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Dear Parish Family,

"You are the Christ...the Son of the Living God."

Last week we left Jesus and the disciples heading to the Gentile side of the lake. They are in Caesarea Philippi north of the Galilee and in modern day Golan Heights. They definitely no longer in Jewish territory, it was actually a significant Gentile centre, associated with Roman power and worship. The name of the city - Caesarea Philippi - has an interesting origin. Twenty years before the birth of Jesus, King Herod the Great built a large temple there to honour Caesar Augustus; and after his death, Herod's son Philip, renamed the city Caesarea Philippi after Caesar and himself. What is more intriguing is that Matthew chose this site, with all these competing voices, he chooses this location for such a significant proclamation of faith.

Looking back over the last few weeks, the disciples have witnessed many things. They had watched the healing and the ridding of unclean spirits; they would have witnessed many come to listen to Jesus speak; they saw the miracle of the five loaves and the two fishes feed over five thousand men (and that didn't include the women and children!); then they saw him walking on the water and calming the storm. Like all teachers know, the best way to understand how much someone has learnt is to set an exam. Firstly, he asks this question to the disciples: **"What are people saying about me?"** In other words, what's on the rumour mill.... probably today we would say what's on Facebook, Tik Tok or Instagram? Their response: **"One of the prophets."**

Jesus' next question goes more to the heart of the matter - **"Who do you say I am?"**. This is the real question. It is one thing to know what other people say about Jesus. It is another thing to make our own response. In typical fashion, when Jesus asks the disciples this question, it is Simon Peter who speaks up first and identifies Jesus as being the Son of the Living God.

Peter is one of the most fascinating characters in the Gospel because he is so human and probably very much like us. In the Gospels we see his ups and downs. Yet Jesus saw something in him from the beginning and called him because he saw potential in him. We all need someone who believes in us, sometimes even before we believe in ourselves. When Peter makes this declaration of faith, Jesus *praises him* and gives him further responsibility. However, the next part is interesting, it definitely shows that Jesus has a sense of humour because the name he gives Peter is like saying *"You are Rocky!"* In Greek petros means Peter and petra is rock.

Do you notice that Jesus speaks then about Peter saying, *"...I will build my Church"*. Not a Roman church or one that is fixed in time and place but one built by Christ, and we are called and challenged to be part of that church today and continuing its work. Every Sunday, as we hear the stories of Jesus. We hear what he said and what he did. We hear about his healing, his compassion, his teaching, his death and resurrection. It challenges us. But eventually the question comes back to us: **"Who do you say that I am?"** May our answer be more than words. May it shape the way we live, the way we treat others, the way we forgive, the way we serve and the way we love. And may we joyfully proclaim, not only with our lips but with our lives: **"You are the Christ, the Son of the living God."**

May our lives, our communities and our Church bear witness to this always.

Gospel Acclamation (Matthew 16:18)

