am not my own: I have given myself to Jesus, He must be my only love.

In his life time, Jesus modelled for us in part, what the kingdom of God would look like, because of what was essential for us to carry within ourselves: the kingdom of God itself. To the degree that we allowed ourselves to be informed by God's Will, then every gesture, thought and word, reflects the Kingdom of God in real time. Jesus consciously and mindfully addressed the temptations of the Dessert as he navigated his life and ministry, especially when it came to setting up kingdoms and having people adore you. He did not over come or vanquish this particular temptation, but was ever able to sense its presence and the desire to establish a foot hold within him and his ministry. What we see in this weekends first reading, is the continuation of Jesus' vision of the Kingdom of God. We see that it did not end with Jesus' departure (Ascension) but grew and became established as the norm. What we see is the common good being lived out, by those who called themselves followers of Jesus, partakers of "The Way". They chose to share all things in common, assisting those who were in need, considering the good and wellbeing of all their community members, and above all, avoiding the temptation of becoming a world kingdom, wielding power, demanding loyalty, or excluding or punishing non-believers or those who simply questioned. We saw who we were before we became an institution.

Things slowly changed when we realized that Jesus was not returning any time soon. So we gradually introduced, what was believed to be essential and necessary, certain protocols and processes that would ensure uniformity among the many faith communities outside of Jerusalem. We gradually saw the need (perceived or real), to move from a common good model, where everything was shared and nothing was held in private, to becoming more like an organization that took these resources and put them into establishing and the assisting in the growth and the maintenance of these faith communities. As the faith spread throughout the Roman Empire, we gradually moved from the uniqueness of each community being allowed to flourish, under the guidance and inspiration of the Holy Spirit, to one of uniformity and adherence to a single voice coming from Rome. In the year 325 C.E., we moved from being a cult and former sect of the Jewish faith, to now the official religion of the Empire. Some think that it was here where the Church was truly able to flourish and spread, and so it did. Others however believe this is where we lost our way, of following "the Way". While others might suggest, the moment we sacrificed the common good and the care for everyone, we had given into the temptation of being powerful. What Jesus was able to resist and was executed for, it would seem we have not.
