Excerpts from a Decree by Bishop William Wright.

"And so I decree that: A Perpetual Day of Remembrance Sunday, a Feast Day, is to be inscribed into the Diocesan Liturgical Calendar to be held on the Sunday on or prior to the 15th of September. The readings and proper to be used are those prepared from the Lectionary and Missal by the Diocesan Liturgy Council"

This particular law is promulgated by its publication on the diocesan website (CIC83 c. 8). A petition for revocation or emendation of this decree is subject to canons CIC831732-1739, anything to the contrary not withstanding"...Bishop William Wright

Buried in Treasures is designed for people who are overwhelmed by hoarding and possessions and who find it difficult or distressing to discard items. It also helps people who are not able to use the space in their home as they want to, due to excessive clutter. The program is being run by Catholic Healthcare's Hoarding and Squalor team. It is free and consists of weekly two-hour long online group workshops, run over a period of 15 weeks, to enable consistent progress. As part of the course, the Buried in Treasures facilitator also supports participants by providing optional one-on-one home-visits to implement skills and techniques learned in the group session. Buried in Treasures is government-funded under the Commonwealth Home Support Programme (CHSP). To be eligible for CHSP you need to be aged 50+, and have a tendency to accumulate excessive items, or find it difficult to part with them, then this program is for you. You do not need to be formally assessed as having hoarding disorder in order to attend. You need to live in Australia and be eligible for the government's Commonwealth Home Support Programme (CHSP). Staff will assist you with registering for CHSP, if you haven't done so already. For more information on Buried in Treasures or to register visit the website or check out the noticeboard.
