

HOW TO LOOK AT YOUR OWN **BLINDNESS AND BROKENNESS**

There is a revealing story of a monk living in the Egyptian desert who was so tormented by temptation that he could bear it no longer. So he decided to abandon his cell and leave the monastery, quitting his vocation as a monk.

As he was putting on his sandals to carry out his resolve he saw another monk not ting his sandals on.

"Who are you?" he asked the stranger. "I am yourself," was the reply. "If it is on my account that you are leaving the monastery, I would have you know that no matter Jesus spoke to the people, where you go I shall go with you." Both what we run away from - and what we vearn for - is within us.

Since we are born with the blindness of original sin, we do not see what we should see in us that truly brings us happiness, peace, and freedom. Christ who is with us in all of our journey through life never abandons us especially in critical moments if we can give ourselves enough time to reflect. Our blindness and short sightedness make us stumble and unable to see. We dabble into things that do not bring us true joy but rather pain and sorrow afterward. However, Christ who is the light with which we can see is with us everywhere and every time waiting for an oppor-

tunity to open our eyes.

Here is something we can truly rely on: Just as Jesus healed the man with blindness, he has washed us clean of sin and healed our blindness in the waters of Baptism. So, we are his true brothers and sisters. No matter how much and how far we are stumbling in darkness – we have Jesus, the Light of the world, to guide us. No more hiding in shame over our sin-we are children of God far from where he stood who was also put- and members of his family. We may experience some lingering effects of sin, but Jesus offers us an opportunity to see more clearly each and every day. In time, we will overcome all our darkness.
