The Transforming Power of Love / Love Your Enemies / Richard Rohn

You have heard that it was said, 'You shall love your neighbor, and hate your enemy.' But I say unto you, love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you, so that you may be children of your Father in heaven. —Matthew 5:43–45

In the United States few public figures have spoken more plainly and powerfully about Jesus' teaching to love our enemies than the Reverend Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. This was not an abstract theological question for Dr. King. He wrestled practically and at great cost, with how to love his enemies, both through prayer and through nonviolent direct action. This passage is an excerpt from King's sermon "Loving Your Enemies."

When I speak of love I am not speaking of some sentimental and weak response. I am speaking of that force which all of the great religions have seen as the supreme unifying principle of life. Love is somehow the key that unlocks the door which leads to ultimate reality.

Probably no admonition of Jesus has been more difficult to follow than the command to "love your enemies." Some people have sincerely felt that its actual practice is not possible. It is easy, they say, to love those who love you, but how can one love those who openly and insidiously seek to defeat you? This command of Jesus challenges us with new urgency. Upheaval after upheaval has reminded us that modern humanity is traveling along a road called hate, in a journey that will bring us to destruction.

Far from being the pious injunction of a Utopian dreamer, the command to love one's enemy is an absolute necessity for our survival. Love even for enemies is the key to the solution of the problems of our world. Jesus is not an impractical idealist: he is the practical realist. I am certain that Jesus understood the difficulty inherent in the act of loving one's enemy. He never joined the ranks of those who talk glibly about the easiness of the moral life. He realized that every genuine expression of love grows out of a consistent and total surrender to God. So when Jesus said "Love your enemy," he was not unmindful of its stringent qualities. Yet he meant every word of it. Our responsibility as Christians is to discover the meaning of this command and seek passionately to live it out in our daily

When Jesus bids us to love our enemies, he is speaking of neither eros [romantic love] nor philia [reciprocal love of friends]; he is speaking of agape, understanding and creative, redemptive goodwill for all people. Only by following this way and responding with this type of love are we able to be children of our Father who is in Heaven.

The Beatitudes - The Path of the Disciple - The Revelation of God's Will Part II

"Blessed are the poor in spirit, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven" Matthew 5.3 (NRSV)

As in all things, a good beginning may lead to a good end, and this is quite true with the first of Matthew's Beatitudes. There would appear to be intentionality in Jesus' ordering of them, and so when he says that those who are "poor in spirit", it is a reflection of the disciple who is willing to be both God's humble vessel and companion in being the kingdom of God in the world; this is where it begins.

This poverty of spirit, is truly a poverty. It is never about more, greater or best, but is about being simple, the least among others, and the ordinary one in company with their neighbour. There is no self-deprivation or acts of humiliation, but a clarity of mind and spirit that emerges, evoking genuine joy in the disciple who knows who they are and the great potential that lies within. Like any poverty, we hunger for that which will quench our thirst and sate our hunger. This poverty can only be comforted by the awakening to God's life giving Spirit. God's Spirit is like a light that shines within, revealing the substance of our lives. It is never harsh or demeaning, but only honest and sincere. Living in unison with God's Spirit of Poverty, encourages us to let go of death and accept life within. It is about becoming what we have always been.

As one continues to allow for this, the presence of poverty becomes more apparent and operational in ones daily living and being. As one humbly accepts being blessed by God, one is in turn, bless-ed in God. The poverty of Spirit is God's indwelling, but it awaits our consent to allow it to break open, to take root, to grow and to finally expand beyond the confines of the self. But the disciple must choose to be transformed into simplicity itself, so allowing the kingdom of God to be revealed within and without. They have accepted what has always been there and is now being awakened within them. One does not become superhuman or supra-human. On the contrary, one becomes truly and authentically human, and it is then that 'theirs is the kingdom of God'. Or more to the point, and there is the kingdom of God, living, acting, and moving in them.
