



# City of Davison

200 E. FLINT STREET, SUITE 2  
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During construction, it was determined that the existing water main crossing Flint Street at Genesee, Dayton, and Garland Streets has deteriorated and has a significant chance of failing in the future. The city has obtained the necessary construction permit from the State to replace these three sections of the water main as part of the W. Flint Street project. To do this work, a full detour of W. Flint Street between M-15 and Oda Street will be put in place **this week** that:

- Directs the westbound through traffic at M-15 south to Lapeer Road, then west to Irish Road, and then back to the north to Davison Road
- Directs the eastbound through traffic on Davison Road to the south on Irish Road, then east on Lapeer Road and then north on M-15
- W. Flint Street will be barricaded at Oda Street, to allow local eastbound traffic to access both Aloha and Oda Streets
- For local traffic accessing homes or businesses along W. Flint Street, please utilize the following guidance:
  - For homes/businesses between Aloha and Garland Streets, please access W. Flint Street from the west, bypassing the barricades at Oda Street
  - For homes/businesses between Garland and Dayton Streets, please access W. Flint Street from Charles Street when work activities completely close the Garland and Dayton intersections
  - For homes/businesses between Dayton and Genesee Street, please access W. Flint Street from Dayton Street or Genesee Street. These two intersections will not be fully closed at the same time to allow the use of at least one intersection for local access.
- **For all businesses with access off Garland, Dayton or Genesee Streets, we recommend you inform your customers to use those entrances while the detour is in effect.**

The timeline for the detour route will depend on factors such as the time necessary to obtain passing tests on the new water main and the weather. Once the water main work is complete, the milling and paving of this section of W. Flint Street will also be completed with the detour in place. Currently, we anticipate the detour will be in place for 3-4 weeks.
