Sweetheart Tour to Madisonville, Texas February 8-9









Jake and Sarah Shapira, Jewish Russian immigrants who settled in Madisonville in the 1870s, ran a boarding house here that burned in 1903. When they decided to rebuild, they purchased two kit houses at the 1904 St. Louis World's Fair. The first, a turreted Queen Anne Victorian, now houses the dining room; the second, an Eastlake-style structure, holds the bar. The Shapira's joined the two kit houses with upstairs and downstairs parlors, adding rooms on both floors and verandas on both the front and the back. The kit houses came with plans and all of the necessary hardware, and the Shapira's had the lumber—primarily East Texas longleaf pine—milled in nearby Huntsville. Nearly 200 bluebonnet motifs hand-carved into the plinths above the doors and windows contributed to Texas charm. The rooms were designed to have large windows that opened on both sides to capture cooling breezes from the Texas Heat.

The restaurant is located at the site of the 800-acre Buffalo Springs Ranch, which was established in 1830 by Owen Shannon and his wife Margaret Montgomery. They married in 1792 in Wilkes County, Georgia. They, along with the Montgomery family, moved to Texas in 1820. The Rampy family owned this property and operated a ranch for the last 100 years



The A-Filter has been tested on a 1930 Tudor Sedan for over five years and over 8,000 miles. The original prototype was installed in early 2017. During the test period the bowl and carburetor were periodically inspected. No debris was found in the carburetor bowl and no performance issues were logged. 



Glass bowl diameters vary by manufacture: A-Filter will fit snug against the inside diameter of the glass when installed. If the filter screen is not snug, it can be adjusted outward using your thumb a forefinger to work the outer edge outward 360 degrees.



Original of a Texas Staple - Nachos

The origins of nachos can be traced back to the border town of Piedra Negas, Texas, where the dish was invented in the early 1940s in a frantic effort to please customers. Ignacio A naya, who went by the nickname Nacho, was the maître d'hôtel of the Victory Club when a group of women arrived at the eatery outside of business hours, after the cooks had gone home. Not wanting the customers to leave, A naya ran to the kitchen and gathered up a few ingredients that he had lying around — fried tortilla chips, colby cheese, and jalapeños — which he combined and baked until the cheese melted. The diners loved the concoction and requested seconds, so the restaurant added it to the menu. Capitalizing on the local success of his new snack food,

A naya even went on to open his own restaurant.

It would be an entirely different person who popularized nachos on a national level, however. Frank Liberto took Anaya's concept and changed the delivery process so that the cheese "sauce" didn't need to be refrigerated. Liberto's version of nachos was introduced at a Texas Rangers game in 1976, and today nachos are a staple at sporting arenas across the country.

Handy Roadside Assistance Kit and Miscellaneous Parts - Things to consider

- Fuel Line Kit See below
- · Spare Lug Nuts
- Conical Lug Nut Washers
- Spark Plug Caps especially if you are running Champions (3X, etc.)
- Spare Spark Plug
- Spare Spark Plug Leads
- Gas Cap
- · Spare Points
- Spare Clevis Pins (Standard & Oversize with cotter pins)
- Spare 1/8 Inch NPT vacuum line plug

Fuel Line Emergency Kit

A fuel line kit can be used to transfer gasoline, repair a fuel line, replace a fuel line, etc. Some simple parts can be collected to create a kit without taking up any room. Below is a list of parts:

- **¼ Inch fuel tubing (5 feet)
- Hose Clamps (2 minimum)
- **Hose Barb Fitting 5/16 Inverted Flare to ¼ Inch hose barb. Must have ½-20 UNF straight thread and 45 degree interior angle. Any combination of fittings can work.
- ¼ Inch compression coupling by 1/8 Inch pipe thread used to swage compression sleeves
- ¼ Inch compression sleeves
- ¼ Inch OD brass tubing can be hobby tubing, steel tubing, etc.
- Premade tubing stems with ferrule put in kit to use with fitting.
- Optional Gas Line Fitting A-9243-B (minimum 2)

Note: Do not use the fittings with the break-away or integral ferrule. These may cause damage to the sealing faces of the carburetor, sediment bowl, or fuel valve.

** You may have to substitute your tubing to 5/16 inch ID and 5/16 inch tubing barb based on availability of fittings and cost.



Zenith Carburetor Fuel Port Geometry

Below is the actual fuel port geometry extracted from an original Ford drawing.

Notice the angled sealing face – This is a **135 degree** included angle. Normal drill points are 118 and 135 degrees. Ford wanted to keep it simple.



Model A Carburetor books and literature recommend using a <u>Dremel</u> grinding stone # 911 to redress the port. This will destroy the original sealing geometry.

- This stone has a .433 Inch diameter and a .217 Inch radius.
- The stone will enlarge the drill thru hole and wipe out the angled face and replace it with a radius.

The best solution is to purchase a Dremel stone # 971 and make the following modifications:

- · Trim the Outside diameter down to .455 Inch diameter.
- Reshape the radiused crown surface to a 135 degree included angle.

These modifications will preserve the original shape and not require as much material to be removed during cleanup.




Port after Cleanup - Full Cleanup, Threads untouched.





The International Order of the Rubber Chicken
