Garage Talk -- Radiator Hose Leak

Do you still want to use the original radiator hoses and clamps, but always-chasing leaks? With aftermarket or original radiators, one common problem is leaking at the lower radiator fitting. Several common solutions are using RTV under the hose or making a sleeve from a bicycle inner tube.

Hose Adapters are available in several sizes at many auto parts stores. Napa's Version NBH 901 shown below and is sized for the lower radiator hose for an undersized radiator fitting. The advantage is a solid rubber member with a shoulder "stop" for maintaining position within the outer hose. The original stock hoses and clamps work great with these adapters.

Slip Fit with Adapter



The adapter slides easily inside the stock hose and does not produce an outer bulge. The New Hose ID is now = 1-1/2" (Original Hose ID = 1-3/4").

Hose Assembly Ready to Install



Additional Tip: Use silicon spray on the hose ID and under hose clamps to prevent bunching. The original clamps will bite into the hose and this can cause a leak. Do not use grease since this can affect the rubber.

Jim's Tech Tip

Working with Jack Stands

We frequently put our vehicles up on jack stands, to change the oil, grease the chassis, or adjust the brakes. I have a hard time seeing under the car, to see if I have the two jack stands on an axle set to the same height. I sometimes end up with the car leaning to one side or the other when I get one jack stand set to a different height from the other.

Here's what I've done to help my poor eyes: Use a paint pen and number every other ratchet tooth on each jack stand, so that you can quickly set the pair on an axle to the same height.



Holly has a nice collection of these paint pens in her craft stuff, so I borrowed a white one for a few minutes and added some numbers to the teeth. As you can see, the contrast of the white paint makes them easy to read from a distance. I now quickly get them set where I want them.

Your club has the option of collecting the chapter's ballots and mailing them to MAFCA in one envelope.

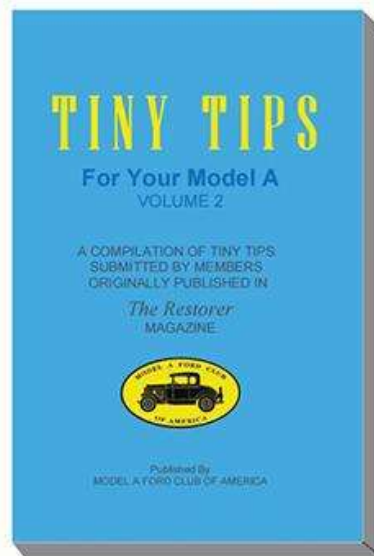

Era Fashion – Quilted Taffeta Hand Bags

During the Model A Era, many women used their sewing skills to make purses and clutches to go with their outfits. Patterns and ideas were often found in magazines such as *Needlecraft* and *Woman's World*. According to an article on page 49 in the February 1929 issue of *Woman's World* magazine, quilted silk taffeta purses were "among the season's smartest contributions to the costume. The chic crispness of their material and their simplicity of design recommend them for general use with street clothes, while their wide range of colors makes it possible to match the daintiest of afternoon and party frocks."

For those of you who are crafty, you might want to try your hand at making a matching purse to go with your next Model A Era outfit. This is what a trio of ladies did in the Rock-Ford A's Model A Club from Rockford, Illinois.

When Nan Stewart of the Rock-Ford A's came across the directions for these bags in the aforementioned article, she excitedly shared her find with fellow club members Chris Aupperle and Alice Whitney. The following pictures are two of the bags that Alice made. When completed, they measure about 9 inches X 10 inches. Chris painted the wooden button closure on her bag to match the fabric.

What follows below are the re-typed directions directly from the article as well as the pattern descriptions:



How Quilted Bags Are Made

The bags sketched are of faille taffeta and measure 8 1/4 X 10 inches when completed. First a layer of sheet wadding is placed on the wrong side of taffeta, then a layer of cotton flannel on the sheet wadding. The three layers of material are worked together and the design is quilted with simple running stitches through all of them. Thread is pulled tight so the material puffs

slightly. See diagram above.

When quilting is completed, [the] ends of bag are joined and handles attached. Each handle is 1 X 18 inches when completed. They are double with a layer of flannel between the padding. Next, tops of front and back of bag are attached to two heavy wire frames already padded and covered with taffeta. [The] bag fastens with a taffeta tab which is sewed to back of [the] bag and wrapped to [the] front. A large round wooden button matching the taffeta trims [the] tab. Finally the lining of any material you may have on hand is slip stitched into purse.

