Dear Parish Family,

*Glory and praise for ever!*

Trinity Sunday has always held a special place in my heart. Thirty years ago, on this very feast, I celebrated my Mass of Thanksgiving as a newly ordained priest. I may have shared this story before, but one of the gifts given to me for my ordination was from a priest friend who kindly offered to preach at that Mass. He knew that after the ordination in the morning, the greetings, blessings and celebrations that followed, I would probably be exhausted. He began his homily by saying: "The Trinity is mystery. In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit." Then he started to walk away from the pulpit. There was applause from some, horror from the bishop who was present, and thankfully he eventually returned to continue preaching!

Yet his opening words stayed with me: "The Trinity is mystery." And that is true. God is mystery – not a puzzle to be solved, but a relationship into which we are invited. God is greater than we can comprehend. Whenever we try to reduce God to simple categories or definitions, like male or female or a functional role like creator, we limit the wonder and depth of who God is. Jesus does not simply explain God; he reveals God as relationship – Father, Son and Holy Spirit – a communion of love. Even the response in the psalm, "Glory and praise for ever", becomes ours to God in thanksgiving for the love God has for us.

The readings for this feast do not attempt to explain the doctrine of the Trinity. Instead, they give us glimpses into the nature of God. In the first reading from Exodus, we hear of God's faithfulness and profound goodness to the people during their struggles in the wilderness. Even in their weakness and failures, God walks with them and leads them towards the Promised Land. God is not distant, but present. In the Gospel, we are reminded that Jesus was sent into the world not to condemn it, but to save it – to bring life, hope and eternal promise. God's love reaches out to humanity through the Son. Then, in the second reading, Saint Paul speaks of life in the Spirit: living in peace, encouraging and helping one another, growing in holiness, and remaining united in love. The Spirit continues to guide and strengthen the Christian community today. The Trinity is not simply something we believe about God; it is also a way of living. Baptised in the name of the Father, Son and Holy Spirit, we are called to reflect that communion of love in our own lives. Our families, friendships, schools, parish communities and workplaces are meant to become places where love, forgiveness, unity and peace are experienced. Perhaps Trinity Sunday invites us to ask ourselves: do our relationships reflect the God in whose name we were baptised?

This weekend we also farewell Fr Peter, who celebrates his final Mass at Toronto. Although your time with us has been short, Fr Peter, your ministry has touched many lives and has been deeply appreciated across our communities. Even during times of illness and difficulty, your faith and perseverance have inspired us. As you begin the next chapter of your priestly journey, know that you go with our gratitude, prayers and affection. And so we pray for you in the words of Saint Paul from today's second reading: "The grace of the Lord Jesus Christ, the love of God, and the fellowship of the Holy Spirit be with you..." We also look forward to welcoming Fr Patrick Swaray CSSp this coming week. Residing in Morisset alongside Fr Paul, Fr Patrick will begin his ministry with us on 1 June 2026. We assure him of our prayers and welcome as he joins our parish communities.

As I mentioned at the beginning, this feast also coincides with my own priesthood anniversary. On Monday, 1 June, I will celebrate thirty years as a priest. It is an honour and privilege to serve God and his people over these years. I give thanks for the many people, experiences and communities that have shaped my life and ministry. I have been richly blessed. Fr Brian Bailey, who was parish priest at the time of my ordination, used to joke: "Fancy being ordained on the first day of winter in the Year of the Rat – what was that saying to the Church?" I hope he would be pleased to know that things turned out reasonably well! Please know that I hold you and your loved ones in my prayers each day. I ask that you continue to pray for me also.

### First Reading (Exodus 34:4-6. 8-9)

A reading from the book of Exodus

With the two tablets of stone in his hands, Moses went up the mountain of Sinai in the early morning as the Lord had commanded him. And the Lord descended in the form of a cloud, and Moses stood with him there.

He called on the name of the Lord. The Lord passed before him and proclaimed, 'Lord, Lord, a God of tenderness and compassion, slow to anger, rich in kindness and faithfulness.' And Moses bowed down to the ground at once and worshipped. 'If I have indeed won your favour, Lord,' he said, 'let my Lord come with us, I beg. True, they are a headstrong people, but forgive us our faults and our sins, and adopt us as your heritage.'

# EUCHARIST28

The International Eucharistic Congress in Sydney in 2028 ('Eucharist28') will be a global gathering of the Church centred on the Eucharist, the source and summit of our Christian lives, culminating in a Papal Mass with Pope Leo XIV. It will be a festival of faith, rich with worship, prayer, testimonies, art, music – a truly 'once in a lifetime' experience, and a transformative moment for our nation.

At the very first Pentecost, the apostles were transformed as the fire of the Holy Spirit was poured out for them, empowering them to go out to evangelise the world. "And day by day, attending the temple together and breaking bread in their homes, they partook of food with glad and generous hearts, praising God." – Acts of the Apostles 2:46-47

The early Church was Eucharistic. They gathered together in community and shared in the breaking of the bread. It was through believing in and sharing in Christ's body and blood that the Holy Spirit set their hearts ablaze, strengthening them to spread the Good News without fear.

As we move forward from our celebration of Pentecost last month, our parishes and communities can imitate the early Church by devoting ourselves to the Eucharist and allowing the Holy Spirit to work within us – in our ministries, our youth groups, and our personal prayer.

This national journey to Eucharist28 is an invitation for all of us to be set on fire by the Holy Spirit and share in the breaking of the bread. The journey begins now, in our own hearts, in our own parishes.

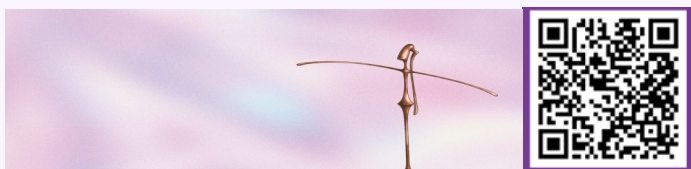
