

THE MULTIPLICATION OF THE LOAVES

The best approach in understanding the readings of this weekend is to look at the people involved in the miracle of the multiplication of the loaves. Jesus, a boy who gave his five loaves and two fish, the disciples who help in the distribution of the loaves and fish, and the crowd who are the true recipients of the miracle of the multiplication of the loaves. A boy voluntarily surrenders to Christ his provisions of five loaves and two fish. Perhaps, he was a vendor and depended on the sale of that food for the day's earnings. Perhaps that food was his whole day's ration. We will never know. But surely no one took it away from him by force, for Jesus would never have tolerated that. The boy therefore made an act of great generosity when he gave Andrew his five loaves and two fish. Not knowing in advance that Jesus would soon perform a miracle with his donation, it was even more than generous. We could say it was heroic. For one shining, golden moment that little boy flew.... His name was not retained by history, but his gesture was. Had he refused to surrender his foodstuff, perhaps the feeding of the crowd would never have taken place. His contribution made all the difference, on that historic day.

Although, we cannot over-emphasize the generosity of the young boy, we have to focus on the One through whom all good things come. Here we realize that God truly provides. God intervenes in our lives at all times. Furthermore, the twelve baskets left over proclaim that God gives extravagantly. God gives more than we need. God has even created for us the planet earth that is prodigal in its generosity.

If God has been so good to us, the call is to follow in his footstep. What makes our lives more meaningful is our ability to touch other people's lives in a positive way through our generosity, no matter how little and humble.

Here one is reminded of what author *Harold J. Sala* writes in this connection: "One of the myths you have to overcome," he says, "to live a significant and purposeful life is the myth that you don't count, that you can't make a difference, that what you can do is so insignificant and the needs of the world so great, that what you can do doesn't matter.

"It matters tremendously to someone who is on the receiving end of your love" (*Joyfully Single in a Couples' World, P. 171*).

What will you give today that you will be remembered tomorrow and for long after? Follow your heart, a grandmother admonishes her granddaughter in love, be brave!
