The Important Questions

The young man asked Jesus, 'Master, what have I to do to inherit eternal life?' It's obvious that he had already asked another question, if not of Jesus, then of someone else. That question was: What is the purpose of life? The answer to which is: to gain eternal life.

These are the two most important questions in life. Most of us asked the same sort of questions when we were young. Perhaps we don't ask them any longer? Here we are, on the train of life, being caried forward inexorably, and it seems at an ever-increasing speed, but where the train is bound for is no longer a burning issue with us.

Why is this? Could it be that we are so preoccupied with the baggage, or with amusements and distractions, that we simply have no time for such matters? Or could it be that like the young man who came to Jesus, we have found that it is dangerous to ask such questions?

The climate we live in doesn't encourage this kind of questioning and reflection. Spiritual questions are seldom a topic of conversation at dinner tables, or even in intimate talks among friends. People focus more on work, family problems, and the political and economic issues of the day. Discussions about moral values and spiritual beliefs seldom happen. In fact, they are more or less taboo.

We are practical people. We want answers, not problems. Moral and spiritual matters are difficult issues. An American psychiatrist has said, 'To a large extent our lives are spent in avoiding a confrontation with ourselves. Most of our daily activities facilitate this. They distract us from ourselves, and from reflection. We are tranquillized by the trivial.'

Jesus answered the young man's question thus: 'Keep the commandments.' And the young man said, 'I have kept the commandments.'

For Jesus keeping the commandments was just the bare minimum. He saw that this young man was capable of more. So he said to him, 'If you want to be perfect, sell what you have, give the money to the poor, and then come and follow me.'

The young man stood on the brink of a new and exciting world. However, he quickly realize that he could not enter this new world without saying good-bye to his old world. He hesitated. He looked back at that old world, and began to weigh up the things he was leaving. Suddenly he realized he couldn't do it.

As he went away a sadness descended on him., the sadness that descends on us when we choose to live for ourselves.

Some people are unwilling to let go of a single one of their old values in order to acquire a new one. If we fear to lose the pleasures of the old world, we will never taste the joys of the new.

Jesus demands the best of us as he did of the young man. He will not allow us to settle for anything less. The challenge—if you wish to be perfect—is issued to us too. However, the thing we might be called upon to sacrifice in order to take up that challenge could vary for each of us. We have to look into our own hearts to see what it is that we would have to give up in order to respond to it.
