

JAIRUS' DAUGHTER AND THE WOMAN

The Gospel of Mark this week relates two healing stories: of a 12-year-old girl who is gravely ill (and later dies) and of a woman who has been afflicted with hemorrhages for 12 years. Some biblical scholars look at this to symbolize the 12 tribes of Israel. Jesus' intervention, bringing healing and life reveals that He is the one to restore not only the 12 tribes of Israel, but also the entire human race to normality. As Lumen Gentium relates: "The Holy Bible displays before the eyes of the reader, as in a wonderful movie, all of humanity with its grandeurs and defects, its falls and ignorance, to teach it how it must govern its life" (LS 16).

Anytime we act in kindness and love towards one another, we go a long way like Jesus to restore the grandeur of humanity.

Consider the way these healings take place. The first is through the intercession of the girl's father Jairus, a Jewish official; the second is by the initiative of the sick woman herself who believes that if she touches Jesus' clothes she will be made well. In both cases, faith is manifested: Jairus comes, kneels before Jesus, and pleads earnestly with him; his faith is rewarded with the revival of his daughter; the woman goes through the crowd to touch Jesus' cloak and surprisingly, she is healed. Jesus does not disappoint them. Their requests are granted. Faith moves not only mountains but the heart of God.

A take home thing from Jesus' healing of the 12-year-old girl and the woman who has been hemorrhaging for 12 years is that Jesus has come that we might have full life (John 10:10); that is, not just earthly life, but eternal life. Hence, Jesus did not merely raise this little girl who has died and the dead Lazarus back to this earthly life, but he also declared that he is 'the resurrection and the life' (John 11:25) – that is, in him, we have access to life forever in heaven.

Another efficacy of the good heart of Jesus towards people that comes into the open in a glaring light is when we ask the following questions: What happened to the twelve-year-old girl who was raised by Jesus from the dead? What happened in the life of the woman who was cured? And what happened to those who knew them? Surely the woman told the story of her healing to her children and grandchildren. Surely the girl's teenage friends heard of her story and shared her story among their friends. We can only speculate about the impact these miracles had in the lives of those who knew the girl and the woman.

Was there an effect of Christ's miracles in the spiritual lives of the relatives and friends of the girl and the woman? The marvelous love God has shown us in our lives is intended to affect not simply ourselves alone but those around us as well. Our religion is communal, not just individual