Geometric Flowers: Gray silk taffeta quilted in gray. These square and circular blossoms appear on both sides of bag.

Green Rose: Green silk taffeta quilted with green floss. The large floral motif surrounded by double zigzag lines is placed in the center of the bottom of the bag.

Peony: Red silk taffeta quilted with matching floss. Design of conventional flowers and broken parallel lines is the same on both sides.

Sunburst Design: Navy blue taffeta quilted with matching floss. The four concentric arcs with radiating lines are repeated on the back of bag.

Cosmos: Black silk taffeta quilted in green floss. A large flower with lines radiating from it in all directions appears on both front and back of bag.

Sunflower: Tan taffeta quilted in tan. Design is the same on front and back with the large flowers overlapping at the bottom.

Morning Glory: Rose silk taffeta quilted with rose floss. Conventional flower design is the same on both sides of bag.

The following are quite typical of all 4 years of the model A era.

No. 1402: Ladies' non-breakable pen and pencil set. 14K gold fittings. Red or green with gold marbled effect. Leatherette case.

No. 1405: Combination pen and pencil. When not in use it is carried like a pencil. Pen has gold nib with iridium tip and gold trimmings. Triple action pencil. Guaranteed unbreakable. Mother-of Pearl and black.

Price, postpaid \$2.75



No. 1406: Jumbo size pen and pencil set with pocket clips. 14K gold trimmings. Pen has gold nib and iridium tip. Triple action pencil. Guaranteed for 5 years. Gold and black marbled effect.

Per set, postpaid \$2.95



No. 1408: Ladies' pen and pencil set. Pearl and black; gold trimming. 14K gold nib and iridium tip on pen. Triple action pencil.

Per pair, postpaid \$2.75

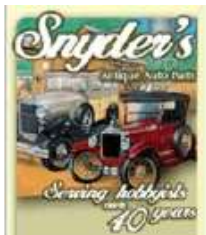

AFTER 43 YEARS LETS LOOK BACK AT SOME PWA CLUB HISTORY

The Following Article, By Gwyn Machacek,
Entitled "CRANKED UP IN 1977",
Was Published In Our
September 1995 & July 2012 Newsletter
By Paul Lewis:

"For several years there was talk between Model A'ers about trying to form a Model A Club North of Houston and in Montgomery County. Four people said, "Let's try". Notices were posted everywhere in the Spring, Woodlands, and Conroe area telling of the first gathering to be held August 9, 1977 at the Gulf State Auditorium in Conroe. Those four people were Keith Jenkins, Buddy Moore, Larry and Gwyn Machacek.

Eight families attended the gathering and they all said, "Let's give this club a try". Officers were selected and then one of the big topics of discussion was what can we call ourselves. Suggestions such as; Conroe A's, Montgomery County Motometers, Piney Wood A's, Big Thicket A's and Rambling A's were suggested. It was suggested that a name would be picked at the September meeting. Everyone then browsed through the display of literature on the Model A that Keith Jenkins and Larry Machacek had set up.

At the second meeting the name Piney Wood Model A Ford Club (Piney Wood A's, for short) was chosen and a Newsletter's name of "The Ford Squeaks" was selected. Moreover, the club grew by 4 new members.

By the end of 1977, the newly formed club had 16 families. They were Bryant Baugus, Donald & Cindy Chrisner, John & Judy Davidson, Monte Fine, Jerry Fisher, Thomas Gilbert, Dick Hand, Keith & Marlene Jenkins, Benny Klekar, Tom & Joan Lowery, Larry & Gwyn Machacek, Donald Mog, Buddy & Sandy Moore, Guy & Betty Nightingate, Harold & Carolyn Smith, and Thomas Wilkerson.

The following year (1978) saw the club becoming a chapter of the Model A Ford Club of America (MAFCA). Years later, in 1983, the club became a region in the Model A Restorers Club (MARC). **"THE REST IS HISTORY."**

At our 35th Anniversary luncheon July 14, 2012, we all receive a souvenir print out of all the Piney Wood A's meeting minutes for 1977. The club today has far surpassed any vision our founding fathers might have had 35 years ago.

We all should be proud of that as we tack on the future years to come and, be very thankful for that meeting held on August 9, 1977 when **"Let's Give This Club A Try"** received enough "Yes" votes.
