Praying With Ourstretched Hands

Jesus says to us, "Pray continually and never lose heart." From childhood we were taught to join our hands when praying. Yet during the Mass the priest opens his hands and stretches them out. Both ways of praying are good and have their place. But what do the different gestures mean?

To join one's hands means that for a while we stop our normail activities and take time out to pray to God. This is more suited to private prayer.

To pray with open hands is more suited to public prayer. To pray like that makes a powerful statement. It is a sermon in itself. It is to acknowledge that before God we are poor.

We hold up our empty hands to God as a begger holds out an empty bowl to passers-by. We are saying to God: "Lord, before you I am poor as a begger. I need you to fill my emptiness."

The gesture is as old as the Bible. We have a fine example of it in today's First Reading. There we see Moses on a hilltop, praying with extended hands for his people in their life-or-death battle with the Amalekites.

When Moses' hands dropped, the Amalekites prevailed. But when he kept them aloft to God, the Israelites prevailed. This is meant to illustrate the power of prayer. As long as Jewish people put their faith in God, they moved forward. But as soon as they forgot to look to God, they were forced to retreat.

The priest says the prayers of the Mass with outstretched hands. Like Moses, he is praying not just in his own name, but also in the name of the worshipping community.

Jesus urges us to keep on praying and not to lose heart. If we stop praying, we are likely to lose heart and give up. If we pray continually, we will never lose heart. To pray means to rely on God's strength and not on our own. God's strength becomes available to those who pray. They are like the sailor who puts up a sail in order to avail of the wind.

A prayers is answered, not when we get what we are asking for, but when we are granted a sense of God's nearness, and an assurance that God has not abandoned us. Prayer may not change the world for us, but it can give us the courage to face it. Jesus' prayer in Gethsemane - 'Father, if it be possible, let this cup pass from me' - wasn't answered. But through that prayer Jesus got the strength to face his passion.

When we learn to pray, we learn not just to recite words, but how to open our heart. The practice that nourishes one most is quiet prayer of the heart. Just sitting quietly and opening the heart and letting God in.
