Catholic Funeral Rites

Please call the parish office to arrange funeral Masses. We work closely with the funeral homes and will assist you with the liturgical arrangement to honour the departed family member.

Rites of Initiation for Adults (RCIA)

Classes begin in October for Adults seeking baptism or full communion into the Catholic Christian faith. Please contact the parish office to register.

Sacrament of Baptism (Infants)

Please contact the parish office for details. A pre-baptism meeting is required.

Catechism Classes (Oct - May)

First Communion and Confirmation classes are held at the parish. Registration takes place in September.

Sacrament of Marriage

Kindly contact the parish office at least six months prior to desired date of marriage. A Marriage Preparation Course is essential as are several meetings with the priest.

The Role of the Family

A tree planted in an exposed place is very vulnerable. It is at the mercy of every wind that blows. If it survives at all, it will be in a twisted and stunted form. If you want a tree to grow to its full potential, you must plant it in a more sheltered place. And not on its own, but with some other trees.



It is vital to get the space between the trees right. They must be close enough to be able to provide shelter and protection for one another. But not so close as to stifle one another. Each must have room to grow to its full potential. This is a great challenge: how to achieve closeness without stifling or dominating one another.

It is not good for a tree to be alone. And it is not good for us human beings to be alone. Alone we are at mercy of cold winds of anguish and loneliness. We need ties of love and friendship with other human beings in order to become what God intended us to be.

This is where the family comes in. In the family we have close ties with people who accept us for what we are. We have people to whom we are special, and who are special to us. We have a clear and unmistakable identity. We have a sense of belonging.

There are two things people suffer from in families or communities. One is the feeling of suffocation, of not being allowed to be oneself. The other is the opposite - a feeling of loneliness, of not really being together.

In the ideal family there is both closeness and space. The closeness means members are able to provide mutual support. The space ensures that they do not stifle one another.

Harmony in the family is achieved by the practice of virtues such as kindness, humility, gentleness, patience, and mutual forgiveness. These are not easy virtues to practice. But when practiced with consistency, the rewards are great in terms of peace and harmony in the home.

No family is perfect, but no better place for raising children has been devised. It was by living in a small community of love with Mary and Joseph at Nazareth that Jesus grew in wisdom and in favour with God and people.
