will contribute to accelerating the transformative change needed to reach global net-zero<sup>1</sup> greenhouse gas (GHG) emissions by 2050 or earlier through its commitment to the Climate Neutral Now initiative.

Therefore, our organization will undertake the following immediate actions:

1. Quantify (measure) our greenhouse gas emissions;
2. Plan and immediately implement actions to reduce those emissions;
3. Consider contributing to further global emission reductions and sustainable development through the use of credible carbon credits<sup>2</sup>.

We will also communicate our efforts to contribute to achieving global climate neutrality and our participation in Climate Neutral Now, and advocate for similar action by others in our networks.

<sup>1</sup> Net zero is understood as an equilibrium between human induced GHG emissions and permanent removals from the atmosphere. Carbon neutrality is understood as a balance between GHG emissions, reductions and offsetting through credible carbon credits. Carbon neutrality is an intermediate, temporary step in the journey to achieve net zero. Note that offsetting does not replace the need to reduce emissions in parallel.

<sup>2</sup> Credible carbon credits are those issued under standards that have robust requirements to ensure additionality, permanence, independency, transparency, and inclusivity. There must also be a robust tracking system to avoid double counting.
