The Catholic Diocese of Maitland-Newcastle and our Parish have an absolute and abiding commitment to promote the safety, welfare and wellbeing of all children.

We pride ourselves in being a welcoming community to children and their families. It is a wonderful blessing to have the children present with us as we worship.

This commitment is particularly to those children who participate in the life of the diocese as part of our faith communities in parishes, young people in our diocesan systemic schools or as part of our community services through CatholicCare.

The agency known as The Office of Safeguarding (formerly Zimmerman Services) provides child protection services for all of the Diocese of Maitland-Newcastle.

The Office of Safeguarding is the 'Responsible Authority' for reporting breaches of the Catholic Church's documents Towards Healing, Integrity in Ministry and Integrity in the Service of the Church.
