

MESSAGE FROM THE GOVERNOR


To the Society of Filipino Foresters,



BECOMING AN SFFI MEMBER

Article II, sections 2 and 3 of the Society of Filipino Foresters, Inc., elaborates the membership classifications of the SFFI as well as the nature of admission, to wit

Classification and Qualification of Member

Regular Member - A regular member is a natural person, Citizen of the Republic of the Philippines, and a Registered Professional Forester pursuant to Republic Act No. 6239.

Life Member - A life member is a regular member who is elevated to be a life member by paying the prescribed one-time dues or fees thereof provided.

Fellow - A fellow is a regular member and/or life member who has achieved outstanding accomplishment in any field of forestry worthy of national or international recognition and, for such reason, has also enhanced the prestige of the Society.

Honorary Member - An honorary member is a natural person not qualified for admission as a regular member but has consistently represented the interests anc objectives of the Society, or has achieved national or international recognition as an advocate of forest conservation; or by reason of exceptional knowledge, background, or training, is capable and willing to lend support to the Society.

Sustaining or Subscribing Member - A sustaining or subscribing member is a juridical person who fully subscribes to the objectives of the Society and/or supports the Society by way of money, goods, and/or service contributions.



BECOMING AN SFFI MEMBER

Admission - A candidate may be admitted as a regular member either by direct application, by recommendation of the Board of Examiners for Foresters, or by invitation of the Society.

Regular Member - A candidate may be admitted as a regular member either by direct application, by recommendation of the Board of Examiners for Foresters, or by invitation of the Society.

Life Member - A candidate, who is regular member, may opt to be a life member by paying the prescribed dues or fees thereof.

Fellow - A candidate, who is regular or life member, may be elevated to the status of a fellow by meeting certain conditions or criteria set by the Society therefor and by the affirmative vote of at least two-thirds (2/3) of the members of the National Council.

Honorary Member - A candidate may be admitted to become an honorary member by recommendation of the Executive Committee and affirmative vote of a least two-thirds (2/3) of the members of the National Council.

Sustaining or Subscribing Member - A candidate may become a sustaining or subscribing member upon invitation by the Society.

Other provisions pertaining to membership are contained in sections 4 to 6 of the Bylaws.

SUGGESTED TOUR SITES

Initao-Libertad Protected Landscape and Seascape Initao, Misamis Oriental

An initial component of National Integrated Protected Areas System (NIPAS) and became a legislated Protected Area on June 22, 2018 composing 921.02 hectares. This protected area is forest over limestone and it features century old trees, caves and known habitat of Philippine Tarsier (*Tarsius syrichta*) and one of the diving sites.

The forest or landscape area bisected by the national highway and its seascape area is one of the diving sites in Northern Mindanao and part of Iligan Bay. This protected area is managed by the Protected Area Management Board (PAMB) and has a functional fees system.

From Cagayan de Oro City, it is 50 kilometers and can be reached through Public Utility Bus at a regular fare of P115.00 through the Westbound Bus Terminal at Bulua, Cagayan de Oro City. From the Limketkai Center, taxis are available going to the terminal at more or less P200.00 fare.

Carbon Sink Project at E. Pelaez Ranch (IFMA No, IFMA-R10-95-001)

This reforestation project, initiated by STEAG Power Inc. in partnership with E. Pelaez Ranch (holder of IFMA-R10-95-001), is located in the upland area of Malasag Heights, Cugman, Cagayan de Oro City. The initiative aligns with global climate mitigation efforts, focusing on reforestation and carbon sequestration. Launched in 2005 and continuing through 2023, the project has successfully reforested a total of 393.73 hectares, with a diverse mix of species including Narra, Malibato, Kalumata, and Kalumpit.

This area is part of a scenic section of the city, home to the 200-year-old Dao heritage tree (*Dracontomelon dao*). It is located near the Cugman-Catanico Protected Landscape and the Malasag Ecovillage, a facility managed by the Philippine Tourism Authority.

It can be reach by way of public transport or taxi. From Limketkai Center, Cugman bound jeepneys are plying their route to crossing Malasag Highway at a minimum fare of Php17.00. From crossing malasag, motorcycle for hire are available at a fare of Php150.00.

TUBAJON COASTAL ENVIRONMENT PROJECT (CEP) Tubajon, Laguindingan, Misamis Oriental

The Tubajon CEP is one (1) of the nine (9) pilot CEP sites established by the Department of Environment and Natural Resources – 10 located in the Municipality of Laguindingan, Misamis Oriental. The site is one of the vegetated coastal areas visible during take off and landing of the planes at Laguindingan International Airport that features significant mangrove reforestation milestone of 50 hectares during the 1990's implementation of the CEP pursuant to DAO No. 19, series of 1993. Both of these project milestones reflect the Coastal Resources Management strategies being adopted by the concerned Municipal and Barangay Local Government Units in collaboration with the project beneficiaries and People's Organization therein which is the Tubajon Coastal Dwellers Association Incorporated.

The project site can be reached through Public Utility Vehicles (Bus, Van, Taxi, Tricab, and Single Motor) within 45-50 minutes away from the Cagayan de Oro City proper at a minimum total fare of Php200.00. The visitors are advised to observe/comply with the local ordinances in Tubajon. Each visitor will be collected with an Environmental fee (Php 30.00) upon entering the Barangay Tubajon and an Entrance Fee (Php 30.00) upon entering the Tubajon Aquamarine Mangrove Park. The fees collected by the LGU will be used for the sustainable maintenance and management of the project.




