Reflection for the 1st Week Advent 2022

Life in the world today...... anxiety, distraction, and urgency. Just look at the news, and everything is either "BREAKING NEWS", "COVID-19 UPDATES" "GLOBAL WARMING" or "FAKE NEWS".

This part of our lives constantly distracts us.

If you are one of those on social media, just try to watch the cute video about puppies and babies playing together and before you know it you're pulled into the vortex of "fake news", "click bait", "twitter, flicker or facebook" and a wide variety of other noise.

Everyone encourages you to "click this" and "take a look at that,"; "Like this"; "Heart that"; but whatever you do, don't get sucked into reading the comments when the topic is controversial. It's a no-win situation in this world and this sense of distraction and urgency is totally exhausting.

In the Gospel reading Jesus seems to be pointing us toward this type of life lived in urgency. In this passage, Jesus appears to be talking about a time when he will return. He seems to be telling us that there will be no warning of this immanent return, so we need to be ready, we've got to live each moment as if it could be our last. I've got to say, this news does not feel to me to be a very comforting Gospel here at the beginning of Advent.

This first Sunday of Advent is supposed to remind us that we are anticipating not only the birth of the Christ child, but we are also anticipating the realisation of God's Kingdom on earth, then we can truly say:

God's Kingdom will have come, God's will, will be done, these things will happen on earth as in heaven. That's what we are anticipating, that's what we are hoping for "God with us"—Emmanuel. So, how are we supposed to be ready, what are we supposed to do? Well, I don't think we are supposed to be in a state of urgency, anxiously awaiting the return of Christ. We don't have to be scanning the news channels waiting for the "Breaking News Announcement: Jesus Has Returned." We don't have to keep our Smart phones at the ready, worrying we'll miss Jesus' text, Facebook post or tweet telling us he's back! Instead, Jesus tells us simply to be ready, and how do we do this? We do this by paying attention to the needs of others. We do this by opening our hearts to the least among us. We do this by loving our neighbour as ourselves. Here's the thing, when we love one another, we reflect that which God created us to be. When we love one another we are part of Gods Kingdom and we make Gods Kingdom real and present among us. That is the Good News of Advent.....God with us and us with God!



LITURGY OF THE WORD

First Reading

(2:1-5)

A reading from the prophet Isaiah

The vision of Isaiah son of Amoz, concerning Judah and Jerusalem. In the days to come the mountain of the Temple of the Lord shall tower above the mountains and be lifted higher than the hills. All the nations will stream to it, peoples without number will come to it; and they will say:

'Come, let us go up to the mountain of the Lord, to the Temple of the God of Jacob that he may teach us his ways so that we may walk in his paths; since the Law will go out from Zion, and the oracle of the Lord from Jerusalem.'

He will wield authority over the nations and adjudicate between many peoples; these will hammer their swords into ploughshares, their spears into sickles. Nation will not lift sword against nation, there will be no more training for war. O House of Jacob, come, let us walk in the light of the Lord.

A reading from the letter of St Paul to the Romans

You know 'the time' has come: you must wake up now: our salvation is even nearer than it was when we were converted. The night is almost over, it will be daylight soon – let us give up all the things we prefer to do under the cover of the dark; let us arm ourselves and appear in the light. Let us live decently as people do in the daytime: no drunken orgies, no promiscuity or licentiousness, and no wrangling or jealousy. Let your armour be the Lord Jesus Christ.

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Matthew

Jesus said to his disciples: 'As it was in Noah's day, so will it be when the Son of Man comes. For in those days before the Flood people were eating, drinking, taking wives, taking husbands, right up to the day Noah went into the ark, and they suspected nothing till the Flood came and swept all away. It will be like this when the Son of Man comes. Then of two men in the fields one is taken, one left; of two women at the millstone grinding, one is taken, one left.

'So stay awake, because you do not know the day when your master is coming. You may be quite sure of this that if the householder had known at what time of the night the burglar would come, he would have stayed awake and would not have allowed anyone to break through the wall of his house. Therefore, you too must stand ready because the Son of Man is coming at an hour you do not expect.'

Prayer for the appointment of our new Bishop



S t Andrew came from Capernaum and was a fisherman by trade. He was a disciple of Johm the Baptist before he and his brother; Simon Peter, were called to be the first apostles of Christ. In the Gospels he is mentioned for his part in the feeding of the 5000, as well as John's Gospel account of the Greeks who wished to meet Jesus. There is uncertainty as to where he preached, where he died and was buried. Ancient writings suggest he went to Greece, and was eventually crucified on a saltire (X shaped) cross, from where he preached to the people for two days before dying. A medieval legend tells of his remains being taken to the coast of Scotland to a place now named St Andrews, which eventually led to him becoming the patron saint of Scotland.


