Dear Parish Family,

FORTUNE FAVOURS THE BOLD

Today's gospel parable is intriguing. Is Jesus encouraging fraud and bribery? Seeing the manoeuvres of the steward who acts to save his neck, is he suggesting we copy this devious bookkeeper? It's scandalous how the steward draws up a 'plan-b', connives with his master's debtors, doctors the accounts and surprisingly this 'plan-b' works. The icing on the cake: he gets an accolade as a wise steward - he sure gets the last laugh! Let's dig-in.

Workable Tactic

The steward's dishonesty had been exposed and was noticeable to everyone. He saw the shame of no longer being in such privileged position, thus he realistically ponders to himself: "I am not strong enough to dig, and I am ashamed to beg". He deliberately ignores to fight back who bad-mouthed him or snitched, neither does he whine about the backstabber, rather, he chooses to prioritize his employment that was on the chopping board. His foresight combined with his troubleshooting strategy becomes feasible when he wins over debtors of his employer and secures himself a soft landing whether he's kept in his job or fired. What Jesus is concerned with is the lack of such spiritual foresight on the part of His followers. What's Jesus teaching us? **Don't lose your head**. Be willing to be different, be willing to be controversial, you have got to be willing to be talked about. Jesus was. It takes courage to be different, it takes courage to be successful, it takes courage to win.

May 2023, while in Kenya, I was asked by our group leader of the Spiritan Order in Australia to consider moving to Australia for mission. Hard nut to crack! The rush of anxiety to leave everything and everyone behind to the unknown, the uneasy buzz of 'is this venture going to work?', the eerie feeling of disconnecting my comfort zone were all intense, a defining moment of either/or. This was a test of loyalty to God with my call of commitment and obedience on the line. Looking back, couldn't be happier, I measured up and here I am. So, it's not only money, but additionally the choices, decisions, successes, failures, life's goodies, what has worked as well as what went down the drain: God must be put **ahead.** "God never does what's easy with us, he does what's divine: and puts you on a defining moment of either/or. If not, why did God use a boy to kill Goliath? Why did God send a backslider to preach to the Nineveh? Why did God use a century old man to have Isaac? Why did God use a virgin to birth Jesus? Who tells a blind man to go wash in a pool he couldn't see how to get to?" I invite you to the prayer below. May it incite you to be astute and bold to get 'the job done' and may God sustain your spirit, purpose and energy to the breakthrough you hope for.

First Reading (Amos 8: 4-7)

A reading from the prophet Amos

Listen to this, you who trample on the needy and try to suppress the poor people of the country, you who say, 'When will New Moon be over so that we can sell our corn, and sabbath, so that we can market our wheat? Then by lowering the bushel, raising the shekel, by swindling and tampering with the scales, we can buy up the poor for money, and the needy for a pair of sandals, and get a price even for the sweepings of the wheat.' The Lord swears it by the pride of Jacob, 'Never will I forget a single thing you have done.'

Responsorial Psalm

A reading from the first letter of St Paul to Timothy

My advice is that, first of all, there should be prayers offered for everyone – petitions, intercessions and thanksgiving – and especially for kings and others in authority, so that we may be able to live religious and reverent lives in peace and quiet. To do this is right, and will please God our saviour: he wants everyone to be saved and reach full knowledge of the truth. For there is only one God, and there is only one mediator between God and mankind, himself a man, Christ Jesus, who sacrificed himself as a ransom for them all. He is the evidence of this, sent at the appointed time, and I have been named a herald and apostle of it and – I am telling the truth and no lie – a teacher of the faith and the truth to the pagans.

In every place, then, I want the men to lift their hands up reverently in prayer, with no anger or argument.

Alleluia, alleluia! Jesus Christ was rich but he became poor, to make you rich out of his poverty. Alleluia!

