

I once again must express my gratitude for the opportunities for practical experiences available to me ever after several months as Vicar at Zion. ### DCE Message

"Ask, and it will be given to you; seek, and you will find; knock, and it will be opened to you. For everyone who asks receives, and the one who seeks finds, and to the one who knocks it will be opened. Or which one of you, if his son asks him for bread, will give him a stone? Or if he asks for a fish, will give him a serpent? If you then, who are evil, know how to give good gifts to your children, how much more will your Father who is in heaven give good things to those who ask him!"

(Matthew 7:7-11)

I feel like I have been telling the same story, or group of stories, a lot lately. I mean, I already do that quite often. Unfortunately, I tend to tell the same stories to the same people because I share certain stories so religiously that I often forget who I have already told, so I just end up telling the same things to the same people again. For that reason, I am going to share this account to everyone, all at once, so then I know everyone has heard it. Don't worry, though, because it is relevant to my point. I promise.

When I was serving at a previous church, the youth group was supposed to hold a car wash in the afternoon, but the forecast, at least in the days leading up to the event, predicted rain. Even on the morning of the event, a Sunday, the sky was very overcast and gray looking. I remember the youth students came to Sunday School class that morning, and they were very worried that the event, and the youth activities for that evening, were going to get rained out. Seeing their concern, I told the students we should pray about the situation. I told the students we should pray it didn't rain during the car wash or during the youth activities for the evening, which involved water games, but then once all of the outdoor activities were finished for the day, lets say at about 9:00PM, then it could turn into a complete downpour, as the students informed me that we really did need the rain. After crafting our prayer, we lifted up our concerns to God and then continued with the rest of class.

The day continued, and even though the afternoon and evening continued to look overcast and gray, it never did rain throughout the entirety of both events. That evening, I said goodbye to the youth students as they all got into their vehicles to head home, and I stayed to clean up the rest of the supplies from the meeting. As I was outside cleaning, though, it did, in fact, began to rain at what must have been approximately 9:00PM, I kid you not.

While we were at Camp Luther for our youth retreat this past month, the forecast consistently predicted rain and inclement weather, and so I told the students this story. I encouraged them, in the midst of the panic, to lift their concerns up to the God who could do something to help. Some of them did, although I doubt they thought it would make much difference. You know what, though, there were several times where it didn't rain while we were outside, but then once we returned to the building for an indoor activity, it would then begin to pour.

To anyone else these would just simply seem like absolutely amazing coincidences, and yet I don't believe in absolutely amazing coincidences. I do, on the other hand, believe in an absolutely amazing God.

I think one of our problems in our world today is that Christians, people who say they believe in an absolutely amazing God, don't believe God is actually still amazing. We say God created the whole world, but sometimes I think we doubt that God is actually still powerful. We read about the miracles Jesus performed in the Bible, but sometimes I think we doubt that God actually still performs miracles in our world today. We tell people to pray, but sometimes I think we doubt that God actually listens, cares, or can do anything to help when we ourselves pray. We doubt and limit God instead of praying without ceasing.

Now, with that in mind, we are always careful to say that God is not a magic genie who grants our every wish just because we want something, and I hope my two stories from above do not give you that impression. No, in the midst of our concerns and struggles we always ultimately pray that God 's Will will be done, and churches are filled with people who can just as easily tell a story where a prayer seemingly went unanswered. We teach, simply put, that God answers prayers in one of three ways, yes, no, or not right now, and it can be hard to understand why something so important to us can go unheeded. This might drive us to give up on praying entirely, much to our detriment.

You see, in the midst of our anguish and doubt, we must always keep in mind that we are not God, and that our ways are not God's ways. Maybe, just maybe, the prayers we are praying, the prayers we think to be so big, are actually shortsighted. Maybe God, in His loving care, has already seen the concern of our hearts and has worked out a solution, an answer to our prayers, that is so much greater then we could have ever possibly imagined. Maybe God is, in fact, amazing, powerful, miraculous, and caring. Could you believe it?

I believe He is, and that is why I believe we need to keep asking, keep seeking, and keep knocking. We need to keep praying. After all, we miss one-hundred percent of the shots we never take.
