Dear Parish Family,

.... Lord teach us to pray...give us this day our daily bread....

Over these past few weeks, we are walking as a church with Jesus to Jerusalem learning what it means to be a disciple – what it means to share in the hospitality of God.... that is, hospitality where God enters our lives and the lives of those around us providing for each other's needs. Discipleship and hospitality, like the good Samaritan, in being compassionate; like Martha and Mary to be not just doers but needing equal time to be listeners to God's word; and this weekend being people of prayer.

The readings invite us to reflect on prayer with the same message - be persistent. Abraham in the first reading from Genesis prays for the towns of Sodom and Gomorrah that God save the just ...after a bidding war takes place, he persists in order to change God's mind.

The Our Father we have from Luke's Gospel is much shorter than the version we pray as Christians, which comes from Matthew. Beginning with the words "our father"is a key to Jesus' ministry - how else could he continue to minister to the sick, outcast, sinners. The characteristics that Jesus ascribes to the father are qualities that most would describe as a mix of masculine and feminine qualities – strong and powerful yet the carer and nurturer also.... Jesus felt free to call God, "father" with all the good implications that come from that name, seeing ourselves as sons and daughters.

Whether our prayer be praise, contrition, thanksgiving or petition, it recognises our need for God. Jesus assures us that God is more than willing to give us what we need. However, for this to happen we must turn to God and humbly acknowledge that need. If we pray for what we need with conviction and confidence and be demanding and persistent in our prayer, then God won't fail to respond. Do you notice in the parable that in the persistent nature of prayer is not focused on the individual but rather the neighbour's need of assistance in fulfilling his obligations of hospitality to a traveller. He is not waking his neighbour in the middle of the night to ask for bread for himself; he asks for bread to give to his guest. This gives us something of an idea about how we might focus on our prayer life – what are the needs of others around us.

Something to think about is this statement from the great Christian writer CS Lewis, he once wrote "prayer doesn't change God but changes us." Lord teach us to be prayerful communities.....

On Friday evening at Morisset, we celebrated the sacrament of Confirmation with Bishop Michael. There were nine candidates who received the sacrament. This coming Thursday evening there will twenty-five candidates presented at Warners Bay for Confirmation to Bishop Michael. Congratulations to our young people in making this step in their faith journey.

Coming up this Sunday will be the last of our parish assemblies. The community at Toronto will, like our other communities, take time to gather and to reflect on the question where is God calling us to be church (in Toronto) in 2025 and beyond. We hold the Toronto community in our prayers that they be guided by the Holy Spirit to where is calling.

First Reading (Genesis 18: 20-32)

A reading from the book of Genesis

The Lord said, 'How great an outcry there is against Sodom and Gomorrah! How grievous is their sin! I propose to go down and see whether or not they have done all that is alleged in the outcry against them that has come up to me. I am determined to know.' The men left there and went to Sodom while Abraham remained standing before the Lord. Approaching him he said, 'Are you really going to destroy the just man with the sinner? Perhaps there are fifty just men in the town. Will you really overwhelm them, will you not spare the place for the fifty just men in it? Do not think of doing such a thing: to kill the just man with the sinner, treating just and sinner alike! Do not think of it! Will the judge of the whole earth not administer justice?' The Lord replied, 'If at Sodom I find fifty just men in the town, I will spare the whole place because of them.' Abraham replied, 'I am bold indeed to speak like this to my Lord, I who am dust and ashes. But perhaps the fifty just men lack five: will you destroy the whole city for five?' 'No', he replied 'I will not destroy it if I find forty-five just men there.' Again Abraham said to him, 'Perhaps there will only be forty there.' 'I will not do it' he replied 'for the sake of the forty.' Abraham said, 'I trust my Lord will not be angry, but give me leave to speak: perhaps there will only be thirty there. 'I will not do it' he replied 'if I find thirty there.' He said, 'I am bold indeed to speak like this, but perhaps there will only be twenty there.' 'I will not destroy it' he replied 'for the sake of the twenty.' He said, 'I trust my Lord will not be angry if I speak once more: perhaps there will only be ten.' 'I will not destroy it' he replied 'for the sake of the ten.'

Gospel (Luke 11: 1-13)

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Luke

Once Jesus was in a certain place praying, and when he had finished, one of his disciples said, 'Lord, teach us to pray, just as John taught his disciples.' He said to them, 'Say this when you pray:

"Father, may your name be held holy, your kingdom come; give us each day our daily bread, and forgive us our sins, for we ourselves forgive each one who is in debt to us. And do not put us to the test."

He also said to them, 'Suppose one of you has a friend and goes to him in the middle of the night to say, "My friend, lend me three loaves, because a friend of mine on his travels has just arrived at my house and I have nothing to offer him"; and the man answers from inside the house, "Do not bother me. The door is bolted now, and my children and I are in bed; I cannot get up to give it to you." I tell you, if the man does not get up and give it him for friendship's sake, persistence will be enough to make him get up and give his friend all he wants.

'So I say to you: Ask, and it will be given to you; search, and you will find; knock, and the door will be opened to you. For the one who asks always receives; the one who searches always finds; the one who knocks will always have the door opened to him. What father among you would hand his son a stone when he asked for bread? Or hand him a snake instead of a fish? Or hand him a scorpion if he asked for an egg? If you then, who are evil, know how to give your children what is good, how much more will the heavenly Father give the Holy Spirit to those who ask him!'

