In other news we now have three people on island registered to use the Royal Flying Doctor Service medical chest (Elizabeth Rankin, Jane Beatty and Julie Vegter). We have applied for the chest itself and expect to have that operational as soon as it arrives. Another thank you to Paul Mabon for donating the cost of the medical chest. This will give us a completely independent means of responding to anything from a cut to a medical crisis. A registered participant will attend to a patient under the direct guidance of a remote doctor, using the well stocked chest of medical supplies. Once operational you can call the Coochie Bus booking phone 0437 559 046 any time of day or night to arrange help. We'll also need to register the RFDS chest with QAS so they can reach out to us during a 000 call if needed.

On another front we are starting to get the word out to health service providers that there is basically *nothing* on the island at the moment, backed by our recent survey and planning session. It's encouraging to know that the SMBI community partnership service - a group from Metro Health South - are currently building a team who can provide a range of medical and mental health services via home visits to the islands, Coochie included. We also have interest from a physio in providing mobile services, and already have Tina Farrimond helping people work through My Aged Care issues. Attending community hub days on Russell or MacLeay is an invaluable source of contacts and help for us in becoming known and finding services.





2024

The consulting room we're hoping for at the Rec Club is currently on hold until council responds to Rec Club request for that change of use, and we have no clear timeframe for that. Like roadworks, 'expect delays'.

Coming at council from another angle, we have set the goal for 2024 of securing council land and grant funding to establish a space with amenities, kitchen, waiting area and one or two consultation rooms - in the form of 2 or 3 dongas with covered deck between. There are many options for pre-existing or custom made amenities & consultation rooms possible.
