2nd Sunday of Advent Year A

Reflection for the 2nd Week Advent 2022

In any Court of Law there are numerous characters each with specific roles to play, each showing an intentional way of approaching the issue at hand. Today I want to focus upon 2 of these roles:

One way was demonstrated by Isaiah, (in our first reading) and John the Baptist. The other way was demonstrated by the Pharisees and the Sadducees.

These roles are: Witnesses and/or Interrogators.

Isaiah and John the Baptist's roles in life were to be witnesses to the current events of their time.

On the other hand the Pharisees and Sadducees, well, their roles in life were to be the interrogators of their time.

Witnesses talk specifically about what they see and hear.

Witnesses speak about the truth, they speak about what they have experienced directly.

Interrogators on the other hand don't speak about what they see or hear or experience.

All interrogators do is to demand direct answers, they question everything. Interrogators often refuse to believe what the witnesses are stating.

So, we can safely say that witnesses are shining the light on the matter whereas interrogators are trying to extinguish the light.

So, we have these two opposing roles or views of the world.

Witnesses, like Isaiah and John the Baptist, bring that little necessity in life called hope, whereas interrogators bring into life the opposite of hope which is despair.

Witnesses.... Interrogators.... Hope.... Despair

Let's now look at our roles to play in life:

Are you a Witness to Gods love..... or are you an Interrogator to Gods love?

Do you stand up and speak out about what you see, hear and experience each day, or do you look with despairing eyes and question and doubt what you see, hear and experience?

Are you willing to be like Isaiah and John and witness to the truth? or are you simply going to be like the Pharisees and Sadducees and demand answers and question everything or if the answer does not suit you, you simply just ignore it?

In other words do you want to bring hope to your neighbours or would you rather bring despair?

What role in the Court room of your life are you going to take tomorrow and the next day?

LATEST NEWS FROM OUR SAFEGUARDING PROMOTERS

The *Promoters of Safeguarding* continue to endorse a culture of safeguarding within the Parish.

It is hard to believe that we are now in Advent, this year is nearly at an end. The Safeguarding Promoters have met monthly throughout the year. Our main focus this year has been preparing the documents required for the Parish audit. The audit required us to examine each of the 10 standards and provide evidence that our Parish is compliant. We have had the wonderful support of Maryanne, our parish secretary who is responsible for the maintenance of the evidence. We have learned as we have moved through the document as this is a first for us as well. We are pleased to say that we have submitted the audit document and are waiting on feedback. We believe we are compliant in all areas.

The final ratification of the second edition of the Standards is imminent and then the process starts again. As you may be aware the current standards focus on the children in our Parish, the new standards will extend the remit to adults as well as refine the current standards and evidence. This is a positive move as it places a responsibility on the Parish to be aware of those who become vulnerable at any life stage. The new Standards are likely to contain new requirements for certain groups we will notify you, via email, if you are affected.

When the new Standards are ratified, we will explain the changes to you through the bulletin as Safeguarding is a Parish wide responsibility. Every member should be aware of and maintain the standards, and report issues. Next year we will be asking you to complete a survey based on the Safeguarding mandate, we will make this survey available electronically and in the bulletin. The promoters have raised a few issues to the Parish Council for consideration and we will report on the conclusions once we have feedback. There have been no reports/ complaints made during 2022, we recognise that this does not mean there are no issues. Each week we published how to contact us if needed, the promoters have mandated procedures to follow if an issue is raised. In addition, any parishioner can raise an issue directly to the diocesan Safeguarding office either online or by phone.

Currently we are ensuring that our volunteer list is up to date. Those on this list should have received an email recently. If you are a volunteer and did not receive an email please contact Maryanne to update your details. If any of your details change please contact the office. To each and every person who actively supports our Parish by volunteering – thank you. The promoters are taking a break from meetings and posting in the bulletin over the Christmas and New Year period, we are still available if needed. We would be grateful if someone from our Booragul and Boolaroo churches would join us in 2023, this would mean that every church is represented.

LITURGY OF THE WORD

First Reading

(11:1-10)

A reading from the prophet Isaiah

A shoot springs from the stock of Jesse, a scion thrusts from his roots: on him the spirit of the Lord rests, a spirit of wisdom and insight, a spirit of counsel and power, a spirit of knowledge and of the fear of the Lord. (The fear of the Lord is his breath.) He does not judge by appearances, he gives no verdict on hearsay, but judges the wretched with integrity, and with equity gives a verdict for the poor of the land. His word is a rod that strikes the ruthless, his sentences bring death to the wicked.

