# RITE OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION OF ADULTS

Dear Parish Family,

It has been decided by the Holy Spirit and by ourselves not to saddle you with any burden beyond the essentials....

This week, we celebrate two great events. Firstly, this week marks the 1700<sup>th</sup> anniversary since the acceptance of the Nicene Creed. This is the same Creed we recite most Sundays and Holy Days. It was formulated at the Council of Nicaea in 325AD (Turkey) to lay out a set of beliefs about the Trinity and the question of the divinity of Jesus. I'm sure trying to get a whole lot of priests and bishops together to come up with this statement of belief was no easy task. A bit like the above statement that came from the Council of Jerusalem in 50AD when Paul and Peter were at loggerheads because Paul felt that Peter was behaving one way with the Jewish converting to Christianity and another with those gentiles converting. Peter wanted them all to follow the circumcision and dietary rules. Guided by the Holy Spirit, they decided they had no right to put any burdens on anyone because belief comes through faith and not observing the law.

From the earliest acts of the Church, we have seen the working of the Holy Spirit. Jesus in the Gospel continues to talk about "going home", but his work will continue in and through his disciples through the gift of the Holy Spirit, shaping and guiding us. Signs of the Spirit will be the gift of peace. Peace, not as we know it. Peace that is not simply the absence of conflict but a wholeness that only God can provide. A peace that enabled the community to discover, in our first reading, ways of reaching harmony within its diversity. Peace that the late Pope Francis invited us to rediscover the life of the spirit within the church through synodality – a journey of mutual listening, guided by the Spirit and looking to invite those who seek to be made welcome.

The other great event this week is on Saturday 24<sup>th</sup> May, we celebrate the feast of Our Lady Help of Christians, the patroness of our parish and school of Boolaroo-Warners Bay. The title of "Helper" has been part of Mary's title as far back as the fourth century. It was in 1571 in the battle of Lepanto that the title was first used when the fleet of the Holy League under Pope Pius V defeated the Ottoman Empire. Closer to home, it was in 1844 that Mary, as Our Lady Help of Christians, was declared patroness of Australia. As patroness, we are praying for her intercession and role as a guide, particularly during the early years of the Catholic Church here when the faith relied heavily on the Rosary and the faith of the people. St Mary of the Cross MacKillop is our second patron saint for Australia.... we are in good hands!

Happy Feast Day, Boolaroo – Warners Bay!!!

Come, Holy Spirit; fill the hearts of your faithful and kindle in them the fire of your love.

Just a reminder that Pentecost is in two weeks — the day when we celebrate the many gifts that are given to each and every one of us, to enrich the Church. On that Sunday, we will hold a Gifting Sunday where we will be asking for volunteers to help and support the various ministries within our parishes. What gift am I already gifting to our community, or what could I gift? More information coming next weekend.

# First Reading (Acts of the Apostles 15: 1-2. 22-29)

A reading from the Acts of the Apostles

Some men came down from Judaea and taught the brothers, 'Unless you have yourselves circumcised in the tradition of Moses you cannot be saved.' This led to disagreement, and after Paul and Barnabas had had a long argument with these men it was arranged that Paul and Barnabas and others of the church should go up to Jerusalem and discuss the problem with the apostles and elders. Then the apostles and elders decided to choose delegates to send to Antioch with Paul and Barnabas; the whole church concurred with this. They chose Judas known as Barsabbas and Silas, both leading men in the brotherhood, and gave them this letter to take with them:

The apostles and elders, your brothers, send greetings to the brothers of pagan birth in Antioch, Syria and Cilicia. We hear that some of our members have disturbed you with their demands and have unsettled your minds. They acted without any authority from us. and so we have decided unanimously to elect delegates and to send them to you with Barnabas and Paul, men we highly respect who have dedicated their lives to the name of our Lord Jesus Christ. Accordingly we are sending you Judas and Silas, who will confirm by word of mouth what we have written in this letter. It has been decided by the Holy Spirit and by ourselves not to saddle you with any burden beyond these essentials: you are to abstain from food sacrificed to idols, from blood, from the meat of strangled animals and from fornication. Avoid these, and you will do what is right. Farewell.'

# What's happening in the Diocese and Surrounds ...

#### Join us for the Called & Gifted Discernment Process

The Diocese of Maitland-Newcastle is excited during the Jubilee Year to launch the Called & Gifted Discernment Process within the Diocese. The process is designed to help Christians discern the presence of charisms in their lives. Charisms, or spiritual gifts, are special abilities given to all Christians by the Holy Spirit to give them power both to represent Christ and to be a channel of God's goodness for people. Mission & Evangelisation is working directly with the Catherine of Siena Institute to offer the Called & Gifted Discernment Process this year. The process will be facilitated online by professionally trained practitioners based in the USA.