Summary of the Parish Assembly Meeting 20th July

Thanks to the 56 parishioners who were able to attend the assembly. The assembly role was a chance to reflect on the future direction of the Boolaroo (Warners Bay) & Booragul parishes.

Father Darryl is PP for Morisset, Toronto, Booragul and Boolaroo (Warners Bay). Consideration was given to establishing of a Regional Pastoral Parish Council model while keeping the uniqueness of each parish. Members will be from each of the individual parishes and will be elected by the local parishioners. **This was moved and passed.**

When the four Parishes of Morisset, Toronto & Booragul, Warners Bay work together it be called "The Lakeside Pastoral Region". **This was moved and passed.**

The Future of the Boolaroo Church

Our Lady Help of Christians Church at Boolaroo will celebrate their Centenary with a mass and dinner on Saturday 14/03/2026. (First baptism was on 18/03/1926). Celebrations of Baptisms, Confirmations, First Communions, Weddings and Funerals will place over the coming months. Closure of the Boolaroo Church will take place closest to the Feast of Our Lady Help of Christians, Saturday 23/05/206. After this date the Saturday 5:30pm Mass will move to the Booragul Church.

Merging of the Parishes of Boolaroo and Booragul Parishes.

Having worked closely together for all these years, a motion was passed to merge the two parishes into one new parish. This was moved and passed. With the suggestion of the new parish title be: "Our Lady, Help of Christians, Booragul Warners Bay Parish." The names of the individual churches will remain same. This was moved and passed.

Parish Finances

Ian Ross-Gowan presented the assembly with the financial situation over the 2024/2025 financial year. No decision has been made about what will happen with the Boolaroo site once the church is closed. The finance committee will be examining how to generate ongoing income from the site. With temperature extremes these days, the motion was put forward to have air conditioning installed in the Warners Bay Church & Hall. **This was moved and passed.**

Spiritual Conversation, "Where is God calling us to be church in the Boolaroo/Warners Bay/Booragul Community in 2025 and beyond":

Ryan Gato broke the meeting into small groups to look at the strengths of the parish that we can build on; where do we need to be in the next 5 years and what we can change/introduce in the next year. The Parish Pastoral Council will discern this information to see what the parish can move forward with.

To the People of the Diocese

Dear brothers and sisters,

You may have seen recent media coverage following my communication about the Perpetual Day of Remembrance.

Some of the reporting has unfortunately combined two separate matters: the Perpetual Day of Remembrance and ongoing discussions about a permanent memorial for survivors and victims of abuse.

I want to take this opportunity to speak directly to you and share our position clearly.

The Perpetual Day of Remembrance remains a central part of our Diocesan life. From 2025, it will be commemorated on National Safeguarding Sunday. This decision followed consultation across the Diocese and reflects the shared purpose of both days, as well as our ongoing commitment to acknowledging the harm caused by the Church and ensuring it is never repeated.

Separately, I know many people are eager for an update on the possibility of a public memorial. I also recognise that this process has taken time. That's because it is deeply important and complex.

The Diocese is committed to ensuring any memorial is respectful and meaningful, with the experiences of victims and survivors contributing to its development.


Conversations with various stakeholders are ongoing, and while they require time, we are working steadily towards an outcome.

This work remains a priority, and we will keep you updated as it progresses.








Naples in 1696, and was the son of a nobleman. He was a successful lawyer before being ordained a priest at the age of 29. In 1731, Alphonsus refounded a community of nuns and a year later he founded the Congregation of the Holy Redeemer; a community of priests dedicated to preaching to the poor in rural towns. He was bishop of Sant Agatha dei Goti for thirteen years before retiring due to ill health. He published more than thirty theological and devotional works and as a result was declared a Doctor of the Church in 1871.

LATEST NEWS FROM OUR SAFEGUARDING PROMOTERS 27 JULY 2025

The **Promoters of Safeguarding** continue to endorse a culture of safeguarding within the Parish.

The Promoters of Safeguarding continue to endorse a culture of protection within our Parish. This week, your attention is drawn to the Maitland-Newcastle Catholic Schools Office's adoption of the Crisis Prevention Institute Verbal Intervention Training program for all teachers and learning support staff.

Under the philosophy of **CARE**, **WELFARE**, **SAFETY and SECURITY**, this program focuses on responding to a crisis. This person-centred and trauma-informed approach:

Recognises that the person knows themselves best.

- Respect the person's preference and what's important to them.
- Value the person's independence and need to flourish.
- Use an approach based on a person's strengths.

Considers the person's life experience.

- Acknowledge the trauma and its effect.
- Care is based on safety, transparency, trust, collaboration, and empowerment.
- Understand effects of a person's social environment and upbringing.

Understands that everyone is unique.

- People's cognitive, mental, and physical state influence how they interact.
- Be inclusive and culturally sensitive in your approach.

Values the person's rights and dignity.

• Always respond with respect, empathy and compassion.

The course informs participants as to why and how a person exhibits distress behaviour, how to objectively analyse the risk associated with it, and how to identify strategies to mitigate the risk.