Integrity is the loincloth round his waist, faithfulness the belt about his hips.

The wolf lives with the lamb, the panther lies down with the kid, calf and lion cub feed together with a little boy to lead them. The cow and the bear make friends, their young lie down together. The lion eats straw like the ox. The infant plays over the cobra's hole; into the viper's lair the young child puts his hand. They do no hurt, no harm, on all my holy mountain, for the country is filled with the knowledge of the Lord as the waters swell the sea.

That day, the root of Jesse shall stand as a signal to the peoples. It will be sought out by the nations and its home will be glorious.

Everything that was written long ago in the scriptures was meant to teach us something about hope from the examples scripture gives of how people who did not give up were helped by God. And may he who helps us when we refuse to give up, help you all to be tolerant with each other, following the

example of Christ Jesus, so that united in mind and voice you may give glory to the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ.

It can only be to God's glory, then, for you to treat each other in the same friendly way as Christ treated you. The reason Christ became the servant of circumcised Jews was not only so that God could faithfully carry out the promises made to the patriarchs, it was also to get the pagans to give glory to God for his mercy, as scripture says in one place: For this I shall praise you among the pagans and sing your name.

(3:1-12)

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Matthew

In due course John the Baptist appeared; he preached in the wilderness of Judaea and this was his message: 'Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is close at hand.' This was the man the prophet Isaiah spoke of when he said:

A voice cries in the wilderness: Prepare a way for the Lord, make his paths straight.

This man John wore a garment made of camel-hair with a leather belt round his waist, and his food was locusts and wild honey. Then Jerusalem and all Judaea and the whole Jordan district made their way to him, and as they were baptised by him in the river Jordan they confessed their sins. But when he saw a number of Pharisees and Sadducees coming for baptism he said to them, 'Brood of vipers, who warned you to fly from the retribution that is coming? But if you are repentant, produce the appropriate fruit, and do not presume to tell yourselves, "We have Abraham for our father," because, I tell you, God can raise children for Abraham from these stones. Even now the axe is laid to the roots of the trees, so that any tree which fails to produce good fruit will be cut down and thrown on the fire. I baptise you in water for repentance, but the one who follows me is more powerful than I am, and I am not fit to carry his sandals; he will baptise you with the Holy Spirit and fire. His winnowing-fan is in his hand; he will clear his threshing-floor and gather his wheat into the barn; but the chaff he will burn in a fire that will never go out.'

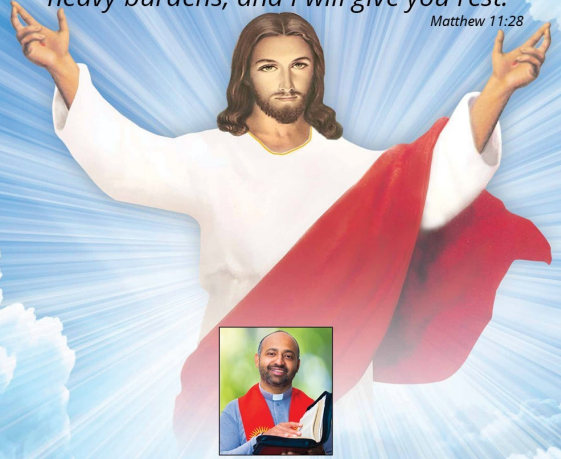

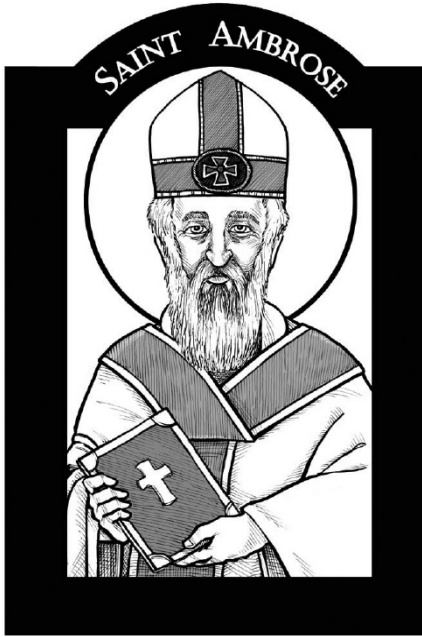
Shepherding God

and open our hearts in hospitality and love.

