

2022 Annual Report

The start of the year is often one of anticipation for what lies ahead. At the beginning of 2022, the Board of Directors for Develop Iosco (DI) were excited about what opportunities it could leverage to promote economic development in Iosco County.

What lay ahead was the commissioning of a community stakeholders survey to identify priorities from residents, business owners and community leaders. The survey outcomes drove DI's work throughout the remainder of 2022. Working committees focused on housing, broadband, and countywide tourism were established and provided a model for community engagement. Quarterly community meetings with featured speakers on pressing issues related to economic development topics promoted collaboration and learning amongst county stakeholders.

By the end of the year, DI's efforts coalesced into facilitating funding efforts for childcare and a small business marketplace, serving as the spokesperson for recognizing the economic and environmental impacts of the hydroelectric dams along the AuSable River, and identifying the need to hire a paid staff person to lead the organization. That's a lot of positive impact in 12 short months and we look forward to what 2023 will bring with the increased support across the community.

I hope you will join us as a dues member, committee volunteer, and meeting attendee as we continue to address barriers and improve quality of life for residents, visitors, and employers of our beautiful county.
