Dear Parish Family,

.... kindly do not pass your servant by. Human being vs Human doing!

Again, as Jesus sets his face to go to Jerusalem, like so much of the Gospel of Luke, this week's passage is, at its heart, all about hospitality... hospitality where God enters our lives and the lives of those around us, providing for each other's needs. One of the greatest sins in some religions is the sin against hospitality. In our first reading, we gain an understanding of Jewish hospitality. The desert people are well known for being gracious hosts and with long treks between watering holes, hospitality is often a matter of life and death. When Abraham invites these travellers and he and Sarah offer hospitality, a bond is established God promises to visit again, and in the meantime, they will conceive a child... we can never be sure how God might show God's self to us.

This Sunday's Gospel of Martha and Mary follows on from last Sunday's parable of the Good Samaritan. We recall that the Samaritan generously helped someone in need. Now, keeping that parable in mind, we can consider the respective activities of these two women. Martha welcomes Jesus into the house, sees to all his needs and makes herself busy in the kitchen while Mary sits at the foot of Jesus and listens to his word. In fact, Martha does exactly what the Good Samaritan did for the poor abandoned man on the side of the road, Martha serves Jesus.

Did you notice....Jesus turned the customs and taboos of his society upside down. The role of women disciples. Jesus is alone with women who are not his relatives, that's not acceptable for a Jewish man. Is that what Martha was really 'anxious and troubled' about? Or.....was it because Mary is assuming the posture of a student at the feet of a Rabbi listening to his teaching. That's only what Jewish men can do. Maybe it was a step too far for Martha. Jesus was willing to upset the social and religious taboos of his day in respect of women. Did Jesus seem to speak harshly to Martha. The detail in the gospel is more about Martha seemingly distracted.

The final lesson of the story of Martha and Mary is always a very real problem that Christianity can be reduced to being just the Good Samaritans of/in this world. The parable of the Good Samaritan with the story of Martha and Mary is a reminder not to only serve because there is a risk of losing touch with the other part, that is reflecting on the reason why we serve. Therefore, the pre-requisite to being a disciple we need to be both.... Martha and Mary.

As a Church, we still have lots to learn on the role of women and discipleship ...When the late Pope Francis appointed women into roles normally reserved for Cardinals, it challenged the status quo.... perhaps it was Jesus saying to us as Church.... you have chosen the better part...

We welcome back our young people in our schools this week....I hope and pray that it has been a good break and you are excited for Term 3. This weekend, lets hold the communities of Boolaroo - Warners Bay -Booragul in prayer as we hold their assembly and next week the community of Toronto will be in assembly.

First Reading (Genesis 18: 1-10)

A reading from the book of Genesis

The Lord appeared to Abraham at the Oak of Mamre while he was sitting by the entrance of the tent during the hottest part of the day. He looked up, and there he saw three men standing near him. As soon as he saw them he ran from the entrance of the tent to meet them, and bowed to the ground. 'My lord,' he said, 'I beg you, if I find favour with you, kindly do not pass your servant by. A little water shall be brought; you shall wash your feet and lie down under the tree. Let me fetch a little bread and you shall refresh yourselves before going further. That is why you have come in your servant's direction.' They replied, 'Do as you say.'

Abraham hastened to the tent to find Sarah. 'Hurry,' he said, 'knead three bushels of flour and make loaves. Then running to the cattle Abraham took a fine and tender calf and gave it to the servant, who hurried to prepare it. Then taking cream, milk and the calf he had prepared, he laid all before them, and they ate while he remained standing near them under the tree.

'Where is your wife Sarah?' they asked him. 'She is in the tent,' he replied. Then his guest said, 'I shall visit you again next year without fail and your wife will then have a son.'

LATEST NEWS FROM OUR SAFEGUARDING PROMOTERS 20 JULY 2025

The **Promoters of Safeguarding** continue to endorse a culture of safeguarding within the Parish.

This week's article focuses on Why Elder Financial Abuse should matter to you, continuing from last week.

10 Common forms of elder financial abuse

Elder financial abuse can take many forms and can include repeated or oneoff actions, threats or even a lack of action. Here are 10 of the most common types of abuse.

- **6. Theft** While theft is a risk for all people, older people are particularly at risk, especially if they have care needs. Thieves can exploit an older person's specific physical or mental vulnerabilities.
- **7. Inheritance impatience** This occurs when adults feel entitled to an ageing relative's assets. This could cause them to try and take their assets from them. Examples include stealing money from parents' bank accounts, or transferring assets to another person.
- **8. Guarantors** Often, older parents will help their adult children purchase a home or start a business by being a guarantor to a loan. In some cases, this can create situations where the older parents might lose their home, despite there being no bad intent.
- **9. Failure to provide promised care** This occurs when an (often well-intentioned) arrangement for family members to provide care to older relatives in exchange for financial assistance breaks down, often because of a change in circumstance (e.g. employment) for the younger person.
- **10. Emotional blackmail** This can be one of the subtlest and least visible forms of abuse. Examples include an adult child refusing access to grandchildren, except in return for a loan; or an emotionally dependent adult child abusing their parents' concern by demanding money.

Financial abuse is often not technically illegal. Often, elder financial abuse involves someone unethically exploiting power of attorney or other legal mechanisms that give them control over an older person's assets.

Financial abuse often causes psychological, not physical harm. Often, elder financial abuse doesn't involve obvious physical threats or violence (although it sometimes does). Instead, the abuser inflicts profound emotional harm and psychological distress on the victim.