Gospel (Luke 16: 1-13)

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Luke

Jesus said to his disciples: "There was a rich man and he had a steward who was denounced to him for being wasteful with his property. He called for the man and said, "What is this I hear about you? Draw me up an account of your stewardship because you are not to be my steward any longer." Then the steward said to himself, "Now that my master is taking the stewardship from me, what am I to do? Dig? I am not strong enough. Go begging? I should be too ashamed. Ah, I know what I will do to make sure that when I am dismissed from office there will be some to welcome me into their homes."

Then he called his master's debtors one by one. To the first he said, "How much do you owe my master?" "One hundred measures of oil," was the reply. The steward said, "Here, take your bond; sit down straight away and write fifty." To another he said, "And you, sir, how much do you owe?" "One hundred measures of wheat," was the reply. The steward said, "Here, take your bond and write eighty."

'The master praised the dishonest steward for his astuteness. For the children of this world are more astute in dealing with their own kind than are the children of light.

'And so I tell you this: use money, tainted as it is, to win you friends, and thus make sure that when it fails you, they will welcome you into the tents of eternity. The man who can be trusted in little things can be trusted in great; the man who is dishonest in little things will be dishonest in great. If then you cannot be trusted with money, that tainted thing, who will trust you with genuine riches? And if you cannot be trusted with what is not yours, who will give you what is your very own?

'No servant can be the slave of two masters: he will either hate the first and love the second, or treat the first with respect and the second with scorn. You cannot be the slave both of God and of money.'

BOOLAROO-BOORAGUL-MORISSET-TORONTO LAKESIDE PARISHES PASTORAL COUNCIL ELECTION

The election of representatives for the council will be held on the weekend of the 27th and 28th of September 2025. On voting day, a single ballot paper will be provided to number your preferences on who you would like to see as your representative on the Regional Pastoral Council (RPC). You will then be asked to place it in the locked ballot box. A total of three (3) parishioners from each parish community will be elected by their fellow parishioners for a term of three (3) years.

Boolaroo Candidates:

PETA LANDERS

Thank you Ian, for nominating me for the upcoming Parish Pastoral Council Election.

My name is Peta Landers. I moved to Eleebana from Sydney, with my family in 1994 and subsequently joined the St Mary's - Warners Bay Parish.

I am a registered nurse/clinical nurse specialist who retired in June 2020 to look after my husband during his short battle with metastatic melanoma. My nursing career spanned almost 50 years with over 30 years in Dialysis and Transplantation and 18 years in aged care which I thoroughly enjoyed. I also helped my siter care for our parents until their deaths.

I am a practicing catholic who upholds the moral compass of the Catholic church. I try to live my life by the Christian values as taught to me by my parents and the catholic education that I received at school. I have also tried to in still these values in my children.

If I am elected, I would like to bring back to the parish a return of the Children's Ministry, the establishment of a Youth Group for teenagers and the youth of our parish and formation of a team that encompasses identification and visitation to the lonely and isolated in our parish, as people are now living longer and staying longer in their own homes.

Currently I am involved in the Baptism Team, providing education to parents and carers through attendance at baptism meetings, support to parents and the priest at Presentation and on the day of Baptism. Through sharing of stories at Baptism meetings it is hoped that these families may be inspired to return to the church and educate their children in the catholic system, if they are not already doing this.

Safeguarding promotion is to protect and promote the safety of children and vulnerable adults within the parish and associated organisations. Following revision of the Safeguarding standards set down by the Catholic Church and the NSW Government, we meet twice a year and attend Network meetings twice a year.

I am a Sacristan and a Communion Minister. I am on the recently formed Social Committee. I see this as a way of bringing parishioners of all ages together, through social activities, such as the recent, successful, Soup, Damper and Singalong night. The Funeral Ministry is in its infancy, I recently attended a Funeral Course.

Social: I attend the Real Women cafe nights and enjoy the social aspects of this, especially listening to the guest speakers. I also go to the Monthly Ladies Lunches where I enjoy interacting with the ladies and provide support and advice where warranted.