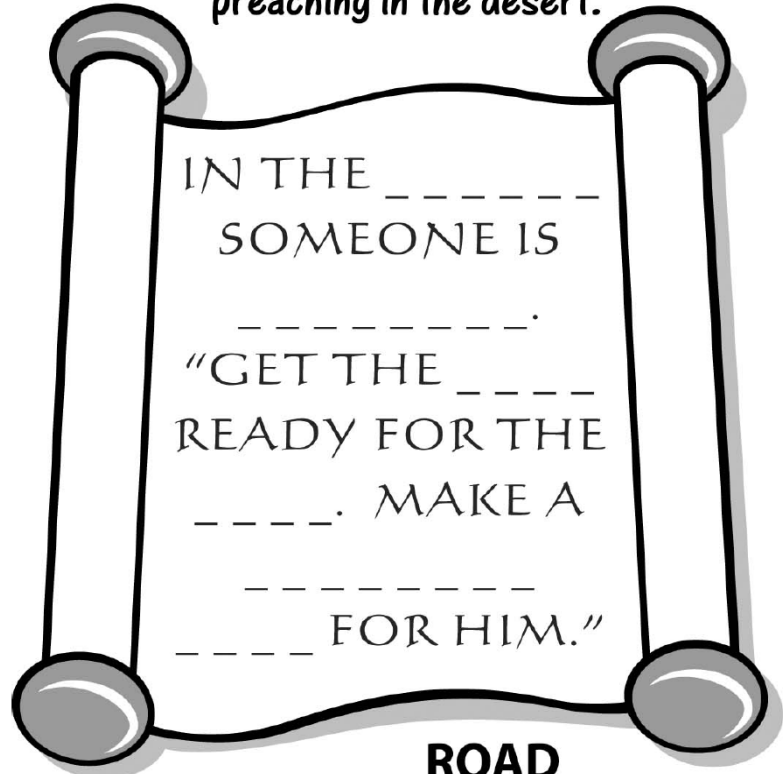

St Ambrose was born at Trier in 334 AD. While practising law he was appointed governor of the province of Aemilia and Liguria. Four years later when the see of Milan became vacant, St Ambrose was chosen as the new bishop, despite the fact that he was not even baptised. He reluctantly accepted the position, was baptised, ordained a priest and then installed as bishop. In 390 AD, after Emperor Theodosius ordered the savage massacre of many people, St Ambrose impressed upon the Emperor to perform a public penance for this act of cruelty. St Ambrose is listed as one of the four great Latin doctors of the church. He was a great orator who gave sermons that offered practical teachings for his people. He was also the first teacher in the West to make significant use of hymns as a popular means of praise.

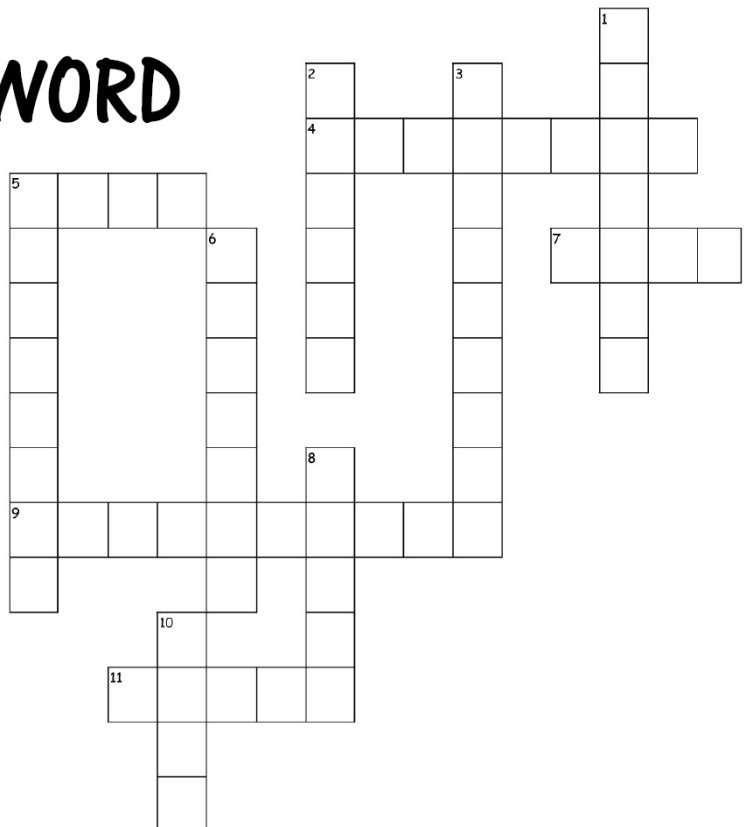
