Henry Ford's Honeymoon House

This past summer, while returning to the Detroit area where my wife Carla and I grew up, we stumbled upon a hidden gem: the Honeymoon House, once owned by none other than Henry Ford. This historical home, steeped in the legacy of one of America's most iconic figures, offered us a glimpse into the past and a chance to connect with our roots in a way we hadn't anticipated.

Ford built this charming one-bedroom house using timber cut and sawed at his own sawmill, showcasing his commitment to craftsmanship and innovation. Nestled in a serene setting, the Honeymoon House was originally intended as a romantic getaway for Henry Ford and his wife, Clara, after their wedding in 1888. The intimate space, complete with rustic charm, reflects a simpler time, inviting visitors to imagine the couple enjoying quiet moments away from the hustle of their lives.

What makes this discovery even more intriguing is the home's location where it was relocated to Garden City, Michigan, directly behind the site of the very first Kmart built in the United States. This juxtaposition of history—between Henry Ford's quaint Honeymoon House and the sprawling retail landscape represented by SS Kresge's First Kmart Store —offers a unique lens through which to view American culture and innovation.

Ford didn't just build a home; he also added a workshop to the Honeymoon House, where he frequently experimented with gasoline engines. This workshop was more than just a space for tinkering; it was the birthplace of innovation that would revolutionize the automotive industry. We imagined Ford surrounded by tools and parts, passionately working on ideas that would ultimately lead to the creation of the Model T and the assembly line.

The juxtaposition of domestic life and groundbreaking invention within the same walls exemplifies Ford's unique approach to life. It highlights his belief that home and work could coexist harmoniously, fostering creativity and progress. Today we are full circle with people working from homes more today. This blend of personal and professional ambition not only shaped his legacy but also influenced countless others in the industry.


MAFCA Presidents Page

November Web Message

Saturday, October 21 MAFCA celebrated its 67th annual anniversary. I went back to the first Restorer newsletter published May/June 1956 for some "current" information about the beginnings

. Originally <u>MAFCA</u> was formed as the Model A Restorers Club of Southern California, with <u>Art Miller</u> as president, and was part of the Model A Restorers Club of West Hartford, Connecticut which was formed in 1952.

Mr. Art Grow gathered 15 members and met on October 1955 to start the process of forming a MARC regional club in Southern California. By late 1956 there were 34 members centered in Southern California.



The 1st Annual Award Dinner was held at Sailee's Restaurant. Located across the street from NBC Burbank, the restaurant was noted for hosting television luminaries and stars.



On October 21, 1957, the MARC SC spun off from MARC and became Model A Ford Club of America.

First mention of the current MAFCA logo is in Nov/Dec 1958. The 3rd Annual Business Meeting lists 1,086 members. With a yeoman's amount of work done between 1956 and 1958,

MAFCA was establishing itself as a stand-alone club with a growing membership. From these 15 members and one chapter, as of December 2024, membership has grown to approximately 10, 550 in the U.S. and 283 Internationally. With 245 Chapters, MAFCA is now the largest car club in the U.S. dedicated to a single model automobile.

On another note, with five open Board of Director positions and only four candidates, there was no voting for the 2024 nominees. Dave Krill, Sherry Winkinhofer, Happy Begg and Will Langford are automatically elected to the board.

They will meet at the National Awards Banquet in early December along with returning Board members Paul Shinn, Ed Tolman, Bill Truesdell and Chet Wojcik, Jr. to be sworn in as MAFCA's 2025 Board of Directors. Once sworn in, this new Board will seek an additional appointee to assume the vacant, ninth director's position. Take a moment and welcome this new Board of Directors to their new positions. I am confident they will work diligently to make 2025 another successful year.

MAFCA once again had a presence at the Hershey Swap Meet in Hershey, PA from October 8 – 10. Office Manager Sandra Aguirre along with myself, Chet Wojick, Jr., Doug & Nan Linden, Kay Lee, Ed & Monica Tolman, Bill & Laura DeVore, Jim Blaszczak, Elaine Bullard and Wayne Champagne led the charge manning the tent and providing daily seminars on relevant Model A topics. Thanks to each of them for making Hershey 2024 a success for MAFCA.