IAN ROSS-GOWAN

Biography: I have lived in our area on and off since my family moved to Booragul in 1970 and have been in Warners Bay since 1989. I am one of five siblings and have been married to Shirley since 1989. We have two boys, now in their 30s. My mother, wife, sister-in-law, 2 boys and I attend Sunday evening Mass at Warners Bay. I worked for BHP and OneSteel for 28 years and now work assisting many companies in accessing government assistance programs related to research and development (R&D).

I have worked for the Church as a volunteer in many roles, including on the Finance Committee, the previous PPC, the Baptism team, and I assist the Priest and Sacristan at many of the Masses. I am on the team preparing for the Boolaroo church closure, and coordinate the audio/visual system, etc. I have worked with St Vincent de Paul as the Diocesan representative to prepare for the release of the annual Bishop's Catholic Social Justice Statement and on Parish sustainability and Parish services.

My relevant achievements include working on:

- Parish sustainability for the Boolaroo and Booragul Parishes to bring our costs under control and preparations for the St Mary, Help of Christians Parish Booragul Warners Bay Parish,
- The AV system replacement and operations as our largest expense in recent years,
- Establishing the Baptism team, and
- Advocacy work on various issues, for example, housing issues for refugees, R&D support with the Australian, New Zealand and Myanmar governments, government departments and universities, and in supporting victims with the Royal Commission on institutional responses to childhood sexual abuse.

How do I see myself contributing to the Parish Pastoral Council?

My contribution to the Parish Pastoral Council will be to continue to improve our Parish and establish it new future. In this, we must preserve what is good about the Boolaroo, Booragul and Warners Bay communities. We must make sure that there is positive progress in developing our new identity and improving our sustainability. This is to ensure we meet the faith needs of current and future generations of Catholics in our area. It requires focusing on the new parish and regional parish processes and practices and on the transitional change management so we all move together to make Booragul Warners Bay and our fellow parishes the best we can be so we can meet these religious needs.

The changes in our parishes are an opportunity to revive our community and reinvigorate our faith, to expand our outreach and encourage growth in our communities. My contribution will be in bringing the communities in Booragul, Boolaroo and Warners Bay closer together with the recognition that it is we, not the buildings, that are the Church. The process of developing faith and involvement with the Church by the wider community is reliant on working better with the primary and secondary schools and on adapting how we seek to support faith development by recognising people marry and have children later in life. Practical solutions here are recommencing Children's liturgy, follow-up contacts with families between Baptisms and school and in engaging with students at the primary and high schools.

The three ways I can contribute to the organisational issues of our parishes are:

- 1. Managing the changes that are upon us as we become one parish without a church in Boolaroo as part of a regional parish, so these changes bring us all together,
- 2. Ensuring that we use these changes to improve our sustainability e.g. by what happens to the Boolaroo site, by evangelising in growing areas near Booragul, and in linkages with the schools, and
- 3. Establishing processes to enable and encourage more people who are willing and able to contribute at the local parish or church level so that the regional Parish model can work for all the communities from Cooranbong to Warners Bay.

I will have everybody's best interest at hearts . God's love guides all of our ways. Thank you for reading this and blessings to you all Elaine.







LATEST NEWS FROM OUR SAFEGUARDING PROMOTERS 21 SEPTEMBER 2025

The Promoters of Safeguarding continue to endorse a culture of safeguarding within the Parish. This week, your attention is drawn to 'our own Parish commitment to safeguarding'.

Our commitment statement is paraphrased as follows: We, the people of the Catholic Parishes of Boolaroo, Booragul, Toronto and Morisset, are committed to fostering communities of safety and care for all people, especially for children and others in the community who are vulnerable.

We commit to be a person who:

- Wants all children to be safe, to grow and to flourish, and have zero tolerance to any attitude and activity that makes a child feel or be less than safe;
- Acts with integrity, humility and sincerity, being truthful and open-hearted, and accountable and transparent, throughout the Parish and wider community;
- Shows care for the rights of all people who are supported by the Parish systems;
