Status of Weekend Masses from 1st July. Government authorities have indicated that from the 1st July religious services may accommodate 100+ people at their services <u>BUT</u> the 4 square metre rule still applies. This then means that we can accommodate only the number of people based on the square metre size of our Churches divided by 4. It doesn't quite work out like that, given the actual pews and seats present in the Churches and how they are arranged.

This weekend marks the first weekend we <u>have 'given it a go' at opening for 60 people present</u> for the **5:30pm Saturday night mass** and <u>approximately 110 people present</u> for the Sunday morning and the Sunday evening Masses at Warners Bay. Everyone present will have to have their name and details ticked off, use sanitiser and be directed to allocated seating. Congratulations to those who, after registering during the week, have managed to "score" a seat at this weekend's Masses.

Obviously, a number of conditions apply in reference to social distancing, sanitising, taking of names and phone numbers etc. The timetable is:

Wednesday 9:00am at Our Lady Help of Christians Boolaroo.

Thursday 9:30am at St Mary's Warners Bay.

Those who attend weekday Masses, who are registered volunteers, can assist in the fulfilling of the conditions, by being monitors.

It is very important to note that all parishioners who are at risk, the elderly, those with compromised health and those who are sick, feeling unwell etc. are encouraged seriously to consider refraining from attending Mass at any time at the moment.
