#### **HELPED BY GRACE**

In an egalitarian society that we live in today, everybody thinks that they are okay and that they are carrying on just fine. It takes only a little crisis, and our vulnerability is exposed. Think of people who become emotionally, spiritually, and socially immobilized when tragedy strikes in their family. Issus like sudden and untimely death or difficult illnesses like cancer, stroke, and the like can make one become bitter and angry with God. It is not that such people are bad people. Far from that! Most of them are people who have been following God faithfully in their faith community until tragedy happens. It's just one of the areas that reflect the human vulnerability and fragility.

The amazing thing about God is that he very much with us during the crisis times, and those moments of darkness in our lives.

Isn't it the type of "helplessness" that St. Paul is talking about in the second reading this weekend. He's saying that Jesus didn't wait for us to help ourselves out of our crisis or sin; he gave us his help by dying on the cross for us. He offered his mercy even before we asked for it! This sounds a bit like the father of the prodigal son in the Gospel of St. Luke. Doesn't it?

The story of the Samaritan woman in to day's Gospel shows this principle in action as well. From the outside, this woman might not have seemed all that helpless. But Jesus saw her vulnerability and powerlessness. A woman married many times who was now living in sin. She was helpless to integrate herself into society. That's why she went to draw water at midday, when all the other women would not be there (In 4:6-7). She was helpless to explain her irregular marital situation when Jesus brought it up (In 4:16-17). And she was helpless against whatever fallen drive or external forces kept pushing her from one relationship to the next.

But Jesus came to her in all her helplessness and offered her the water of life. He didn't wait for her to get her act together. He didn't wait for her to seek him out. He never abandons us at times like these. He is came to her and engaged with her. He gave her hope that her life could change, that she could be saved, and that she could be restored. Simply put, in her helplessness, Jesus helped her.

> He can do that for you, too! Even now, Jesus wants to help you, even if you don't think of yourself as "helpless." He sees your need, and he has just the right amount of grace and love to fill that need. So, let Jesus come to you and help you today.

#### THE THREE PILLARS OF LENT

Lent is the best time to look deeply at the three pillars of our Christian Religion which comprises Prayer, Almsgiving and Fasting. Prayer and Almsgiving tend to point more on our relationship with God and with our fellow human beings. While Fasting has to do with our individual self up-building. Prayer is a gift from God which we do in return of gratitude back to him. Almsgiving relates to returning our gratitude to God for all the blessings of this life channeled through our reaching out to our brothers and sisters in need. The fact that God did not bless everybody equally in this world is a life lesson which we have to go through for growth and development that shapes our lives for the heavenly homeland where everything is complete for everyone in God. What is very striking in the parable of the rich man and Lazarus is the fact that the rich man didn't appear to be cruel or a mean person. He didn't even try to show Lazarus the door. No, his sin was in failing to notice Lazarus at all. Lazarus was "invisible" to him-just an obstacle to step over when he left the house. Of all we do to help the poor and the less privileged in this world, a very important aspect is the solidarity of presence to those in need. There is the tendency to give to the poor but we do not want to see their face or listen to their story. The rich often tend to associate only with the rich and isolate the poor. Rich countries tend to do the same. The ministry of presence with the poor can be a very powerful tool of encouragement and empowerment in their struggle and pain of growth and development. People of the rich countries often are not so disposed and attracted to travel to the poorer countries for whatever reason. But the gift of presence can be very inspiring and empowering. This is another effective way of gifting the poor and those in need. Give a person a fish, and that person will be in need for more. But teach a person how to fish, not only will that person not look for another but will be able to produce so much as to share with others

Teaching them how to produce food and how to build better houses will be going further. The book of Proverbs exhorts us also with these words: "Whoever cares for the poor lends to the Lord, who will pay back the sum in full" (Prov. 19:17). As we search and reflect on the teachings of Scripture, let them penetrate our heart. Let them change the way we see the world and the people around us and the those we encounter. Let them help us see as God sees so that we don't miss anyone at our door.