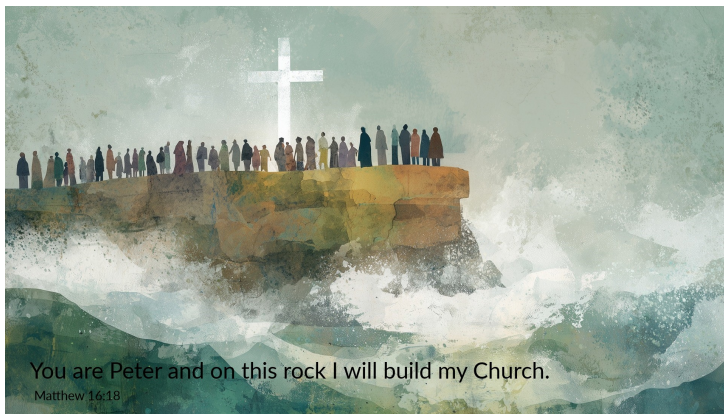

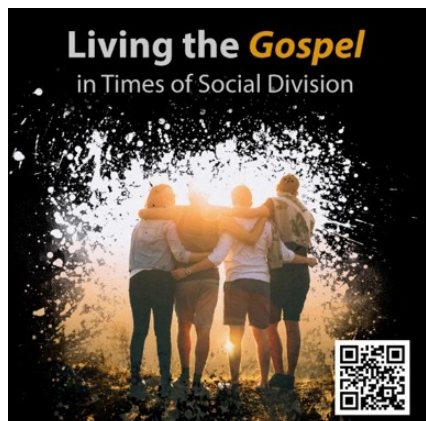


Living the Gospel in Times of Social Division

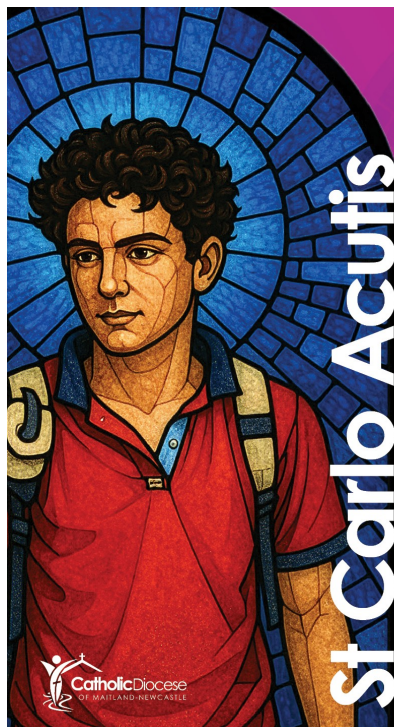

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

Pope Leo XIV is inviting the young Church to join him at the next International World Youth Day in Seoul, South Korea, in August 2027. As part of our ongoing commitment to building ALIVE Catholic Youth, I am delighted to announce that the Diocese of Maitland-Newcastle will lead a pilgrimage to this global celebration of faith and onward to Japan.

World Youth Day offers young people a powerful experience of faith, pilgrimage and community. Through encounters with one another and with Christ, pilgrims are strengthened in their relationship with Jesus and inspired to live the Gospel with renewed purpose.

The theme for this World Youth Day comes from John 16:33: "Take courage! I have overcome the world." These words remind us that Christ has conquered fear, sin and death, calling us to live with hope and confidence in His presence.

I have appointed James Camden, Diocesan Director Mission & Evangelisation and Ryan Gato, Head Religious Education & Spirituality, to lead our team as joint Pilgrimage Co-ordinators. Both have extensive experience in preparing and leading faith-based overseas pilgrimages with young people. Their leadership alongside me ensures that after a ten-year hiatus Year 11 (2027) students of the Diocese will be invited to join our parishioners aged 16-35 for this World Youth Day.

Our itinerary will include visits to significant sites connected to the Korean martyrs and saints, offering pilgrims an opportunity to encounter the story of a Church shaped by faith, sacrifice and perseverance. Following World Youth Day, we will travel to Japan, including Nagasaki and Hiroshima, where pilgrims will gather for prayer, reflection and hope at sites of great historical significance.

I ask each parish and school community over the coming months to consider how they might identify and support two to three young pilgrims to attend WYD27.

Potential pilgrims and their families are invited to attend the launch event with the team and I on Tuesday 8 September. We will welcome a first-class relic of Saint Carlo Acutis to the Diocese (a patron Saint of this World Youth Day) and then provide time for further information, Q&A and an overview of the itinerary from 5:30pm-8pm at Sacred Heart Cathedral, Hamilton and the Diocesan Resource Centre.

I pray that our young people, and those who accompany them on this journey, will be transformed by the lives of Saint Andrew Kim Taegon, Saint Carlo Acutis and other WYD Patron Saints as we prepare for and make this pilgrimage.

Take courage! Come and join us.