Executive Director of MAFFI, John Marshall and his team of elves have just finished decorating the museum for the holidays. The Parts Department in the museum is looking pretty festive.

Meanwhile outdoors the trusses are up on the expansion. The walls for the expansion are expected to up the week of November 18th --- so long as the weather cooperates.

You can actually watch the construction if you go to maffi.org and click on the Camera icon, and then click on Expansion.

And right around December 23, the back wall of the museum will need to be opened up to connect the existing building and the expansion. This means moving all the displays at the back of the museum and covering all the museum artifacts with plastic. During this phase of the construction, the museum will be closed for safety reasons. 

WALT DISNEY

In 1928 a 26-year-old was traveling by train home from New York to Kansas. During the journey he had an idea that would forever change his life and that of several generations of children and adults forever.

This young artist had been fired from the newspaper he worked for, the Kansas City Star, for a lack of imagination and creativity and, in 1923, at just 22 years old, had declared bankruptcy following the failure of an animation series.

On that train ride, he drew a sketch of a mouse in his notebook and believed that the mouse would have the potential needed to become a success.

He decided to use it in a new technique that was beginning to emerge in new types of movies, which was known as "animation". Until then cartoons were dumb, but he dreamed of turning his mouse into the first sound cartoon in history.

But to do it he needed \$15,000 (current \$1,000,000), so he decided to ask for a credit from his bank, which sent him for a ride... Convinced his idea would work went bank-to-bank, rejection after rejection, until one agreed.

It was the 305th bank I had resorted to. But when he tried to get Metro Goldwin Meyer to distribute his movie about that cute little mouse, he was told it wouldn't work, because a giant mouse would scare women and no one would want to see it.

When he had prepared one of his best films, in 1937, he did a pre-release in front of college students, but half of them left, causing him disappointment. Then he learned they had left because they had to meet the check-in time at his university residence.


That persevering young man was named Walter Elias Disney. The movie that college students left unfinished was Snow White and the Mouse he had drawn on that train he called Mortimer, would end up being known as "Mickey Mouse," a character who would change the world.

Disney created more than 81 movies and some of the most popular animated characters of all time. During his lifetime he received more than 950 recognitions, won 22 Oscars and was awarded 4 honorary awards.

About their "failures," Disney said, "All the adversity, problems and obstacles I've had have made me stronger." "You may not realize it when it happens, but a kick in the teeth may be the best thing to happen to you."

When you want and have Faith in a project well it's worth the risk.



Jim's Technical Tip

by Jim Cannon, MAFCA Technical Director





For many years I had a hard time getting new radiator hoses on the engine to seal well. I would tighten the hose clamps to what I thought was reasonable, and they still seeped a bit of coolant. And years later, when I needed to remove the hoses, they seemed to be glued to the metal parts and I had to pry them off or cut them off.

A Master Mechanic shared his secret with me years ago. Apply a very thin coating of a specialized gasket dressing called "Hylomar AF" to the inside of the new hoses where they will contact the metal just before installing them. Install and rotate each hose back and forth, to spread the sealant out evenly. Now, tighten hose clamps and you are done. It will not seep or leak. And years later when you need to remove the hose, it will come right off!



I get Hylomar AF (Advanced Formulation), originally developed by Rolls Royce for their jet engines, from an industrial supply place near me called W. W. Grainger. It's also available on Amazon and other places on the internet. Compare prices because some places price it like its gold!

There are several variants of
Hylomar. You don't want the original
"Hylomar Universal Blue" or the "Racing Formula". The
Hylomar AF works best for our application. I also put a
little on my oil drain plug threads, on the transmission
and differential drain plugs, etc., to stop the drips. It
gives a good seal but never hardens, so it's easy to
take it apart later.





The International Order of the Rubber Chicken
