

Destroy This Temple And In Three Days I will Raise It Up

The above expression sounds like the language of one who is in love! You can feel the chauvinistic and all the grandiosities. "Zeal for your house will consume me." Yes, God is so passionately in love with us and amazingly expressing the power of his love. For two persons truly in love, every gift, no matter how insignificant in monetary value, is meaningful because it speaks of one's affection for each other. On the other hand, when a husband who has been unfaithful and womanizing, beating up his wife and kids, and generally making life miserable for them, suddenly gives an expensive gift to his wife, he is met with disbelief. The gift is empty because it does not follow from the giver's way of life. Here we feel the power of Jesus' words because he loves us to death and represents the fidelity of God to us despite our infidelity and insincerity. God's gift is so invaluable and incalculable because he is so faithful.

God made a covenant with his people, giving us a principle that would guide his love relationship with us. In truth, our observance of the ten commandments is an expression of our fidelity to the covenant with God. They are not supposed to be a burden to bear but rather an opportunity to actively participate in God's love. God loves us and wants to bond with us so deeply that we are called His bride, the Temple of Holy Spirit, the dwelling place of God. Temple symbolizes the presence of God. And we are that temple representing his presence in the world and among his people. Temple in the Old Testament and for the Jews is a privilege place of encounter, a place to offer sacrifices meant to signify their affection and loyalty to God and the covenant. It is a sacred and holy place.

Jesus cleanses the Temple: "Stop turning my Father's house into a marketplace!" (Jn 2:17). For him, the transactions in the Temple have lost the spirit of true worship. The merchants are there to make money; the sacrifice has become an empty ritual. The people have forgotten their calling as God's chosen people; their offerings do not express a life of loving obedience to God and the covenant. Jesus' bold gesture recalls the prophet Isaiah's lament: "The number of your endless sacrifices - what do I care for them?' says the Lord. 'I have had more than enough of whole-burnt offerings... I do not need your oblations... Your hands are bloody; wash and make yourselves clean... Put an end to your wickedness and learn to do good. Seek justice, give hope to the oppressed; give the fatherless their rights and defend the widow" (Is 1:11-17). This is what God wants from us. Jesus signals the end of the Temple worship to replace it with a perfect sacrifice: the offering of himself on the cross, crowning a whole life lived in total, loving obedience to the Father. Are you ready to give yourself wholeheartedly to God