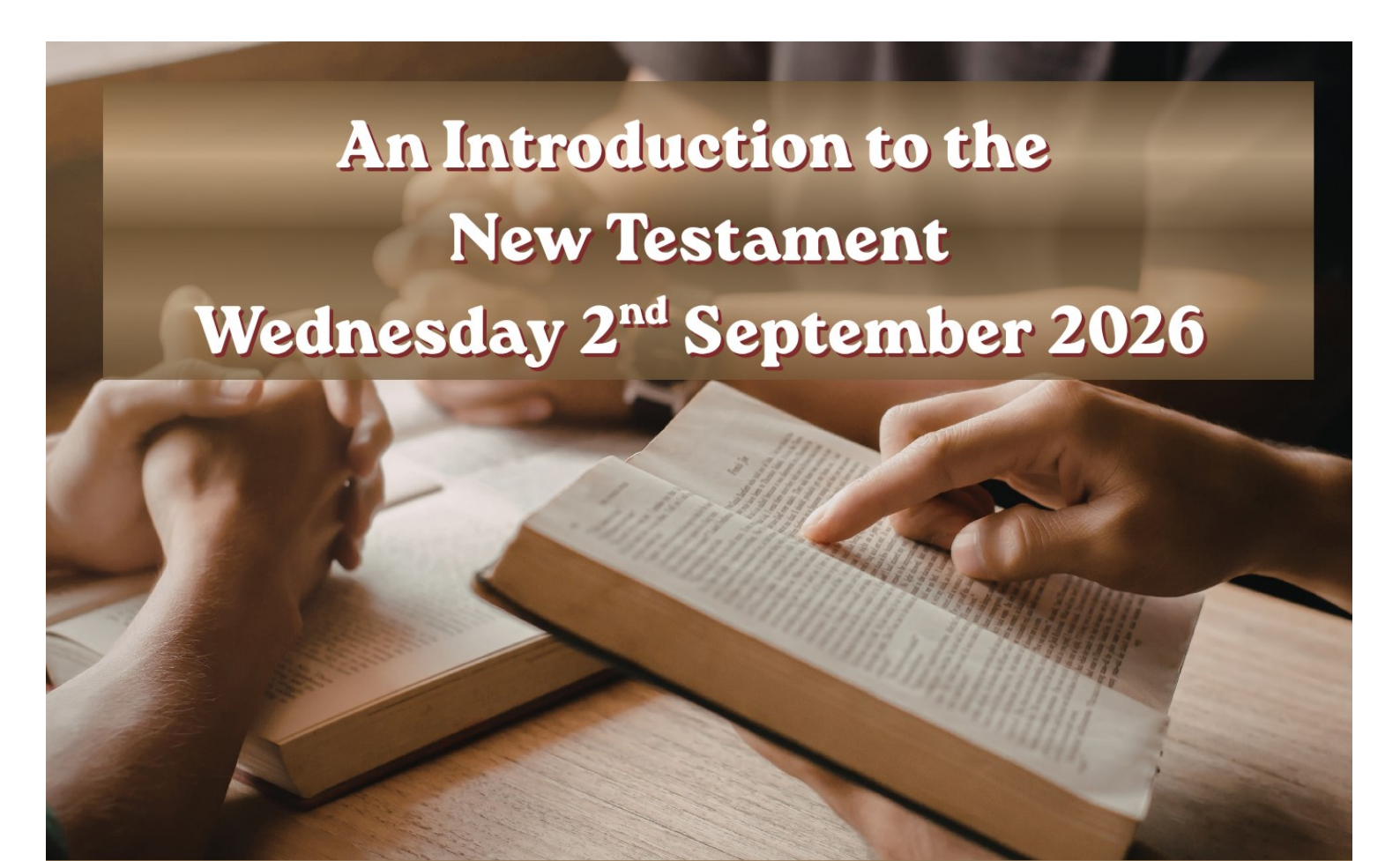
