America's 11 Most Endangered Historic Places for 2025 prove 'preservation is about creating something new'

An update to the important annual list of the country's 11 <u>Most Endangered Historic Places</u> for 2025 has been <u>announced</u> by the <u>National Trust for Historic Preservation</u>.

The new list features historic buildings from Michigan, Arizona, Oregon, Texas, Los Angeles, and New York. As a group, they remind us of the rich diversity of this country, the contributions of immigrant communities, and the struggles of Indigenous tribes and other marginalized groups to protect their respective cultures from erasure.
