Development and Peace Collection March 25th / 26th

TO GIVE LIFE, JESUS HAS TO DIE

Jesus is in control of his and destiny, even if his enemies plot against him, and even if their machinations seem to be succeeding. They "succeed" only because it is allowed by God. Jesus declares: "No one takes it (my life) from me, but I lay it down on my own" (Jn 10:18).

The "Lazarus story" is to be appreciated for its references and nuances. It leads to Jesus' own death because the Good Shepherd must lay down his life for the sheep (cf Jn 10:11). Jesus is able to call Lazarus back to life because the Father has given the Son authority to raise the dead and give life (cf Jn 5:21). Moreover, the hour is coming when all in the tombs will hear his voice and will come out to the resurrection of life (cf n 5:28-29). In anticipation, Lazarus hears the voice of Jesus thus serves to underscore the theme of Jesus as the giver of life. But first, like a grain of wheat that falls on the ground and dies, Jesus must lose his life. Only then can he preserve it-and those of others-for eternal life (cf Jn 12:24-25).

Therefore, if today you hear God's voice do not harden your heart (Psalm 95) is the clarion call of Lent. As Lent is such a great time to encounter the Lord who is good to all and compassionate, we know that despite our trials and weaknesses He has sympathy for us.

We have a Father who created us in love. Even when we sin, he is not angry with us, nor does he ever give up on us. Instead, when we feel distant through our sins, he waits to welcome us back with open arms. We have a Father who is always ready to forgive.
