If we allowed ourselves to let it come forth and teach us how to live and move in this world, free of fear, then that world would become the change we wish to see, both before us and within us all.

This power is not magic, fantasy, or even hopeful desperation. It is not even something supernatural, which is beyond us or separate from who we are. No, this power is the gift that has been given to us all from the Ground of our Being, and it is Awareness. Before I suggest what it might look like, let us begin with a world that is devoid of awareness.

We have come to accept as our way of living and being in this world, to think that we and everything else on this planet, is somehow separate from everything else. This leads to ideas that allow for the creation of definitions that both encourage and proliferate the disillusion of the very fabric of wholeness and oneness. The result is that we accept that it is perfectly fine to hurt or to harm anything that is power of Awareness is the end to the Us and Them, the You and Me, and what emerges is what has always been, the Singular Whole.

Through Awareness, we are awakened to the truth that everything is influential and bound inextricably. What we see as separation, does not in fact exist in reality. We break things down into parts, so we can understand it, and this in and of itself is the problem. We are not "a part" of something, or to live apart from anything, but to be the Singular Whole. 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
