Dear Parish Family,

You must stand ready! The son of man is coming at an hour you do not expect!

Keeping to the theme that began last week, our Gospel has Jesus instructing his disciples about being prepared and watchful for his return. It's helpful to keep in mind that this instruction is taking place while he is on his way to Jerusalem...In the first century, the early Christians were eagerly awaiting the return of Jesus. It's obvious through Luke's community that they were beginning to face the realisation that the promised return was going to take longer than expected.... well, 2000 years down the track, we are still waiting....it could be sooner, or it could be later but either way we need to lives as if we are ready!

I heard a lecture some time ago which highlighted that fear was one of the greatest things facing our world today. You only have to look around at the events happening overseas. Fear has the potential to stop us from growing, it can cause paralysis..and it's responsible for some of the negative "isms" in our world. What are some of those "isms"? Well there's racism where there is often a fear of another's culture; then there's ageism where there is a fear of getting older; even in the Church we suffer from clericalism where there is a fear of a loss of authority or power. So, what does Jesus mean when he says to us you must stand ready! The son of man is coming at an hour you do not expect!

Is Jesus warning us to be afraid? Jesus is not about - Boo I've caught you out!!! NO! Nor is he calling us to be afraid of God. "God's right around the corner and I'm gonna get you." Rather he is warning us not to be missing out on life, our life in God. He is saying, what you have in life, family, friends service to our community, it's all right here and now. Live in the moment and don't let life just float you along like a leaf on the river. Choose life at each moment. The remedy to fear is both faith and hope...hope the theme that we are celebrating in this jubilee year is passion for what is possible! Jesus often spoke of the kingdom as both near and not yet. Living in faith and hope and being that for others are the very actions that bring the kingdom into being.

On Friday, we celebrate the Feast of the Assumption, a beautiful feast of hope when Our Lady is assumed body and soul into heaven, the hope that is there for all of us. Mass will be celebrated on this day in all our churches please check the bulletin for times. Also on Friday, we will be celebrating the last of the sacrament of Confirmation this time at St Joseph's Toronto. There are 15 candidates, so let's keep these young people in our prayers over this next coming week.

Also, under the guidance of the Holy Spirit, having listened to all of our parish assemblies, last Sunday during Mass at St John Vianney Church, Morisset I signed the new Parish Pastoral Council statutes into law. During this week, the document was sent to the Bishop's office where it has now been promulgated. Therefore, I now call all of our communities to begin the process of nominating your candidate to represent your parish community. Inside the bulletin there is an explanation of the role of the pastoral councillor, eligibility and the process of nominating. Nominations will close after the Warners Bay Sunday Mass at 6pm on Sunday 31st August 2025. As we begin this next chapter, may we be guided by the Holy Spirit and to be people of faith and hope.

Sunday 10 August 2025 19th Sunday in Ordinary Time Year C

First Reading (Wisdom 18: 6-9)

A reading from the book of Wisdom

That night had been foretold to our ancestors, so that, once they saw what kind of oaths they had put their trust in, they would joyfully take courage. This was the expectation of your people, the saving of the virtuous and the ruin of their enemies; for by the same act with which you took vengeance on our foes you made us glorious by calling us to you. The devout children of worthy men offered sacrifice in secret and this divine pact they struck with one accord: that the saints would share the same blessings and dangers alike; and forthwith they had begun to chant the hymns of the fathers.

A reading from the letter to the Hebrews

Only faith can guarantee the blessings that we hope for, or prove the existence of the realities that at present remain unseen. It was for faith that our ancestors were commended.

It was by faith that Abraham obeyed the call to set out for a country that was the inheritance given to him and his descendants, and that he set out without knowing where he was going. By faith he arrived, as a foreigner, in the Promised Land, and lived there as if in a strange country, with Isaac and Jacob, who were heirs with him of the same promise. They lived there in tents while he looked forward to a city founded, designed and built by God.

It was equally by faith that Sarah, in spite of being past the age, was made able to conceive, because she believed that he who had made the promise would be faithful to it. Because of this, there came from one man, and one who was already as good as dead himself, more descendants than could be counted, as many as the stars of heaven or the grains of sand on the seashore.

Nominations are now invited for membership on the Pastoral Council.

Role of the Pastoral Council

The Pastoral Council is not responsible for ordinary Parish administration and is not to involve itself in the ordinary day-to-day running of the Parishes. With the Parish Priest, the Pastoral Council will be responsible for studying and assessing those matters which concern the pastoral works of the Parishes and proposing a Parish Pastoral Plan to direct and facilitate those works.

Membership

The Pastoral Council is truly representative of the whole group of parishes, particularly in terms of localities, age, and gender.

The Pastoral Council should collectively have all the skills and talents necessary for the Pastoral Council to fulfil its purpose as expressed above.

Eligibility for membership of the Pastoral Council, a person shall be

- A member of Christ's faithful in full communion with the Catholic Church (cf. c. 512 §1), and
- "Outstanding in firm faith, high moral standards and prudence" (cf. 512 §3), and
- Either has a domicile in the parishes of Our Lady Help of Christians Boolaroo; St Michael the Archangel, Booragul; St John Vianney, Morisset; or St Joseph's Toronto"
- If not resident within the boundaries of the parishes habitually attends Sunday Mass at one of the churches of the parishes.

Election of Members

A total of three (3) parishioners from each parish community elected by their fellow parishioners for a term of three (3) years.

Nominations for candidates for election

- shall be in writing,
- proposed and seconded by two people who are eligible to cast a vote in the election,
- be accepted by the nominee, and
- be lodged with the nomination box in the church by 7pm Sunday 31 August 2025. (*Statutes of the PPC*)





Saturdays 16 & 23 August





LATEST NEWS FROM OUR SAFEGUARDING PROMOTERS 10 AUGUST 2025

The **Promoters of Safeguarding** continue to endorse a culture of safeguarding within the Parish. This week, your attention is drawn to the **International Day of the World's Indigenous Peoples.**

In order to safeguard the rights of all indigenous peoples and raise awareness of their struggles, this weekend (Saturday, August 9) honours the rich cultures, traditions, languages, and contributions of indigenous communities worldwide with the **International Day of the World's Indigenous Peoples.**

Australian indigenous inhabitants have a history dating back over 65,000 years, making them one of the world's oldest continuous cultures. In the 2021 Census, 812,000 people identified as Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander, with 11,759 people (5.5% of the population) in the Lake Macquarie area. In our region, the Awabakal nation, who inhabit the area around Lake Macquarie. They have lived in the area for over 8,000 years. The name Awabakal is derived from the lake, meaning "people of the calm surface".

Since European colonisation in 1788, these Aboriginal communities have faced immense challenges, including displacement, violence, loss of land, and systemic discrimination. Despite this, they have shown incredible resilience and continue to fight for recognition and justice.

Safeguarding Australian Aborigines is vital to preserving their unique cultures, rights, and connection to the land. This includes protecting sacred sites, ensuring access to healthcare and education, addressing inequality, and amplifying their indigenous voices.


