land. In his days Judah will be saved and Israel dwell in confidence. And this is the name he will be called:

A reading from the letter of St Paul to the Ephesians

In Christ Jesus, you that used to be so far from us have been brought very close, by the blood of Christ. For he is the peace between us, and has made the two into one and broken down the barrier which used to keep them apart, actually destroying in his own person the hostility caused by the rules and decrees of the Law. This was to create one single New Man in himself out of the two of them and by restoring peace through the cross, to unite them both in a single Body and reconcile them with God. In his own person he killed the hostility. Later he came to bring the good news of peace, peace to you who were far away and peace to those who were near at hand. Through him, both of us have in the one Spirit our way to come to the Father.
