Dear Parish Family,

"Guess who's coming to dinner!"

One of my old time favourite classic movies is "Guess who's coming to dinner." What makes this a great classic movie is that it challenged the American thinking at the time around colour and race. The story filmed in 1967 is about a white woman introducing her fiancé an African American doctor (Sidney Poitier) to her parents. Of course, the parents strongly disapprove and the conversation around the dinner table is enlightening...if you have never checked out the movie then it's worthwhile watching. The movie won an Oscar and because of this, Poitier was once accepted into an exclusive club. He expressed his disappointment when he found out that the club was not as exclusive as he had first thought. So, he sent his resignation saying, "I don't want to belong to any club that will accept me as a member only because I won an Oscar.'

As we continue towards Jerusalem.... Luke's Gospel speaks about the door policy of the Kingdom of God and how there is no such thing as automatic membership. Someone asks this question.... "Sir, will there be only a few saved?" It seems like a fairly straightforward question about numbers but Jesus answers not with a figure. Now, the expected response would have been, of course all the Israelites, the Jewish people they were the few who would be saved, while the many, Gentiles, tax-collectors, sinners etc would be excluded from a share in the world to come. He knows his listeners were not concerned as much with a head count, as more about whether they were included in the number. Jesus asserts the door policy with these four basic principles: the door is narrow; the door will not remain open indefinitely; membership is universal; and the reversal of the world order. Each principle is intended to alert us to the fact that our words or works. thoughts or decisions, choices or attitudes in this life have eternal consequences.

These principles - the narrow door - the door is wide enough just for you/me but no extra baggage that may be holding us back. The Door is not open indefinitely - living as a Christian is something we must do daily by what we say, by what we do and how we live. Membership is universal - don't be surprised when we get to heaven that amongst those people, there may be Buddhists, Muslims, Hindus, and even atheists. The reversal of the world order – Jesus had that affinity to those who didn't belong to the right crowd – the poor, the widow, the stranger. The Kingdom of God is open to all who hear the word of God and keep it, these are the ones who are coming to dinner!

This is the final week for nominations to the Parish Pastoral Council which finishes after the evening Mass on Sunday 31st August. Thank you to those who have already nominated and to those that have graciously accepted their nomination. Two questions that were asked this week – the number of meetings and the location of the meetings. We may need to hold 2 meetings before the end of the year (to just get started) but then maybe 4 meetings per year. At this stage, I am looking into a common meeting space, hoping to make it an equal distance from any of the parishes. As we continue our nominations for the Parish Pastoral Council, we pray that the Holy Spirit guide us into the future that we may be God's prophetic voice to all.

In just over a week's time (Thursday 4th September) until the end of September, I will be away on annual leave. I am honoured that my family want to take me to Scotland, England and Rome (where I will remember you at the Jubilee events in Rome) for my 60th birthday celebrations. If you need to see me before I go, please let me know...otherwise Frs Raphael and Paul together with Maryanne Barry will be looking after the administration of the parish while I am away.

We continue to remember and keep in prayer our young people preparing to receive Holy Communion for the first time.

First Reading (Isaiah 66: 18-21)

A reading from the prophet Isaiah

The Lord says this: I am coming to gather the nations of every language. They shall come to witness my glory. I will give them a sign and send some of their survivors to the nations: to Tarshish, Put, Lud, Moshech, Rosh, Tubal, and Javan, to the distant islands that have never heard of me or seen my glory. They will proclaim my glory to the nations. As an offering to the Lord they will bring all your brothers, on horses, in chariots, in litters, on mules, on dromedaries, from all the nations to my holy mountain in Jerusalem, says the Lord, like Israelites bringing oblations in clean vessels to the Temple of the Lord. And of some of them I will make priests and Levites, says the Lord.

A reading from the letter to the Hebrews

Have you forgotten that encouraging text in which you are addressed as sons? My son, when the Lord corrects you, do not treat it lightly; but do not get discouraged when he reprimands you. For the Lord trains the ones that he loves and he punishes all those that he acknowledges as his sons. Suffering is part of your training; God is treating you as his sons. Has there ever been any son whose father did not train him? Of course, any punishment is most painful at the time, and far from pleasant; but later, in those on whom it has been used, it bears fruit in peace and goodness. So hold up your limp arms and steady your trembling

knees and smooth out the path you tread; then the injured limb will not be wrenched, it will grow strong again.

