Continuing to Make A Grateful and Joyful Noise All Year Long

One goal of Zion Lutheran School for our students is to make disciples for life, which fits in well with Proverbs 22:6 to train up a child. Part of this discipleship is being thankful for what God has given us. This past month we have been working on being grateful and generous in realizing the gifts God has blessed us with.

It seems that we spend a lot of time trying to acquire things- especially as we think about the upcoming Christmas season. From an early age, we ask children what they want for their birthday. We also ask what kind of elaborate themed birthday party we can throw them. Then of course, there is Christmas! The request lists we ask kids and other family members to provide can get quite lengthy. There is also the convenience of online shopping, which makes it very easy to "click" our way to a variety of purchases. What a blessing it is, however, to be able to grant Christmas and birthday wishes for our children. What a blessing it is to be able to give both needed and special request items to family and friends. We have an abundant God who blesses His people beyond measure, and in turn allows us to be a blessing to others through our generosity.

Every November, we pause for a National Day of Thanksgiving in our country, and rightfully so — for we are blessed with many freedoms, and we enjoy liberties that other countries and cultures do not experience. We will begin our Thanksgiving break with a 12 pm dismissal on Wednesday, November 26th. Our second graders will hold a special chapel on Wednesday, November 19th.

For a believer, it is a natural response to "give thanks to God" for all His goodness to us. We continue to make a joyful noise in response to His gifts.

As parents, we are quick to teach our young children to say, "thank you," when they are given a gift or experience a special surprise. We hope that if a child learns to express gratefulness at an early age and that it will become a lifelong habit.

When we are fortunate to be on the receiving end of a gift, there is always someone on the other end doing the giving. When you are a child, it is often a parent or other family member doing the giving. As one grows older, it might be a friend or significant other who becomes a giver of gifts. DCE Message

"... but God shows His love for us in that while we were still sinners, Christ died for us."

Romans 5:8

We recently took a group of 17 people, 14 youth students 6th through 8th grades and 3 adult leaders, to Kearney, NE for the Nebraska District Middle School Youth Gathering, and our theme verse, the verse we worked to consider for the two days of the event, was the one listed above. With that in mind, I thought we could all, as a congregation, work to consider this verse, as well. I'm never one to leave anyone out, and maybe if we're all a little bit on the same page, it will make it easier to discuss this trip with the individuals who attended in the future.

That said, as we worked to dive deeper into this verse, our discussions primarily centered on the theme of SHOW. What do we show people? How do we show up? Why do we show off? Why do we hide ourselves and resist showing people certain things? These questions, and more, were points of conversation for the 700 participants at this event, and now I pose them to you. What do you show people, and why do you choose to show them those things?

In our sins, it can be easy to want to hide parts of ourselves. We all have secret shames, desires, and thoughts that we would never want to see the light of day. We keep parts of our personalities a secret because we fear no one would love us if they knew how broken we truly are. Like Adam and Eve in the garden, we even try to hide ourselves from God by avoiding worship and rationalizing that if we don't do it in God's house, maybe He won't be aware that we're doing anything wrong at all. This, of course, could not be farther from the truth.

You see, it is impossible to hide from an all knowing, all powerful, and infinitely present God. God knows us down to the very number of hairs on our heads which means He also knows our every thought, desire, and action, depraved and otherwise. In our sin, this is a very scary thought to be known this intimately, but when we consider these things in the light of the verse above, with the help of the Holy Spirit, it can maybe be quite freeing instead.

Think about this, God already knew every sin you would ever commit, and yet Jesus still died on the cross for you. In Christ Jesus, God adopted us as His dearly beloved children through the waters of Baptism, and now our identify in Christ says that we are lovable because He loved us. Through the work of the Holy Spirit, our God given faith consistently uncovers and shows us that Jesus is better than we could ever hope or imagine, and although we certainly do not deserve it, God generously pours out His gifts on us. What reason could we have to hide!?!

Unfortunately, people still do. Instead of coming to church to confess their sins in faith, receive forgiveness, and stand in fellowship with those who seek to encourage and support them, they continue to hide away in the darkness. We might feel sorry for them as we consider ourselves far from them, yet sometimes we allow our own gifts to languish in the dark.

