Boolaroo—Warners Bay and Booragul Parishes
At the time of publication, there are no weekend masses in the parishes of Boolaroo/Warners Bay and Booragul.

<u>Status of Weekend Masses at time of printing</u>. As many would know, Government regulations have allowed Churches to have 50 people present for religious services. However, due to the number of people who normally attend our Masses on a weekend (which thankfully is much more than 50 people!), we are still not able to "open up" for weekend masses. Bishop Bill Wright has continued the dispensation from the obligation to attend weekend Mass to all parishioners.

<u>Status of Weekend Masses from 1st July.</u> Government authorities have indicated that from the 1st July religious services may accommodate 100+ people at their services <u>BUT</u> the 4 square metre rule will apply still. This then means that we can accommodate only the number of people based on the square metre size of our Churches divided by 4. It doesn't quite work out like that, given the actual pews and seats present in the Churches and how they are arranged.

Under the proposed conditions from the 1st July (that is for us, from the weekend of the 4/5 July), we <u>could</u> look at having approximately 60 people present for the 5:30pm Saturday night mass and approximately 110 people present for the Sunday morning and the Sunday evening Masses at Warners Bay. As is understood at this time, everyone who would be present would be required to sign in, note their phone number, have their name(s) ticked off, use sanitiser and be directed to the allocated seating.

Obviously, we would have to have people pre register by email or phone from Tuesday before the following weekend and no later than the Thursday NOON of the following weekend (and subsequently for each weekend after that!!). Pre—registering details are still to be set in concrete eg about giving priority to people who might have tried to register one weekend but were unsuccessful (because seating capacity might have been met) for the following weekend. Sadly too, under these arrangements we couldn't accommodate people who simply "turn up". In normal circumstances we have many more than the numbers mentioned, so it will be very tricky organisationally for a while.

As you might deduce, there is a bit of ruminating going on at the moment and "things" (at all sorts of levels!) might change in the next couple of weeks, <u>so nothing definite</u> is in place at the moment regarding the celebration of Masses on that first weekend of July! Keep a look out on the website for more details as they come.

Return of some Weekday Masses. Due to the fact that normally we do not have 50 people at weekday masses, we have been able to trial a weekday Mass schedule. The first 2 weeks has gone fairly well and there has been some learning about the process! Obviously, a number of conditions apply in reference to Social Distancing, sanitising, taking of names and phone numbers etc. The timetable is:

Tuesday 9:00am at St Michael's Booragul.

Wednesday 9:00am at Our Lady Help of Christians Boolaroo.

Thursday 9:30am at St Mary's Warners Bay.

Those who attend weekday Masses, who are registered volunteers, can assist, in the fulfilling of the conditions, by being monitors.

It is very important to note that all parishioners who are at risk, the elderly, those with compromised health and those who are sick, feeling unwell etc. are encouraged seriously to consider refraining from attending Mass at this time.

If you need to contact Fr. Brian or need him to come and celebrate the Sacrament of the Sick because you or your loved one's health is diminishing, please do so. Just give the office/presbytery a ring. 4958 2031