I am the way, the truth, and the life, says the Lord; no one comes to the Father, except through me. Alleluia!

Gospel (Luke 13: 22-30)

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Luke

Through towns and villages Jesus went teaching, making his way to Jerusalem. Someone said to him, 'Sir, will there be only a few saved?' He said to them, 'Try your best to enter by the narrow door, because, I tell you, many will try to enter and will not succeed.

'Once the master of the house has got up and locked the door, you may find yourself knocking on the door, saying, "Lord, open to us" but he will answer, "I do not know where you come from." Then you will find yourself saying, "We once ate and drank in your company; you taught in our streets" but he will reply, "I do not know where you come from. Away from me, all you wicked men!"

Then there will be weeping and grinding of teeth, when you see Abraham and Isaac and Jacob and all the prophets in the kingdom of God, and yourselves turned outside. And men from east and west, from north and south, will come to take their places at the feast in the kingdom of God.


Vinnies Winter Appeal

Nominations for Pastoral Council Boolaroo-Booragul-Morisset-Toronto

Nominations are now invited for membership on the Pastoral Council.

Role of the Pastoral Council

The Pastoral Council is not responsible for ordinary Parish administration and is not to involve itself in the ordinary day-to-day running of the Parishes. With the Parish Priest, the Pastoral Council will be responsible for studying and assessing those matters which concern the pastoral works of the Parishes and proposing a Parish Pastoral Plan to direct and facilitate those works.

Membership

The Pastoral Council is truly representative of the whole group of parishes, particularly in terms of localities, age, and gender. The Pastoral Council should collectively have all the skills and talents necessary for the Pastoral Council to fulfil its purpose as expressed above.

Eligibility for membership of the Pastoral Council, a person shall be

- A member of Christ's faithful in full communion with the Catholic Church (cf. c. 512 §1), and
- "Outstanding in firm faith, high moral standards and prudence" (cf. 512 §3), and
- Either has a domicile in the parishes of Our Lady Help of Christians Boolaroo; St Michael the Archangel, Booragul; St John Vianney, Morisset; or St Joseph's Toronto"
- If not resident within the boundaries of the parishes habitually attends Sunday Mass at one of the churches of the parishes.

Election of Members

A total of three (3) parishioners from each parish community elected by their fellow parishioners for a term of three (3) years.

Nominations for candidates for election

- shall be in writing,
- proposed and seconded by two people who are eligible to cast a vote in the election,
- be accepted by the nominee, and
- be lodged with the nomination box in the church by 7pm Sunday 31 August 2025. (*Statutes of the PPC*)

Maryanne Barry / Rosanna Suckling will act as secretaries for the nominations.

LATEST NEWS FROM OUR SAFEGUARDING PROMOTERS 24 AUGUST 2025

The Promoters of Safeguarding continue to endorse a culture of safeguarding within the Parish. This week, your attention is drawn to 'Safe and Savvy: A Guide to Help Older People Avoid Abuse Scams and Fraud.'

Part 1 – Spotting elder financial abuse.

It can happen to all of us.

Why elder financial abuse should matter to you.

- 1. It can happen to anyone (including you) and often starts much younger than you might think.
- 2. It hurts people. Beyond financial loss, elder financial abuse often has other serious impacts, including anxiety and depression. This can harm an older person's ability to look after themselves by limiting their access to a safe home, adequate food or medical care.
- 3. As Australia's population ages, more and more people are susceptible.
- 4. It could be happening right now to you or someone you love, but it can be hard to spot until it's too late.

The following groups are at an elevated risk of elder financial abuse.

- People who are alone or isolated
- People with a physical or mental disability
- People with a limited understanding of finance due to either language limitations or cultural barriers
- People from LGBTI communities
- People who are reliant on others for their care
- People who have been subject to other types of abuse in the past.
