Fall and New Beginnings at Zion

Here at Zion this Fall, the retirement of Pastor Bruce, your faithful pastor and servant of God's Word for 38 years, it is a time of evening and ending, but it is also morning and new beginnings. What else can be said then? ...Only this: "Well done, good and faithful servant!"

God's word in Jesus Christ, the beginning and the end, is always the truth of Holy Baptism. Both death and resurrection, in that order! Romans 6 reminds us now that Zion Lutheran Church has a "new year"—"Do you not know that all of us who have been baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into his death? We were buried therefore with him by baptism into death, in order that, just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, we too might walk in newness of life."



DCE Message

"And we know that for those who love God all things work together for good, for those who are called according to His purpose." Romans 8:28

It's no secret that we have been going through tough times, and depending on your perspective and experience, it might be difficult to know what, or when, I'm exactly talking about. The news has stories of people hungry, sick, and dying all over the world, and even in our own country top experts can't agree on what to do about a variety of issues.

Here at home, within the walls of Zion Lutheran Church, maybe your worries are a little more focused around a pastoral vacancy and the suspension of the vicarage program. Maybe you worry about your favorite service disappearing on a weekly basis, maybe you worry about the study that a pastor or vicar used to teach, our maybe you worry about a special event planned for the future, and you don't know who will be available to officiate. At times like these we might be tempted to shout to the sky and ask, "When are things ever going to get better!?!"

When we struggle, as individuals, communities, nations, and even congregations, we might sometimes feel like we struggle alone. "We're living through the worst times," you might say, and we might even believe that no one has gone through what you or I are currently going through. Hate to break it to you, as long as sin has existed in the world, there have been people who have been struggling, and although we live in unique times, we do not hold the patent on living through hard times. Every generation has struggled, and yet every generation has endured.

None of us probably readily remembers the last pastoral vacancy, the benefit of having the same pastor for over 35 years, and although I wasn't here at the time, I can guarantee that the congregation of those days survived the experience. How can I be so sure? Simple, Zion Lutheran Church is still here to this day. Did those people struggle? Absolutely! Did difficult changes have to be made to adapt to the situation? Without a doubt! Was God still good, and did God still hold that situation in His hands? Most certainly!

In the midst of a struggle, I think our sinful nature tries to overshadow our faith with doubt, so we can't see the light at the end of the tunnel. We are so lost in our grief, shame, and fear that we don't know which way is up, and yet God is still working. Maybe you have heard the saying, "Sometimes the only way out is through." For Christians, those called to faith through the work of the Holy Spirit, I would maybe take that a step further and say, "The only way out is always through God."

God is still in control, and although we don't always see that, it doesn't make it any less true. We continue to struggle, but guess what, Jesus warned us ahead of time that would be the case. He also said, "I have said these things to you, that in Me you may have peace. In the world you will have tribulation. But take heart; I have overcome the world." (John 16:33) Jesus has already conquered our greatest enemies, and in that truth, believers can find joy and peace. That doesn't mean life will suddenly get easy for us, but it does mean, with the help of God, we can continue to work through it.

We are going through tough times. There is no doubt about that, but the good news is that God already knows how He is going to work these things out. God is already working for our ultimate good, and guess what, He is bringing all of us along for the ride. I don't know how everything is going to come together in the end.

I don't know how long it will take for our current struggles to get better, and yet because God does, I can, with the help of the Holy Spirit, take up my load and serve with peace and joy. For all of us, I do think God has called us together to serve within this congregation for a purpose, and in this time of unique change, I hope you see this as an opportunity for God to do a new and amazing thing at Zion Lutheran Church and for you to serve, not begrudgingly or in servitude, with joy and peace.

Greeting Cards

The youth group has recently restocked our large variety of available cards in the church office, so if you have been waiting to buy your cards from us, the wait can be officially over! We have also started to supply a greater selection of birthday cards for all ages, so hopefully everyone will be able to find the right box of cards for their needs. If anyone needs cards in the next several weeks, or months, payment can be placed in the lockbox on the card assortment shelf. Checks can be made payable to "Zion Youth."