Part One of the Called & Gifted process will take place across four Tuesday evenings from **10 June to 1 July, 7:30pm - 9:00pm** and you will learn:

- The role of every Catholic and of the local parish in the mission of the Church to the world.
- The critical role of charisms in the life and service of other lay Catholics and in the life of the parish or Christian community.
- The signs and characteristics of 24 common charisms.
- How discerning and using your charisms can change your life and the life of others, your parish, and the world.

Part two of the process will be a **one hour personal gifts interview** held from 7 **July to 25 July**. Experienced CSI-trained gifts interviewers will be helping you with recognising patterns in your life that may indicate the presence of a charism and choose one charism to discern.

Part three of the process is **Discernment in Faith** held across 4 Tuesday evenings from **29 July to 9 September.** You will now be put into practice what you have learned about discernment. You will pick one charism to "experiment with" (two hours a week for a minimum of 6 - 8 weeks) – and see what God does!

### **Diocesan Cursillo Retreat**

The annual Diocese of Maitland-Newcastle 2025 Cursillo Retreat weekend will be held from **Thursday 12** – **Sunday 15 June** at Catalina Conference Centre, 171 Dorrington Road, Rathmines, with the theme "Called to Be".

The Retreat is a short course in Christianity that will enrich your faith for the rest of your life. It is Christ-centred, based on gospel values, and is Sacramental.

"How can I BE Christian in my many everyday environments?"

The Cursillo movement has been alive and active across the Maitland Newcastle Diocese since 1970. Cursillo represents a renewal within the life of the Church and is predominantly led by lay people, both men and women, with the support of clergy.

To: The People of the Diocese, Clergy, Staff of the Diocesan Offices and Agencies, Schools and Parishes

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Over the past days, our Diocese has been impacted by severe and ongoing rainfall, leading to flooding across several of our communities. Many Local Government Areas within our Diocese have been declared natural disaster zones.

I write to you with a heart full of concern, prayer, and solidarity for all those affected—especially those in and around Taree, Wingham, and the wider Manning region, who are experiencing some of the worst of these conditions.

These severe weather events have caused significant disruption and damage, with many in our Diocese directly affected—whether by floodwaters, separation from loved ones, or through their tireless efforts assisting others.

In the midst of these challenging times, I have been deeply moved and filled with hope by the stories emerging from across our communities. I have heard of schools and parishes coming together to provide digital learning opportunities for students, dry and welcoming spaces for families displaced by the floods, and countless acts of quiet compassion — from offering prayers to staying connected with those who have experienced great loss.

These acts of kindness, generosity, and solidarity are a powerful witness to the love of Christ alive in our Diocese. They remind us that even in hardship, we are never alone — we are a people of faith, united in love and compassion for one another.

We extend our heartfelt thanks to the NSW State Emergency Service (SES) and all first responders for their unwavering support of communities across the region. We are all grateful for their courage and commitment.

Please follow emergency services' advice, check in on your neighbours, and take all necessary precautions as the rain is expected to continue over the coming days.

If you or someone you know is struggling or in need of emotional support, I encourage you to reach out to the Rosewood Centre, who are available to provide assistance during this difficult time via telehealth appointments.

Please know that you are in my prayers and that we are inviting the people of the Diocese to pray for you as well. When the time is right, we will explore how we can best offer our practical support.

May God watch over all those affected, and may we find strength in our faith and in one another. Please be assured of my ongoing prayers for your safety and recovery.



### LATEST NEWS FROM OUR **SAFEGUARDING PROMOTERS 25 MAY 2025**

The **Promoters of Safeguarding** continue to endorse a culture of safeguarding within the Parish.

The Promoters of Safeguarding continue to endorse a culture of protection within our Parish. This week, we revisit safeguarding the rights of women.

Women have historically been excluded from large parts of public and political life in Australian society. In 1850, men in general could vote – women not until 1902 and First Nations women (and men) until 1962. Women were not elected to the Commonwealth Parliament until 1943. Not until 1965 could Australian women drink in a public bar. Until 1966, women working in the public service (and some other businesses) were required to resign when they got married. While we've come a long way in the last 100 years, there are still many areas in Australian society in which women and girls are still not safeguarded – two examples are given below.

Finance: On average, women are paid 17.5% less than men doing the same work; women work an extra 64 days a year to get the **same pay** as men doing the **same work**.

Violence: One in three women will experience physical violence in an intimate relationship, and one in five women has experienced **sexual violence** since the age of 15. Additionally, domestic violence is the biggest cause of homelessness for Australian women.
