## May 12, 2024

The celebration of our Lord's ascension into heaven has a very consoling message. Ascension means we are safe and we are on a journey to meet with Jesus and be with the Father forever through the power of the Holy Spirit. To understand Ascension clearly, let us look at it from Jewish religious-cultural context. From experience, the Jews were very much aware that a relationship with God was a factor for wholeness, completeness, and fulfillment as a human being. In this relationship, they gave much importance to mediators, go-betweens, or priests because they were aware of the fact that, due to their sinfulness, they were not worthy of a relationship with God.

ASCENSION OF THE LORD - HEAVEN IS OUR DESTINATION

If relatedness with God is essential to one's fulfillment as a human being, and no human being is worthy for such a relationship, then one has to look for ways and means to ascertain this relationship. Jewish religion created the institution of the priesthood and the whole sacrificial cult to answer this dilemma. The Jews believed that sins are atoned and a relationship with God happens at the offer of sacrifice.

At the offering of sacrifice in the temple, every Jew had to choose an animal to be sacrificed to God as a symbol of himself being offered to God. One cannot offer oneself because one is not worthy. It was also not the individual who offered the animal in sacrifice, it was the priest who brought it to the altar, burned it in sacrifice. It was the smoke of the sacrifice that entered into the presence of God and pleased him. And when God is pleased with the sacrifice, then the relationship with God is ascertained. This is the necessary background to grasp the impact of the Ascension of Jesus into heaven.

Jesus is our true mediator and priest. It was through the offer of his sacrifice that our sins were atoned. The Father was also pleased with Jesus' sacrifice that "he became the source of everlasting life for those who obey him." The content of Jesus' sacrifice was first faithfulness and obedience to God his Father. As gift for this obedience and faithfulness, the Father raised him from the dead and brought him into his very presence, at the bosom of the Trinity. Like the smoke of sacrifice in the OT with which God was pleased, Jesus was brought by the Father into his presence and stays with him now to constantly intercede and mediate for our sake.

Hence, the author of the Letter to the Hebrews writes: "Let us, then, hold firmly to the faith we profess. For we have a great High Priest who has gone into the very presence of God – Jesus, the Son of God.

Let us have confidence in our relationship with God because, in God, we have some-body who knows us and who understands our human condition. Despite our sins and our failures, let us not lose heart, we have a God who understands. Ascension is a gift of reassurance. Far from abandoning us, Jesus is on his way to facilitate our blessed eternity in heaven.

This is the message we should bring home with us on this feast of the Ascension of Jesus into heaven and continue to share it with every human being. Praise God with great joy and share the good news.