Acolyting and Ushering

All 7th and 8th grade Confirmation students are needed for another year of service during Sunday morning church services as we work to feature acolytes each week. During our pastoral vacancy, we have recently gone down to just one church service a week, taking place on Sunday mornings at 9:00AM, so only two individuals will be needed on these mornings. We are also opening up the possibility to assist with the slides for one individual each week if you would prefer to work behind the scenes. With that, we have recently begun a selfscheduling initiative wherein which families are able to look through all possible dates within a three month period and then sign up for the date, and the service opportunity, that works best for them. At this time of reduced services, families only need sign up for one week within a three month period, and if any dates are not filled, we fill then randomly assign any unassigned students to cover those dates. As always, the church will not facilitate trades and switches, so if families find that a week does not work for them after signing up, they should work with other families to get that week covered. The next sign up period will open on September 11th, families will have until the end of the month to sign up, and then the next schedule, with all assignments included, will be sent out in early October. If we do not have your current information, please take some time to update your email address, phone number, and mailing address with our church secretary as these are the primary ways in which we contact families.

In addition, if any newly confirmed, or previously confirmed, youth students would be willing to assist during church services on Sunday mornings, please call 402-329-4313 to let the church office know.

We are currently looking for both ushers and technology booth assistance, and training will be provided for anyone willing to serve in either capacity. For youth students currently assisting, the usher schedule will also be self-scheduled, and the new sign up will also open on September 11th

For those who have not had experience with the LCMS Youth Gathering, previously the National Youth Gath-



ering, in the past, this is an event held every three years by the youth department of the LCMS for the purposes of bringing youth from all over the country together to learn, cooperate, communicate, develop leadership skills, engage in fellowship, give back, and grow in their Christian walk with other high school age youth students. When this event took place, something like 20,000 youth students and their Adult Leaders traveled to the selected host city, New Or-

leans, LA, and spent a week journeying through what can only be described as a true mountaintop experience focused on the theme of ENDURE.

To say we had a great time would be too much of an understatement because I really do see this trip as a life changing opportunity. To give just a brief summary of the trip, although we began with a few travel complications on the way down, of which you have likely heard already, we all did make it to New Orleans in one piece, and we were determined to get the most out of this trip beginning on the second day. The first few days after arriving were spent mainly sightseeing and taking in various tourist attractions, including a swamp tour and a trip to the Audubon Zoo, Aquarium, and Insectarium.

On Saturday night the official Gathering festivities began with a bang as we attended our Nebraska District event, participated in a second line parade to the Caesars Superdome, and worshipped during our first Mass Event. This, of course, was just the beginning, and Sunday, Monday, and Tuesday were all about studies and sessions at the convention center.

Here we got to hear from a variety of amazing speakers and teachers from all over the world as they described and walked through a variety of topics including saying no, learning to forgive yourself, growing your church young, and talking to parents. I am always a little surprised, in the best way, when the students say that some of their best memories of any Gathering are the awesome speakers and not the tourist attractions.

On Saturday, Sunday, Monday, and Tuesday, each night of these days ended with a Mass Event where students were able to join together in song, worship, study, devotion, and fellowship together with all of the Gathering participants in the Superdome. These were truly an awe inspiring sight as 20,000 individuals joined together to praise our living and reigning Savior, Jesus Christ. I truly love how the attending participants will often take out their phone on slow songs, turn on the flashlight, a wave their phone in rhythm with all of the other people who have



joined together to attend this event. In these quiet moments simply illuminated by just phone lights, you can really see how large the Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod really is. We were also treated to two Mass Event Plus concerts where in which the two big acts, FLAME and Rend Collective, put on a great show. We ended each night of our trip, barring the first night, with a devotion where we discussed a variety of big topics like working through struggles, forgiving, and serving during the valley times of our life.

The Gathering week concluded with a traditional Divine Service on Wednesday morning where all 20,000 participants, as they were able, were offered the opportunity to take communion with their fellow LCMS Lutherans. The current president of the Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod, Pastor Matthew Harrison, gave the sermon for the service, and many other pastors from across the nation and world assisted with the service and communion. Although not everyone prefers traditional worship, I do think everyone must admit how wonderful it is to worship with their fellow Christian brothers and sisters in this way. Following the service, we ate lunch, took in some shopping, and concluded the night with a final devotion.

We finished the trip on Thursday with one more amazing meal in New Orleans before gathering our things, heading for the airport, and traveling back to Pierce. Everyone arrived back home safe, tired, and hopefully changed from the experience as we all prepared to return back to the day to day. This, for those who don't know, wasn't the end of the Gathering story, though. Upon coming back we planned a youth lead service and a thank you breakfast to share our experiences with the congregation and thank everyone for supporting us over the past few years. Both took place on Sunday, August 17th, and from everything we heard, the youth did a fantastic job on this morning. During the breakfast everyone was able to share a little bit about the trip and what they especially loved, and although we definitely heard responses raving about the awesome food we enjoyed, a true highlight of the trip, we also heard many responses from students appreciating the great messages that are still sticking with them even now.