Of course, every good Confirmation student knows that we do not do works to save ourselves because none of our works can ever accomplish what God has already done in Christ Jesus. As Jesus fully and totally completed the work of salvation on the cross, we have nothing we need to do, and yet God still calls us to serve Him and our neighbor. Why? Because that's how we can show the love of Jesus to others. Although we do not hope to shine on our own, we reflect that great love that was first shown to us into the lives of other people. This is a response to the gifts we have received. Simply put, we show grace, mercy, and compassion because God first showed us grace, mercy, and compassion. We show up because God first showed up for us.

All said, we have been given abundantly more than we could ever hope to understand through Jesus, and now God has called us by the Gospel to show everyone how great of a Savior we have.

Speaking of events, we have several planned for the near future. First will be our Fusion Youth Group meeting for 7th through 12th graders planned to take place every month, usually the second or third Sunday of the month, usually from 5PM to 7PM at Zion Lutheran Church.

Second will be an additional planned youth activity for 7th though 12th grade students to take place each month either here at Zion or at another destination, depending on the activity. As these types of events have differing schedules and time frames depending on what we are doing, and where we will be going, please make sure you are checking the weekly church bulletin, receiving our messages, and checking the website regularly. Third, we have a variety of planned fundraisers throughout the year as we continue to fundraise for our various initiatives. We would love to have your help!

As always, we would highly encourage everyone to regularly review our more consistent means of communication, namely weekly church announcements, our church Facebook page, emails, text messages, and our church website. If, for some reason, you are unable to receive updates presently, please let us know, so we can work to correct this issue.

With all that said, here is a brief recap of a few unique events and fundraisers from the past few months. For starters, in the month of August, the students who attended the LCMS Youth Gathering oversaw the church service on Sunday, August 17th, and then they provided a breakfast for the congregation as an opportunity to share their experiences from the trip. In September, the youth students gathered together to help paint and decorate the new youth room, which was formerly the Zion school 5th/6th grade room, and in October we held a movie event for both families and the youth students. This was a very fun opportunity for our students to gather with other youth groups from around the state of Nebraska to focus on the theme of SHOW. Also in the month of November, St. John's Lutheran Church and Zion Lutheran Church are planning to hold a combined fall youth event for youth students from both churches with games, food, a devotion, and plenty of time for fellowship.

In terms of fundraisers, during the months of September and October, we worked to sell discount cards for many local area businesses. As always, I would like to thank the youth who work hard to manage each of these events, and the parents who give of their time and money to make these events work so smoothly. We would also like to thank this congregation for their generosity in supporting the youth programs of this church.

We, of course, fundraise with a purpose. Our main goal for this year is to continue to hold a variety of fun and enriching events and initiatives for our various youth students, such as the recent Middle School Youth Gathering, so that all students can have an opportunity to have fun and dive deeper in their faith journey. As before, we continue to set aside money for the LCMS Youth Gathering because even though we just returned from this trip this past summer, another Gathering is always right around the corner.

Again, all of these types of events are in addition to our monthly Fusion Youth Group meetings in which we typically gather as a group, share a meal, discuss a Bible Study lesson, plan future youth initiatives, and have fun through fellowship activities. To round out our program offerings for youth, Sunday School classes are taking place currently for any youth students who would like to continue our study and discussion of the Bible on Sunday mornings. Anyone in 7th through 12th grade is welcome!

Finally, if any confirmed youth would be interested in serving as an usher, or assisting in the sound booth, during this next year, please speak to Mr. Jareske in the near future, so we can get your name on our list of volunteers. Although the sun goes down early each evening, the future is bright at Zion Lutheran Church!

Acolyting and Ushering

All 7th and 8th grade Confirmation students are needed for another year of service during Sunday morning church services as we work to feature acolytes each week. During our pastoral vacancy, we have recently gone down to just one church service a week, taking place on Sunday mornings at 9:00AM, so only two individuals will be needed on these mornings. We are also opening up the possibility to assist with the slides for one individual each week if you would prefer to work behind the scenes. With that, we have recently begun a self-scheduling initiative wherein which families are able to look through all possible dates within a three month period and then sign up for the date, and the service opportunity, that works best for them. At this time of reduced services, families only need sign up for one week within a three month period, and if any dates are not filled, we fill then randomly assign any unassigned students to cover those dates. As always, the church will not facilitate trades and switches, so if families find that a week does not work for them after signing up, they should work with other families to get that week covered. If we do not have your current information, please take some time to update your email address, phone number, and mailing address with our church secretary as these are the primary ways in which we contact families.
