

Dear Parish Family,

Being Christian is a hard gig. I often reflect myself the challenges that come with sharing faith and teaching the gospels to others. By our words and the Word, we are to live our lives. There is a strength and integrity about that, and whilst it doesn't always make us friends it does win us much in other places.

Remember the story of Ghandi and his visit to the Christian church near where he went to university, and some well-meaning, maybe misguided members, suggested he would be more comfortable in the church down the road. It is more likely they were reflecting more on what made them feel more comfortable than what made Ghandi.

I acknowledge the difficulty of 'preaching' to our friends and family. I know we don't always feel valued - not everyone has time for that. Not everyone appreciates what we have in faith. Lives are busy and people around us are busy. Sometimes they are too busy for us, too busy for peace and quiet, too busy for God, and certainly too busy for Church. They need us to model for them and to 'be' that for them. Part of our mission if we take Pope Francis at his word is to sometimes use words but mostly let our actions speak for themselves. It has integrity and authenticity when it reflects Christian values.

Never miss an opportunity to say to someone in the busyness of their lives and in particular when they are too busy to do this for themselves, I am praying for you.

When I was first ordained I remember how important that was for me not to be in my home parish. My diocese had a very good policy of appointing the newly ordained as far away from their family of origin as possible. My home in Launceston was a good 2+ hours' drive from the Parish of Corpus Christi in Bellerive, Hobart. The famous Tassie cricket oval was almost next door.

Could you imagine preaching homilies to your mother or brothers or aunties. They know of course all the skeletons apart from other sundry things. It is hard to be a 'convert' per sae in your own home. I had been preaching to my family for years if you listen to my brothers! And they have certainly now heard many homilies, but they are too my biggest and best critics, as well as greatest supports, thankfully.

I say this: your family will really appreciate your prayer, more than they say and at times you least expect. They will really appreciate you remembering them in their difficulties when you pray for them at Mass, and they will really appreciate that you strive to love them unconditionally as God loves you. Sometimes it will cost you and you have to be resilient, remember as Jesus says, 'A prophet is only despised in his own country, among his own relations and in his own house'.

I am on holidays for a couple of weeks from Monday. I'll pray for you, please pray for me. Home on the 1 August.



This year has been designated by Pope Francis as a YEAR OF PRAYER. It is valuable in its own right, and is also in preparation for the 2025 Jubilee Holy Year PILGRIMS OF HOPE. The preparatory document is called *TEACH US TO PRAY* and can be accessed by putting the title in your search engine.

In launching the year in late January 2024, Pope Francis said it would be 'dedicated to rediscovering the great value of and absolute need for prayer in personal life, in the life of the church and in the world.' It includes selections from Pope Francis' general audience talks about prayer and looks specifically at ways to strengthen people's prayer experience at home-for example, by praying before and after meals and at the start and end of the day and in their parishes. The booklet also has suggestions for encouraging teens and young adults to pray and for improving parish-based catechesis on prayer for both children and adults.

1 LATEST NEWS FROM OUR SAFEGUARDING PROMOTERS

The *Promoters of Safeguarding* continue to endorse a culture of safeguarding within the Parish.

This week our focus is on NAIDOC WEEK 2024.

The acronym NAIDOC stands for National Aboriginals' and Islanders' Day Observance Committee. NAIDOC Week honours the culture and achievements of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples.

NAIDOC Week has its roots in the 1938 Day of Mourning, becoming a week-long event in 1975. NAIDOC Week is an annual Australian observance lasting from the first Sunday in July until the following Sunday. Accordingly, Sunday 7 July 2024 until Sunday 14 July 2024 will see NAIDOC celebrations across Australia.

Each year, NAIDOC Week has a unique theme that highlights significant aspects of Indigenous culture and contemporary issues. The 2024 theme is **"Blak, Loud and Proud"** which encapsulates the unapologetic celebration of Indigenous identity, empowering standing tall through heritage and asserting a place in the modern world. This theme calls for a reclamation of narratives, an amplification of voices, and an unwavering commitment to justice and equality.

NAIDOC Week plays a crucial role in promoting reconciliation, fostering a deeper understanding and respect between Indigenous and non-Indigenous Australians, and celebrating the enduring cultures of the world's oldest continuous civilisation.

NAIDOC Week Community Event – Monday 8 July, 9am to 3pm

During NAIDOC Week (7 – 14 July) the Catholic Diocese of Maitland-Newcastle and CatholicCare Social Services Hunter-Manning will be participating in a community event in Newcastle.

Hosted by Awabakal Ltd, the event starts at Civic Park, with a flag raising at 9 am before a united procession to Foreshore Park.






