This month, we spent many lazy afternoons in bed (or on the couch or beach) and devoured 13 books! Some were fun, fast reads like *The Oracle Year* by Charles Soule and others were books to sink into and lose time with, like Lisa Taddeo's mind-shattering *Three Women*.



June Reading Recap

13 books in June (46 for the year) including these (mostly nonfiction) favorites:

 Inheritance by Dani Shapiro, where a cavalier decision to take a DNA test throws the

- author's whole life into chaos
- Three Women by Lisa Taddeo, about three women's (very explicit) sexual lives - a book we will all be talking about!
- *The Body Papers* by Grace Talusan, a beautifully written exploration of belonging, survival, and family
- What I Was Doing While You Were Breeding by Kristin Newman, where Newman chronicles her decision to not "relationship up" and instead travel adventurously for a decade
- Nomadland by Jessica Bruder, where Bruder follows workampers and vandwellers across the country in search of employment and fulfillment in a society that's left them behind
- and lastly, Women Talking by Miriam Toews, a graceful and stunning novel about a group of Mennonite women deciding their fates after a vicious betrayal is uncovered in their community


