Dear Parish Family,


I am sending you out like lambs among wolves

After many weeks, we will pick up reading Luke's Gospel again on Sundays, from now until November. This long section in Luke's Gospel (Luke 9:51-19:27) is known as the travel narrative, Jesus "set his face to go to Jerusalem". This Sunday's Gospel, Jesus sends out seventy-two disciples in pairs on a mission to preach the good news, and to heal the sick. He puts it quite bluntly that the path isn't going to be easy, but for those open to receiving and accepting the preaching of the disciples, they will experience ...God's love as like that of a tender mother (First Reading). Peace will be a sign of this - in a turbulent country, peace means a great deal!

The Gospel is full of imagery and numbers. We are told that Jesus sends out the seventy-two disciples in pairs. Why are these numbers so significant? Well, travelling in pairs is a reminder that spreading the gospel is relational, it happens between people. Also, to live out discipleship, we need to depend on each other for support, hospitality and kindness. As for the number seventy-two, it is often understood to refer to all the nations of the earth (Gen 10:2-31), no matter who you are. As St Paul writes, "it does not matter if a person is circumcised or not; what matters is for him (and her) to become an altogether new creature." (Gal 6:15)

When you think about it, imagine telling a group of followers (mainly Jewish) that you must lead a radical life of facing homelessness and travelling into a foreign territory where "you must eat and drink what is set before you". Would you? Would I? Therefore, to be a disciple, we must be open to being vulnerable. Vulnerability opens us all to greater possibilities to encounter the hospitality of God, which is at the heart of Luke's Gospel. Hospitality is where God enters our lives and the lives of those around us, providing for each other's needs.

This week, the nation marks NAIDOC Week, celebrating the history, culture, and achievements of First Nations peoples. The Church also invites us this Sunday to celebrate Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Sunday, as we celebrate the living story of faith and culture walking hand in hand. The theme this year is "Sent Forth in Strength and Hope". "It is Christ who sends us to walk together in faith, grounded deep in the spirituality and culture of First Nations Peoples, strengthened by the Gospel and filled with hope for the future God is leading us into." (National Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Catholic Council)



Thinking of the future God is leading us into, thank you to all who were present at the Morisset Assembly last Sunday was great to feel the energy in the room. In the coming weeks, Boolaroo-Warners Bay/Booragul will be holding their assemblies on Sunday, 20th July, and Toronto on Sunday, 27th July. Let's keep all our communities in prayer at this time.

First Reading (Isaiah 66: 10-14)

A reading from the prophet Isaiah

Rejoice, Jerusalem, be glad for her, all you who love her! Rejoice, rejoice for her, all you who mourned her! That you may be suckled, filled, from her consoling breast, that you may savour with delight her glorious breasts.

For thus says the Lord: Now towards her I send flowing peace, like a river, and like a stream in spate the glory of the nations. At her breast will her nurslings be carried and fondled in her lap. Like a son comforted by his mother will I comfort you. And by Jerusalem you will be comforted.

At the sight your heart will rejoice, and your bones flourish like the grass. To his servants the Lord will reveal his hand.

Responsorial Psalm

(Ps 65: 1-7. 16. 20. R. v.1)

(R.) Let all the earth cry out to God with joy.

- 1. Cry out with joy to God all the earth, O sing to the glory of his name. O render him glorious praise. Say to God: 'How tremendous your deeds! (R.)

A reading from the letter of St Paul to the Galatians

The only thing I can boast about is the cross of our Lord Jesus Christ, through whom the world is crucified to me, and I to the world. It does not matter if a person is circumcised or not; what matters is for him to become an altogether new creature. Peace and mercy to all who follow this rule, who form the Israel of God.

I want no more trouble from anybody after this; the marks on my body are those of Jesus. The grace of our Lord Jesus Christ be with your spirit, my brothers. Amen.

Gospel (Luke 10: 1-12. 17-20)

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Luke

The Lord appointed seventy-two others and sent them out ahead of him, in pairs, to all the towns and places he himself was to visit. He said to them, 'The harvest is rich but the labourers are few, so ask the Lord of the harvest to send labourers to his harvest. Start off now, but remember, I am sending you out like lambs among wolves. Carry no purse, no haversack, no sandals. Salute no one on the road. Whatever house you go into, let your first words be, "Peace to this house!" And if a man of peace lives there, your peace will go and rest on him; if not, it will come back to you. Stay in the same house, taking what food and drink they have to offer, for the labourer deserves his wages; do not move from house to house. Whenever you go into a town where they make you welcome, eat what is set before you. Cure those in it who are sick, and say, "The kingdom of God is very near to you." But whenever you enter a town and they do not make you welcome, go out into its streets and say, "We wipe off the very dust of your town that clings to our feet, and leave it with you. Yet be sure of this: the kingdom of God is very near." I tell you, that on that day it will not go as hard with Sodom as with that town.'

The seventy-two came back rejoicing. 'Lord,' they said, 'even the devils submit to us when we use your name.' He said to them, 'I watched Satan fall like lightning from heaven. Yes, I have given you power to tread underfoot serpents and scorpions and the whole strength of the enemy; nothing shall ever hurt you. Yet do not rejoice that the spirits submit to you; rejoice rather that your names are written in heaven.'





LATEST NEWS FROM OUR SAFEGUARDING PROMOTERS 06 JULY 2025

The **Promoters of Safeguarding** continue to endorse a culture of safeguarding within the Parish.

This week's article focuses on **Why Elder Financial Abuse should matter to you**.

It can happen to anyone and often starts much younger than you might think.

It hurts people. Beyond financial loss, elder financial abuse often has other serious impacts, including anxiety and depression. This can harm an older person's ability to look after themselves by limiting their access to a safe home, adequate food or medical care.

As Australia's population ages, more and more people are susceptible. It could be happening right now to you or someone you love, but it can be hard to spot until it's too late.

The following groups are at an elevated risk of elder financial abuse

- People who are alone or isolated
- People with a physical or mental disability
- People with a limited understanding of finance due to either language limitations or cultural barriers
- People from LGBTI communities
- People who are reliant on others for their care
- People who have been subject to other types of abuse in the past.
