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Dear Parish Family,

"Again the Kingdom of Heaven may be like...."

Over the past three weeks, we have listened to a series of parables that reveal Jesus' teaching about the Kingdom of God. We heard the parable of the Sower, calling us to have open and generous hearts so that we may receive God's word and allow it to shape the way we care for one another. We then reflected on the parable of the weeds among the wheat, reminding us that we live in a world marked by uncertainty, struggle and imperfection, yet we are still called to make a difference through the way we live. Today we come to the final two parables: the hidden treasure and the pearl of great price. These simple yet powerful stories teach us about the Kingdom of God, about who God is, and about who we are called to become. They present us with images of searching, discovering, sacrificing and ultimately finding what is of greatest value.

Here's a question - If God were to say to you, "Ask for anything, and I will give it to you," what would you ask for? A happy family? Good health? Financial security? Happiness? Success? In our first reading, King Solomon was given exactly that opportunity. Feeling young and inadequate for the enormous responsibility of leading God's people, he did not ask for wealth, power or a long life; instead, he asked for wisdom. Solomon desired a heart attuned to God, one that could discern what was right and make decisions for the good of others. Wisdom helps us recognise what truly matters. It also helps us to distinguish what will come and what will go...between what simply attracts us and what genuinely fulfils us. That wisdom leads us directly into today's Gospel.

The first image is that of the hidden treasure. In Jesus' time, it was not unusual for people to bury their valuables to protect them from heavy Roman taxes, war or theft - "rather like hiding money under the mattress". If the owner died, the treasure might remain hidden for years until someone discovered it unexpectedly. The treasure represents the Kingdom of God. It is not something we earn; it is pure gift. God freely offers it to us. Yet we need the wisdom to recognise the gift when it is placed before us and the courage to respond wholeheartedly.

The second image is the pearl. In the ancient world, pearls were often considered even more valuable than gold. Before snorkels etc, pearl divers risked their lives descending into deep waters in search of them. When the merchant finds the one pearl, they gladly sell everything else to possess it. There is another way of seeing this parable. God is like the merchant searching for the precious pearl. That pearl is each one of us. God searches tirelessly for us because we are infinitely precious in his eyes. Even when we might feel lost, forgotten or unworthy, God never gives up seeking us. His love is determined, faithful and unconditional. If that is how God values us, then we are called to value one another in the same way.

So, the question to reflect upon this week is this: What do I treasure most in my life? May we have the wisdom of Solomon to recognise the treasure God places before us, the courage of the merchant to give ourselves wholeheartedly to what truly matters, and hearts that reflect God's own love by sharing that treasure generously with others.

Last Monday evening, several parishioners from the Lakeside Region, Sugarloaf Parish and from across the Diocese, gathered to consider the next step in the implementation of the 'Final Document' for a Synodal Church, entrusted to the Church by Pope Francis, and spurred on by Pope Leo. Being a synodal church, means journeying, listening and discerning together. It emphasises a participatory Church where all the baptised laity, religious and clergy, collaboratively seek the guidance of the Holy Spirit to carry out the Church's mission. This process is being implemented throughout the universal church over the next three years and will help lead and guide us as a diocese to our own Diocesan Synod in the next few years.

First Reading (1 Kings 3:5-7-12)

A reading from the first book of the Kings

The Lord appeared to Solomon in a dream and said, 'Ask what you would like me to give you.' Solomon replied, 'Lord, my God, you have made your servant king in succession to David my father. But I am a very young man, unskilled in leadership. Your servant finds himself in the midst of this people of yours that you have chosen, a people so many its numbers cannot be counted or reckoned. Give your servant a heart to understand how to discern between good and evil, for who could govern this people of yours that is so great?' It pleased the Lord that Solomon should have asked for this. 'Since you have asked for this' the Lord said 'and not asked for long life for yourself or riches or the lives of your enemies, but have asked for a discerning judgement for yourself, here and now I do what you ask. I give you a heart wise and shrewd as none before you has had and none will have after you.'

When it is full, the fishermen haul it ashore; then, sitting down, they collect the good ones in a basket and throw away those that are no use. This is how it will be at the end of time: the angels will appear and separate the wicked from the just to throw them into the blazing furnace where there will be weeping and grinding of teeth.

'Have you understood all this?' They said, 'Yes.' And he said to them, 'Well, then, every scribe who becomes a disciple of the kingdom of heaven is like a householder who brings out from his storeroom things both new and old.'
