

Then the young warrior said, "How can I defeat you?" Fear replied, "My weapons are that I talk fast, and I get very close to your face. Then you get completely unnerved, and you do whatever I say. If you don't do what I tell you, I have no power. You can listen to me, and you can have respect for me. You can even be convinced by me. But if you don't do what I say, I have no power." In that way, the student warrior learned how to defeat fear."

My Sheep Hear My Voice / Jesus uses the example of sheep hearing the voice of the shepherd, as an analogy for us listening to God's voice and to follow. It is more than familiarity. We are willing to follow another either because he or she exudes confidence, when we do not. But following is not what Jesus is speaking of, nor blindly doing what someone has said. This is about relationship.

When one trusts another it is because he or she has followed through on what they said they were going to do. This leads to the next point, they are honest and forthright: they do not tell you what you want to hear, but what you need to hear. They are prepared to go before you, take the hard knocks, to scout things out for you. It is not about doing everything for us, but to provide an example that we are to take upon ourselves. A good leader prepares others to be good leaders. We are not meant to be followers the entirety of our lives. They are prepared to lay their life down for you, not out of duty or obligation, but out of love. It is then not simply protection, but it is foundationally all about education: one teaches by doing, we learn by seeing and in turn do like wise.

The key however is whether we choose to hear that voice or not. There will always be obstacles and challenges, both within and without. To the degree that the leader has remained true and just, then one is better able to find their way to come to him or her to be taught. We become what we know and value. We become Good Leaders and Good Shepherds to one another.
